


#### Sun City Lucky to Have Residents Who Help Keep Community in Top Shape

We are so very lucky that we have homeowners who are willing to give up their time to help keep our community beautiful and running smoothly. If you have a par-

t's time to purchase tickets! It's our big, biennial show, with a twist!





#### Just a Little Bit of History



eighbors, your Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol is 28 years old. Thanks to residents volunteering their time, going through the training and working 24/7, it continues to serve this community making it the safest in Nevada according to the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police department. A little bit of history will help in understanding how the

organization evolved from 1991. Del Webb's Sun City Summerlin construction company was in full building boom in 1991. Construction equipment and building materials were stored on site. The company needed people to patrol and protect these locations. A new resident, Ronald (Ron) Gagne, a retired Boston detective, and the Del Webb Corporation met and decided to form a patrol of resident volunteers whose mission was to protect the project from thieves. Twelve residents signed up to work on the patrol. The Del Webb Corporation provided insurance for the volunteers.

The first Security Patrol board was made up of Gagne, who became the chief; Dan Carter, assistant chief; Liz Roberts, secretary; and Joseph Stahl, treasurer. Drivers included Lonnie Calpert, retired U.S. Army and a member of the legendary Buffalo Soldiers troop, and Jeanne Schmitz, the first female fire inspector for the City of Las Vegas Fire Department. She was also the first female on the bomb squad.

The following year, in 1992, membership rose to 160 residents. Security Patrol sponsored the first free safety seminars for residents. Additionally, Patrol members were on duty at Sun City events held at the Sun Shadows Community Center. These included the first fireworks display, concerts in the park and garage sales. Notification of open garage doors from 8 p.m. (2000 hours) to 0800 was added to the duty list.

Del Webb Corporation donated the first Patrol car in 1993. The fleet grew to its current five cars over the following years. Security Patrol began its 24/7 patrol that year. New duties were added to include patrolling unsold houses, the model homes, construction sites, vacation house checks, and finding lost pets, spouses and grandchildren. Bob Sellers became the editor of the first newsletter published for the membership.

Computers hadn't arrived at the Security Patrol Base in 1994, therefore all logs had to be printed and signed. Drivers on each shift maintained a log as well as the dispatchers. It wasn't unusual to see a patrol car parked in a lot with the driver printing events and actions on his or her shift. There were 8,000 residents in Sun City Summerlin and 250 of them joined security patrol.


The Association found that in 1993 Security Patrol saved the Association an estimated \$300,000 in the cost of security services. Today, the savings is much higher. At the end of the

year, not one house in Sun City Summerlin had been burglarized.

Security Patrol base or headquarters had been housed in several places since 1991. The Community Services building constructed at the Desert Vista Community Center complex became the present Security Patrol base in 1995. It is located at the end of the Desert Vista parking lot next to the Pickleball courts.

At the end of the 20th Century, Security Patrol had evolved into a standing committee of the Association's Board. Training procedures were developed to ensure safety protocols to assist residents. Dispatchers were trained to work efficiently, solving problems and dis-

Security Patrol continued to sponsor safety seminars in conjunction with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police and Fire departments. More than 15 Security Patrol members graduated from the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Citizens' Police Academy.

With the arrival of the 21st Century, Security Patrol operations became high tech, and a second generation of residents with hitech skills and ideas joined the Patrol, advancing its operations.

Security Patrol is a vibrant and evolving organization. Residents are needed to continue its mandate of - the eyes and ears of the community. For information, please call 702-254-2303, any time, any day.







#### Area Crime Analysis

**B** urglaries and break-ins reported here are located within 2 miles of a center point in Sun City Summerlin. Crimes include those committed on homes, businesses and automobiles in neighborhoods in and adjacent to Sun City Summerlin.

During a recent four-week analysis there were 86 crimes reported in the charted Summerlin area, only four of which happened in Sun City Summerlin. Forty-two of the 86 crimes involved burglaries, including two at businesses on Del Webb and Sun City boulevards, and two in private Sun City homes on Boca and Faiss drives. Each of the six burglaries within the community occurred on perimeter streets.

**Focusing on Summerlin area crime reports:** There was one theft from a car in Sun City, near the Cheyenne Avenue perimeter wall. Generally, there was a spike in car thefts in neighborhoods to the east and north of Sun City. Drivers should make sure their cars are locked and valuables are out of sight. Safer still, park the car inside a locked garage and do not leave the remote garage door opener inside the car. During the same period, 38 other reportable crimes were handled by Metro's Northwest Area Command, involving assaults, DUI, drug abuse, vandalism and fraud. All of those crimes were located outside the boundaries of Sun City Summerlin.

> Breakdown of incidents by days: 10 percent of burglaries were reported on Sundays; 24 percent on Mondays, 19 percent on Tuesdays; 9 percent on Wednesdays; 10 percent on Thursdays; 23 percent on Fridays; and 5 percent on Saturdays.

> > Burglary locations: There were 36 automobile and building burglaries committed outside of Sun City in nearby neighborhoods, including 11 burglaries between Cheyenne Boulevard and Alexander Road to the north, 11 burglaries east of Rampart Boulevard in the Desert Shores community, 11 burglaries south of Lake Mead Boulevard in the Hills area and three burglaries west of I-215 in a new residential area.



**Reported times of the day:** 17 burglaries were reported between 6 a.m. and noon; one burglary was reported between 6 p.m. and midnight; 23 burglaries were reported between noon and 6 p.m.; three burglaries were reported between midnight and 6 a.m. Ninety-nine percent of area burglaries were reported during daylight hours, when residents are more likely to be out of their homes.

# THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE BILL STEINBAUGH: A LIFE AT SEA By Bob Cohen / Link



e was born in Erie, Pennsylvania, and grew up just two blocks from Lake Erie. By the time he graduated high school, World War II was in full swing. Fifty-eight years later, Bill Steinbaugh would move to Sun City Summerlin.

"I was pretty frail as a kid. Had asthma. I registered for the draft in 1943, but they kept rejecting me as 4-F," said Bill. "Four times I was called to take the physical, four times I was re-

jected. There were lots of jobs on the ore boats plying the Great Lakes, so I went to the local Coast Guard station and got a Seaman Certificate. I had planned on getting a job on an ore boat, but the Coast Guard must have notified the War Shipping Administration of my certification because I was quickly contacted by them and offered paid transportation to New York. I grabbed it.

"In those days, in the Merchant Marine, your expenses on

shore were your own. You only got paid when you were the full load of gasoline, the top deck was loaded with new P-51 assigned to a ship. I was an 18-year-old kid with very little Mustangs. I started to get worried because I was their Navy escorts to form a convoy. low on cash and needed a job fast.

ready to go to sea?" Right then and there I was signed on to a brand new tanker, the Chesapeake Capes."

The Chesapeake Capes was a 523-foot tanker capable of holding just under 6 million gallons of gasoline, a product that was in high demand in Europe. It was powered by a 6,000horsepower turbo-electric engine and was capable of doing 14 to 16 knots.

"When I woke up in the morning, we were already underway. As we passed the Statue of Liberty, the Queen Mary was coming in from England to pick up another load of soldiers as part of the D-Day buildup. We were not only carrying



'exciting' voyage of my career!

"We left New York and brought a load of automobiles to Capetown, South Africa. The Robin Adair could only make 12 knots maximum, so it was a pretty leisurely run. After unloading our cargo and filling our holds with other cargo, we headed north up the east coast of Africa, stopping to pick up a load of exotic animals for delivery to Boston. Along the way, a fire broke out in one of the cargo holds. Try as we might, we couldn't get it out so we headed to Puerto Rico and anchored in the bay. Our insurance carrier insisted that we bring the smoldering cargo on deck, fully extinguish the flames and then reload it into the hold. That took 21 days! All this time, the wild animals were caged on deck.

"The ship headed north again, but when they were about 300 miles off Cape Hatteras, North Carolina, disaster struck again. The ship's sole engine died and they were adrift! A Mayday call eventually brought a Navy ship that towed them to Bermuda for repairs. Two weeks later, they were back underway to deliver the animals to Boston. Fortunately, all arrived safely even though the trip took about five weeks more than expected."

"I never did see any submarines or other German ships, but the destroyers accompanying us sure seemed to be busy. Every once in a while, they would detect an enemy submarine and go to work with their depth charges."

Much of the time after that voyage, and until the Vietnam War, Bill sailed the Great Lakes. But with the war came the need to ship tons of fuel once again.

"We were flying bombers out of Thailand for runs over Vietnam," Bill said. "We would sail to Saudi Arabia, pick up a load of jet fuel and deliver it to Thailand. We would also make cargo runs from the states to Vietnam."

All told, Bill spent some 40 years in the Merchant Marine, earning his Coast Guard certificate as a Chief Engineer/Steam Vessels in 1980. He also received a discharge from the U.S. Coast Guard for his service time in World War II.

After retirement, Bill used his steam engine knowledge to land a job at the Hillsborough County, Florida, courthouse. He met his wife, Marla, who, unbeknownst to him worked in the county tax collector's office, at single's dance. "It was a ladies' choice dance and choosing him was the best decision of my life," Marla said. "It was two days later that I learned he worked at the courthouse and that he was the chief engineer of all their buildings."

Bill and Marla will soon celebrate their 42nd wedding anniversary.


