

ebruary 24, 2016, signaled the termination of the Board of Directors who have served your community well over the last 12-month period. The election on February 24 made five people members of the Board for a two-year term. # Understanding Committees

# System the Starting Point for Making a Difference in Sun City

f you are a new resident to Sun City, welcome. If not, welcome to another year of enjoying the best of amenities offered by Nevada's largest homeowners' association. With that status comes responsibility. To ensure the smooth running of day-to-day operations, SCSCAI (Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc.) relies on residents to assist it in maintaining and building a better community.

For those who may be contemplating a way to give back, the following article offers a start to pinpointing an area where you would like to concentrate your efforts. Along with each description of the nine standing and one advisory committees, you will find the name and contact information for the liaison appointed by the Board president. You may reach out to any of the committee chairpersons with questions or to find out more of what's required to get started sharing your time.

sub-committee. These members physically view the property; check measurements, etc., before approving. # **Enjoying Our Pools**

t's springtime and the outdoor pools and spas open April 1 for all to enjoy! Sun City Summerlin's four Fitness Centers, along with two indoor swimming pools and three outdoor pools, are used daily by hundreds if not thousands of residents who enjoy our wonderful amenities. The Maintenance and Landscape departments have been busy preparing for the upcoming pool season.

Those visiting the Pinnacle pool will notice the lack of pine needles littering the poolside. A few pine trees and several bushes were removed to help improve the pool environment. We hope to have fewer bees after removing some of the flowering bushes that attract them; residents will see a noticeable difference while enjoying their time in the sun.

At Mountain Shadows, the pool bathrooms have been updated with new tile and vanities for a fresh, clean look, and the Maintenance staff has repaired the pool decks at all of our outdoor pools.

#### **FUN IN THE SUN**

Sun City Summerlin is made up of a wide variety of residents. We all share the facilities, and there are rules in place to help make usage fair, safe and enjoyable for all. Our pool rules are in accordance with the SCSCAI Rules & Regulations and the Southern Nevada Health District. Below are a few issues and rules that residents question the Fitness staff about on a regular basis. We hope this information helps all residents have a pleasant experience when visiting the swimming pools.

Showering & Sanitation Laws: Showering before entering the pool or spa is required by the Southern Nevada Health District in order to reduce contaminants brought into the pool and spa. It is also highly recommended to rinse off by showering after exiting the pool. You always will see professional and Olympic-competitive

swimmers and divers rinse off as soon as they exit the pool. Although chlorine (salt or liquid) is necessary to keep the pools clean and sanitary, showering after swimming will help keep your skin and suit in healthier condition. No adult disposable briefs are allowed to be worn in the pool or spa.

Pool Water & Bodily Fluids: Even with nightly maintenance, it is important to maintain the cleanliness of the pools and spas on a daily basis. Association rules and the Health District restrict individuals with any open sores from entering a pool or spa. Regardless of where the open sore is, on the top of the head or the bottom of the foot, residents with an open sore may not enter the pool or spa water. For those who like to spend hours walking in the pool, please remember to vacate the pool often and use the restroom. Studies show that urine combined with chlorine creates many health risks for individuals. Please use good hygiene and do not urinate in the pools or spas.

#### **OTHER FITNESS CENTER AND POOL RULES**

- Residents must be present to check in their guests.
- Street shoes are not allowed in the pools or pool areas. Clean pool shoes are acceptable.
- Persons with a cold, cough, sore or inflamed eyes, any skin or communicable disease, or with open sores or bandages must not enter the pool or spa.
- Children (under 19) must be 42 inches tall (without shoes) to use the pool, and must be supervised by an adult at all times. Children (under 19) are not allowed in the spas.

In order for all residents to enjoy their experience at the pools, we suggest picking up a rule pamphlet from the Fitness Monitor desk and being familiar with pool rules and water classes that may be using the pools at certain times.

#### Charli's Corner

How to Work Your Core -Part 1

our core is made up of many muscles that work to hold your body erect while standing and sitting. Your core includes the abdominals, back extensors, mid-back muscles and obliques, to name a few. To strengthen your core and create better posture, you need to work all the muscles that support the movements that your core can do. For example, our obliques are used for rotation and turning from side to side. Back extensors are used for keeping our bodies upright.

Residents in the fitness center love to use the ab crunch strength machine. However, many don't use it correctly and rely on only this one exercise for their core workout. The ab crunch is only one exercise of many that your body needs to do to create a core that is worth its power to keep you standing upright and straight. A proper core workout will guard against a rounded posture and weak back muscles.

cle that runs vertically from rib cage to pelvic





bone. When you do endless crunches it does not shrink your waistline. It may actually make your stomach stick out and create more rounded shoulders as the muscle gets stronger and shortens from the load.

**How to use the ab crunch:** Be sure to line up your hips with the pivot point of the machine. Keep your spine straight as you move the chest plate forward (Picture 1). Draw in your belly button to engage the rectus abdominis and move 30 degrees forward (Picture 2). If you are bending forward 45 or more degrees, you are no longer doing an effective crunch.



Add 1095-A if health insurance was purchased through Nevada Health Link and 1095-B if provided by employer. You also will need receipts for itemized deductions for medical expenses, mortgage interest, real estate taxes paid, gifts to charity and any other miscellaneous deductions. Note we can prepare returns only for electronic filing with the Internal Revenue Service. Paper returns are not permitted. We cannot prepare state returns or returns with rental, business or partnership (K-1) income, other than simple interest, dividends and capital gains.

The Community Preparedness Committee's educational team is organized to help residents manage crisis situations that are likely to occur in their day-to-day pursuits. The team helps residents avoid home accidents and teaches them to assemble a basic first aid kit. Stockpiling emergency drinking water is vital, as is participation in the Vial of Life program that helps residents file emergency contact information. These practices have been proven to be lifesaving procedures.

#### Educational team members are your neighbors.

They are knowledgeable volunteers who have learned to provide proactive direction to help residents stay safe. They have diverse business, professional and educational backgrounds; they live here and they embrace the valued concept of neighbors helping neighbors.

We need not worry about a tsunami, but commercial vehicles and railroad cars carrying hazardous materials routinely pass through Las Vegas. The team works with residents to help them prepare for emergencies that could involve anything from an airplane crash to a disruption of the water supply.

#### Everyone should have a family emergency plan.

If CPC advises residents to stay inside their homes until danger has passed, will you be able to do that? Have you stored emergency supplies for people and pets? Is your water heater strapped to prevent it from toppling and possibly causing an explosion? Do you have a battery-operated radio and flash lights? Can you turn off utilities if you detect an odor of gas? Do you know what you want to take with you if you must evacuate your home? And, if the electric garage door opener isn't working can you manually open the door?



#### No Bad Teams, Only Bad Leaders

(Editor's note: The following is a restated extraction from the book "Extreme Ownership - How U.S. Navy Seals Lead and Win" by Jocko Williams and Leif Babin.)

eal training starts with hell week: 120 continuous, unrelenting hours of physical, mental and spiritual stress with minimal food and only two hours of sleep over the five grueling days. Each seven-man team is assigned a rubber boat that weighs about 200 pounds. The teams carry and run with the boats overhead, push and pull them over and under obstacles, carry and run over sand and paved roads, and have the boats overturned at sea with the crew in it.

The highest ranking team member is assigned the task of being the team leader and is responsible for the performance of that boat crew.

In an actual training group, Boat #2 was continually first or second in the competitions, while Boat #6 was always last. The

value of winning was that the winning team could take a short break from the rigorous training. Boat #2's crew was happy and worked to help one another to be successful. Boat #6's leaders and crew fought with each other continuously, each blaming the others for their failures.

After several days of this, a training officer suggested that the team leaders of Boats #2 and #6 change places. Unbelievably, in the next competition, Boat #6 came in first, while Boat #2 came in third! The difference was that the new leader of Boat #6 was a positive, encour aging leader, who believed in this "losing" crew. The crew believed in their leader and took up his winning attitude. This is a prime case of no bad teams, only bad leaders.

# NEGHBOR Meet Your Neighbor

Sun City Family Celebrates 5 Generations

un City resident Johanna Trettin was born in 1927 in Indonesia. She came from a Dutch Indonesian family and lived on the island of Java, where she had been





living in a nice house with her mother and father before World War II broke out. During the war, Johanna recalled that the Europeans living in Java were declared prisoners of war and held in refugee camps.

In the years following the war, Johanna met Willy, her first husband, and in 1951 they had two daughters, Hellen and Irene. Willy died in an automobile accident shortly thereafter.

Irene Denny, Johanna's eldest daughter, moved to Sun City two years ago from Colorado to be closer to her parents. Irene revels in the fact that her family enjoys five living generations today.

In 2003, Irene said her family lost a generation when her grandmother died, but regained the status 10 years later with the birth of Johanna's great-great-grandson, Blake McDonald in 2013.

Now that she is retired, Irene looks forward to the day when she can return to the island to see how much or how little it has changed. Looking back over her family's history, Irene said, "All five children agree that the best thing our parents did was bring our family to the United States."

Irene recalled it was after her father's death that her family was deported to the Netherlands, even though none of them had ever been to their home country. At that point they were literally people without a country, she said.

Moving from the warm, tropical climate of Java to the contrasting cold of the Netherlands took quite getting used to, Irene said. It was in the Netherlands that Irene said her mother married her second husband, Hermann. The two were married for 63 years until his passing last year. Together, Johanna and Hermann had three children – Ron, Micki, and after immigrating to the United States, Sandi, who was the only United States citizen born into the second generation.

For three years, Irene said, the family endured the wet weather in Seattle, where they had landed after arriving from the Netherlands in 1961. Three years later, in 1964, they relocated to Los Angeles, and back to warmer weather.

Hermann and Johanna eventually retired and moved to Sun City Summerlin in 1992.

Of her mother, Irene said, "She is the proud matriarch of five generations. She was born in Indonesia and is a mother, a grandmother, a great-grandmother, a great-grandmother and a widow, who has resided in Sun City for the past 24 years."

The other four generations include: Irene, who was licensed as a real estate agent in California and Colorado; Irene's daughter Michelle Rademacher, who represents the first of the third generation born in the United States and lives in Palmdale, California, where she is a project manager for Lockheed Martin of Southern California; Michelle's daughter, Jacqueline McDonald, a mother and wife, who lives in Sacramento, California; and Jacqueline's 2-year-old Blake.
