





All door handles and knobs were treated, as well as the computer, keyboards, etc. at the monitor stations.

Mountain Shadows Fitness Center Adds a Rowing Machine

The Fitness Department is pleased to announce a new piece of equipment at Mountain Shadows Fitness Center. The Concept 2 Rowing provides a low-impact, high-calorie burn, as well as a total body conditioning workout. Variety is always important to your workouts and the rowing machine is a nice alternative to more traditional equipment like the treadmills, ellipticals, bikes, and NuSteps. Rowing is a very natural motion and most people pick it up quickly. To get started, focus on proper technique. There are four phases that make the rowing motion smooth and fluid: **Phase 1** – Starting position is called "the Catch," where arms are held straight, head is neutral, shoulders are level and not hunched. Lean your upper body slightly forward to the 1 o'clock position. Shins should be vertical or as close

to vertical as is comfortable for you. Your shins should not move beyond perpendicular; heels may lift as needed. **Phase 2** – Work phase is called "the Drive." Start by pressing your legs back; your body will move through vertical and finally add the arm pull. Shoulders stay relaxed and away from the ears, and hands move in a straight line to and from the flying wheel.


Phase 3 – Called "The Finish." Your upper body is at a slight lean to the 11 o'clock position and you're using good support from your core muscles. Legs are extended and the handle is held lightly below your ribs. Wrists should be flat. **Phase 4** – "Recovery." This position gets you back to your starting position. Extend your arms until they straighten before leaning from the hips toward the flywheel. Once your hands have cleared your knees, allow your knees to bend and gradually slide the seat forward on the monorail. Practice each phase slowly until your rowing stroke is smooth and fluid. The goal is to keep 22-26 strokes per minute until you are comfortable and then you can adjust your speed.

We held three equipment orientations for the rower in October, but can always offer more if there is an interest. Please feel free to call the Fitness Department with questions or concerns. It's time for us to start rowing our way into the New Year of healthy living!

Fitness Committee Meeting

Join representatives of the Fitness Department as they discuss issues of concern and/or address residents' questions about new classes and other fitness-related topics. The meeting is scheduled for Thursday, November 8, 10 a.m. in the Desert Vista Committee Room. How do you get to use the swimming pool lanes? All pools have designated swimming lanes (except the Pinnacle outdoor pool). The pools also have a designated area, which does not have to be requested, for free aqua-type exercise or walking. If you wish to request a lane, check with the pool or desk monitor on duty. Do not get into an open lane without checking, as it may have been assigned. During busy times, when all lanes are occupied, the monitor keeps a waiting list. As soon as a lane becomes available, the next person is assigned a lane and so on. Once you are assigned a lane, your 30-minute period begins. Spending extra time in the locker room or socializing prior to entering the pool will eat into that time. If no one is waiting when your 30 minutes are up, you can signal the monitor to ask for more time and a new 30-minute period will be started. Between 6-8 a.m. and 4-6 p.m., swimmers get priority in certain lanes. At other times of the day (open swim) lanes can be used to swim, walk or exercise. Check with the monitor. During busy times, the fitness monitor may ask you to share a lane. Keep in mind, when the pools are being used by the various aqua clubs, the lanes are not open or available for use by non-club members unless the club invites you to use lanes that will not interfere with their club activities. As always, please remember that you must shower before entering the pool.

and Debbie recalled that they drove their parents crazy with their constant cheering. A Potpourri of Committee Issues

Architectural Review Committee issues. First, a big shout-out to the very hardworking and dedicated ARC members: Ken Caroccia, D.J. Minella, Dan McDonald, Bruce Petrie, Wendell Phillips, Tom Romano, Mike Wuebker, Bruce Alitt and Julie Zerbel. They spend an enormous amount of time reviewing applications and conducting inspections to make sure that our homes conform to our Development Standards. And, an equally big shout-out to our Director of Community Standards, Kate Carroll, and her assistant Barbara Davidson. Thank you all.

Every two years the Development Standards are reviewed to see if changes should be made. It's time to do that again. So, if anyone has any suggestions for changes to our Development Standards, please email them to our Executive Director, Mitzi Mills (mitzim@suncitylv. com), Kate (katec@suncitylv.com), or me (ebachman@ embarqmail.com). We will start discussing possible changes at our November ARC meeting. We already know we will be clarifying allowable color palettes for driveway concrete coatings. We anticipate there will be

other changes needed to help maintain our beautiful community. Regarding other topics, please be sure to trim overhanging tree and shrub branches. Some homes have branches that hang over the sidewalks, which create a hazard. A number of residents are installing outdoor lights. Be considerate of your neighbors, as some lights shine directly into your neighbors' yards. Please, also, do not direct the lights upward. Rather, direct the light to the greatest extent possible to your own property.

Please do not take your trash containers out before 3

p.m. on Monday, and please move them away from the curb by 7 p.m. on Tuesday. Remember, trash containers stored outside the garage are not supposed to be visible from the street. Any enclosure needed to keep your trash containers from being visible from the street must have ARC approval and must be in place no later than March 1, 2019. Each sub-association will make its own determination about the location of outdoor storage for trash containers. Any sub-association's outdoor trash enclosures also need ARC approval. We will try to make the ARC approval process for outdoor trash enclosures as easy as possible.

Our hardworking staff and ARC volunteers are not mind-readers. If you see something that appears to be a violation of our Development Standards, please contact our Community Standards office so your complaint may be investigated. The Community Standards office is located at Mountain Shadows near the fountain. You can call the Community Standards Department at 702-966-1411.

Also, any exterior additions, modifications or other improvements, such as painting or new awnings need the approval of the Architectural Review Committee. Kate and Barbara are always willing to help guide you through the process. If you are in a sub-association, you will first need to obtain the approval of your sub-association before ARC can review your application for any changes to your townhome.

Dear Sun City Summerlin Homeowners,

The Governing Documents of Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc. (SCSCAI) give the SCSCAI Board of Directors the authority to create and amend Rules and Regulations for SCSCAI. At the October 2, 2018 SCSCAI Board of Directors Meeting the Board

Section V. General Membership Rules and Guidelines Item G. Garage Sales

1. Garage Sales are not permitted in Sun City Summerlin except for:

- a. The SCSCAI annual garage sale held at Mountain Shadows as determined by the Board of Directors.
- b. An All-Sun City Summerlin Annual Garage Sale at individual homes that shall take place as determined by the Board of Directors. All unsold items must be removed from the driveway, yards, etc. immediately upon close of sale each day. Any remaining items intended for pick up by a



adopted two resolutions to make amendments to two existing Rules and Regulations. The revised amendments to SCSCAI's Rules & Regulations are noted below. The amendment to the existing Rules & Regulations will appear in red along with a brief explanation in blue as to why this amendment was made, the black lettering indicates existing wording. These amendments represent ONLY the revised section of the Rules and Regulations that were adopted at the October 02, 2018 Board of Directors meeting and are hereby published in the November Link for official notification to SCSCAI homeowners of the amendment and change.

liquidation company and/or charity must be stored inside residence until day of scheduled pick up.

c. (Addition 10/02/18) Two-day sale due to moving or death of a resident, resident is required to obtain a permit from the Association prior to holding the sale. All unsold items must be removed from the driveway, yards, etc. immediately upon close of sale each day. Any remaining items intended for pick up by a liquidation company and/or charity must be stored inside residence until day of scheduled pick up.

This wording (above in red) was inadvertently removed from the Rules and Regulations in the last publication. This reinstates the Rules and Regulation as previously adopted by the Board in order to allow for our residents to engage in a Garage Sale in the event they are moving from the home or there is a death of a resident as long as they obtain a permit in advance.

SUN CITY SUMMERLIN COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RULES & REGULATIONS

Section IV. Common Facilities

Item A. General Facility Use

a. Alcoholic beverages consumed in any Sun City managed restaurant shall be purchased from Sun City licensed staff. During a chartered club function, or other function, that is not held at the Summit or at a SCSCAI restaurant alcoholicbeverages may be furnished by club members or others, provided the beverage is opened and served by a licensed Sun City Employee. Unused portions must be corked and returned, or properly disposed of. individuals may supply their own alcoholic beverages (BYOB) or contract with SCSCAI for a catered bar service to provide alcoholic beverages. A combination of BYOB or Catered Bar cannot be used and SCSCAI must be notified when the room is reserved which method of alcohol service will be used. Individuals sponsoring the event are responsible to make sure attendees are aware in advance that if there is a Catered Bar then participants cannot bring any alcoholic beverages into the event.

All the above shall be in accordance with the Las Vegas City Ordinance 6071 sec 6.50.430.

(Amended 10/02/18)

This wording (above in red) was adopted by the Board to allow our residents to choose between BYOB events or to Catered Bar events without the worry of violating local ordinances or requiring staff to be present to oversee events when alcohol is being brought in by participants.
