

COMEDY AND THEATER COLLIDE IN BROADWAY PARODY 'SPAMILTON'

When Gerard Alessandrini witnessed the sweeping impact of Broadway phenomenon "Hamilton," he knew just what he had to do.

He had to spoof it.

"It was the biggest hit show to arrive in Broadway since I had come there in 1981," remembers Alessandrini, whose Tonywinning revue Forbidden Broadway has parodied Broadway productions for decades. "I thought 'Wow, I've spent most of my life spoofing Broadway shows — I have to do this one."

A veteran playwright and director, Alessandrini took this comedic undertaking seriously.

The result was the highly acclaimed parody musical "Spamilton: An American Parody," offering clever, satirical songs and energizing dance numbers appealing to theater fans and newcomers alike.

"It's a good family show," he says. "I hope audiences feel the same joy seeing this that I felt when 'Hamilton' arrived in New York."

A HILARIOUS PARODY

Promising nonstop laughs and impressive music and dance numbers, "Spamilton" pokes fun at Lin-Manuel Miranda's creation of "Hamilton" and the show's overwhelming popularity.

"Spamilton" is packed with parody versions of hit "Hamilton" songs, including turning the original show's "What'd I Miss?" into the spoof "What Did You Miss?" satirizing the density of information in "Hamilton."

"The point was to make it all as funny and zany as it could be, with lots of both parody songs and parody dancing," Alessandrini says.

NO HAMILTON KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED

Audiences don't need to see "Hamilton" to enjoy "Spamilton," Alessandrini emphasizes.

The show also parodies the overall theater industry, with jokes about Stephen Sondheim and many other famous Broadway shows.

Even non-theatergoers will appreciate the physical comedy and skilled performances.

"You can enjoy this on many levels," he assures.

LIN-MANUEL'S SEAL OF APPROVAL


Beyond rave reviews from The New York Times, The Huffington Post and more, "Spamilton" has received the most coveted praise of all.

11 Vying for 4 Open Seats in SCSCAI Board of Directors Election

The Election Committee is preparing to conduct the annual election of Sun City Summerlin's Board of Directors. This year, Tuesday, February 26, 2019, is designated as Election Day and will be the last day to cast your ballot. Counting of the ballots will take place on Wednesday, February 27, 2019, at the Annual Membership meeting. Four positions will be filled. Each home will have four (4) votes that may be cast for one candidate or divided among all in any manner desired. It is critical that not more than four (4) votes are marked.

Ballots (part of the Link mailing label) and a return envelope will be included in your February Link. The ballot instructions are on the back of the address portion of the mailer. The ballot portion is perforated so the name and address can be removed by tearing the appropriate section at the perforation. After you mark your votes on this ballot, remove the address portion and insert the ballot into the envelope so that the bar code shows through the window in the envelope. It may then be mailed to the Administration Office, Mountain Shadows Community Center, 9107 Del Webb Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89134; or save Sun City the cost of postage by depositing your ballot in the ballot box at Mountain Shadows. If you mail your ballot, it must arrive no later than 5 p.m. on Tuesday, February 26, at which time voting will be closed.

Should you lose or accidentally destroy your ballot, another one can be obtained at the Administration Office. Before requesting a replacement ballot, be certain that another member of your household has not already voted. If two ballots are received from the same household **BOTH** will be voided. Also, if more than four (4) votes are marked on a ballot, all votes will be voided.



Information technology wise, many of the changes Sun City made over last year were internal, making staff more efficient, especially in the accounting department where we are much better able to keep track of revenue and expenses. We also installed several more large-screen monitors that display what's happening in SCSCAI. Of great import, we also brought a new website online. All in all, a very good year of using technology to make the support of staff and residents better, cheaper and faster. My thanks to everyone on the IT Committee and the SCSCAI staff, especially our Executive Director for all that was done to use IT to make our community better.

For the New Year, probably the two most important things you can do to keep your data safe:

Never respond directly to any email requesting your account information, including password or user information. Legitimate requests for changes ask you go to the vendors' website and make the change. DO NOT ever click on the supposed requesting site

- address contained in the email. Instead, if you think a change is needed (probably not if they ask you to click on an address in the message), go to your browser and input the address you know for that site. Keep your user data private.
- 2. DO NOT open email attachments when the email does not contain something that makes you confident the email comes from the person in the "from" line, someone you know or are expecting a note from. It's easy to make it look like the note comes from someone you know but, in reality, the message is from a scammer. An example of something that should ring a warning bell – "This is really funny" followed by an attachment. How did the scammer get your email address? They probably got it when someone you know opened an attachment that allowed the scammer to download the person's address book. So, when you send something with an attachment, make it personal so the person knows it's from you. For example, "Mary, I very much enjoyed lunch last week. I thought you might enjoy the attached." 




Over 85 and Active

JUMPING JACK JANUARY

If you're thinking that jumping jacks aren't for you, think again! Jumping jacks are a full range of motion exercise that gets your heart and lungs working, and improves movement through the arms and legs. But if jumping doesn't feel good on the



joints, there's a modified jumping jack that's a great alternative. Step your foot out to the side as you reach your arms overhead and repeat on the other side. Stay on one side for 10 reps then alternate side to side. You can even do seated jumping jacks by stepping your foot out to one side while reaching your arms overhead. Do 20 jumping jacks every day for this 31-day challenge in January. If you're feeling especially motivated, work up to one minute of jumping jacks. Log it in a journal to keep track and stay on course.





2019 Rings In a New Name for Neighborhood Watch/Community Preparedness Committee – Neighborhood Preparedness Team

he Sun City Summerlin Community Association (SCSCAI) formed the Community Preparedness Committee, whose focus was to educate member residents about emergency training, while also working together with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and City of Las Vegas to establish an effective Neighborhood Watch program.

"Whereas members of the original Standing Committee must be property owners, all residents of the community are welcome to serve the Neighborhood Preparedness Team, a community service organization," explained Erik Braun, Co-chair of the Neighborhood Watch/ Community Preparedness Committee.

Benefactors of the community wide education program include all residents of Sun City Summerlin, some of whom are not property owners, and therefore not endorsed members of the homeowners' association. The Neighborhood Preparedness Team advocates that all residents, including those who rent their homes, as well as property owners, should be acknowledged as contributors to the Sun City community.

"With the name change to the Neighborhood

Preparedness Team, the mission remains

the same, but the organizational structure will change to be more inclusive of everyone who calls Sun City their home," said Erik. "It is entirely right that all Sun City

residents, whether they own or rent their homes, are entitled

to benefit by the safety preparation standards of the Neighborhood Preparedness Team.

The Neighborhood Watch/ Community Preparedness Committee established in SCSCAI bylaws will be revised to eliminate the standing Board committee. A community organization, similar in theory to Residents' Forum or Security Patrol, will be established. The Team will continue the same safety education and crime prevention mission that supports everyone who lives here. A new constitution and organizational structure through the Chartered Clubs and Community Organizations Committee and Community Services will prevail. The mission, offerings and support to our community will not change; only the organizational structure will change to be more inclusive of everyone who lives here.

The Neighborhood Preparedness Team will continue to work with regard to educating residents to be safer, self-sufficient helping hands working to respond with the confidence of knowing how to react to a natural, industrial related or criminal associated emergency situation. The Neighborhood Preparedness Team comprises 78 Neighborhood Watch groups that keep a keen eye on Sun City Summerlin.



Living the American Dream

hey're coming to America. Got a dream to take them there," so goes the lyrics of the Neil Diamond song. Coming in search of the American dream, a dream that must be earned with patience and hard work. Take, for example, the life of Sun City resident Daisy Greve.

Daisy's father, Victor La Salle, left Puerto Rico for New

York City in 1949 to provide that opportunity to his soon-to-be-born child. As many before him have done, he left his pregnant wife, Margarita, behind until he could get a job and an apartment. The plan almost worked, but by the time he was settled, Margarita was 8 1/2 months pregnant and unable to travel. So Daisy was born in Puerto Rico and christened Elba Iris La Salle. (Much later in life Elba would legally change her name to Daisy, which she goes by today).

Forty days following her Daisy's birth, the family was reunited in Spanish Harlem, and later moved to the Bronx where they lived until her parents divorced in 1955.

Her brother and mother eventually settled in Union City, N.J., where, in 1968, Daisy graduated from Union Hill High School. It was time for a career decision. The Vietnam War was raging and that provided an option; the military was hiring and Daisy wanted to be an air traffic controller. A visit to the local Air Force recruiting office provided her with the assurances she wanted. Yes,

she could be an air traffic controller, all she had to do was pass the written test, which she did before enlisting. But the recruiter neglected to mention that the position required 20/20 vision, uncorrected. Daisy had signed up for four years and the needs of the service dictated her assignment. She was sent to March Air Force Base in Riverside, Calif. Her assignment: Administration

> Specialist in the 22nd Combat Support Group. There certainly are worse places to be stationed than Riverside, California, but Daisy had set her goals in life a lot higher than being a clerk.

Her enlistment up, she left the Air Force behind, remained in Southern California and enrolled in a local community college. Her education went so well that she earned a full College **Entrance Examination** Board Scholarship and was

recruited by several universities. She chose the University of Southern California, where she subsequently graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology, the first in her family to graduate college. Thus armed, she moved back to Riverside and was hired by the Riverside County Mental Health Department as a counselor in the

methadone program, working with heroin addicts tying to free themselves from addiction. She also ...


The November Common Area Properties Committee meeting saw a turnout of some 12 residents wishing to express concerns about the rumored early closing of the Sun Shadows swimming pool. SCSCAI Executive Director Mitzi Mills explained at great length that there had been no discussions at the CAP meetings about closing the pool. There were, however, questions raised about the economics of keeping that pool heated in April and October because weather conditions meant that it took more energy for the pool temperature to reach the desired 87 degree temperature during those months. The staff has been directed to do a cost/benefit tradeoff study before recommending any action. That effort is just getting underway. Mitzi assured the residents that they would be kept informed throughout the process. A brief discussion of the feasibility of a solar heating system followed with Mitzi sharing that in her experience, using solar for large bodies of water failed to be cost effective.

Under old business, the committee was presented with a number of bids, including:

- \$11,750 for a central fire detection system for Mountain Shadows
- \$7,635 for new solar shade window treatments for **Highland Falls**
- A total of three bids for re-carpeting the miniature golf course
- \$44,054 for replacement of the Mountain Shadows roof underlayment
- (The Committee accepted a staff recommendation to forward the sole-source bid for the roofing based on past experience with the vendor. On a unanimous vote, the Committee's recommendation was forwarded to Sun City's Board of Directors.)
 \$19,000 for upgrading the plumbing fixtures in the Pinnacle and Desert Vista restrooms.
 SCSCAI Fitness Director Pam Shields presented a proposal to remove (and transplant) four trees from the Desert Vista outdoor pool area. This action had been requested by recident. (The Committee accepted a staff recommendation to

requested by residents who claimed there was no direct route to the pool and by Pool Monitors because they said the trees blocked their view of the pool. The Committee accepted the recommendation.

Executive Director's Report

Is It a Service Animal, a Support Animal or a Pet? Why Is That Dog Allowed in Our Buildings? Are We Governed by the ADA?

Believe it or not, these questions rank at the top of the list as far as the most asked questions and the questions that raise the most concerns with our homeowners. I have to admit garbage can and refuse service questions still rank No. 1 in the question and concern department, but people bringing dogs into the community buildings is definitely a close second.

In fairness, no one is complaining about service dogs and the need some of our homeowners have for their help, but when the disability is not evident or the dog appears to be more of a pet than a working animal I hear from a lot of people.

Part of the concern is the simple fact that many people do not know what state and federal rules regulate memberonly areas and which ones regulate public spaces. The Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) governs public spaces such as our golf courses, theater and restaurants. It is not applicable to our common areas that are restricted to our members and their guests. Our common areas are governed by the federal Fair Housing

What Is the Difference Between a Service Animal and an **Emotional Support Animal?**

Service animals are defined as dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. The most common are guiding a person who is visually impaired, alerting a person who is subject to seizures or even calming a person who suffers from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. The work or task a service dog performs must be directly related to the person's disability. Service dogs may accompany persons with disabilities into places that the public normally goes and are allowed at our facilities that are open to the public. An emotional support animal is an animal that provides a therapeutic benefit to its owner through



companionship. The animal provides emotional support and comfort to individuals with psychiatric and other mental impairments. The animal is NOT specifically trained to perform tasks for a person who suffers from emotional disabilities. Unlike a service animal, an emotional support animal is not granted access to places of public accommodations. However, under the federal Fair Housing Act, an emotional support animal is viewed as a "reasonable accommodation" and is allowed in common areas that are for the sole use of members. What Areas of the Community Can a Person Take Their Emotional Support Animal/Assistance Animal? The law states that an assistance animal is allowed "in all areas of the community where residents are normally allowed to go, unless doing so would impose an undue financial and administrative burden or would fundamentally alter the nature of the business." According to the Fair Housing Act, assistance animals (also known as service animals)

Are not pets, but are "working animals" that help owners in a variety of ways.

Do not need to be trained or certified to perform a specific task.

The person who needs to use an assistance animal because of a disability must first make the request to the appropriate people (in our case the Association), and must submit our form and a letter on the provider's letterhead of the disability and disability-related need from a medical doctor or treating therapist who can establish the disability and need for the assistance animal.

If the resident has an assistance animal that violates rules or creates a nuisance, the owner of the home or resident can be found in violation of the community documents. Rules include but are not limited to - the animal must be on leash, the resident must have control of the animal at all times and the resident cannot leave the animal unattended

We want to accommodate our residents and their needs. Pets are not allowed in any of our buildings. Emotional support/assistance animals are not allowed at the golf course, theater or restaurants. Service animals are allowed in all areas.




