

## Good Day to All Our SCSCAI Residents

his month I'll cover some miscellaneous items and highlight another of our fabulous standing committees. In the September Link I discussed the differences between the master Association (SCSCAI) and the many sub-associations in our community. Several people called me with questions and I want to clarify one point. Each sub has its own set of governing documents that specify rules that must comply with the master's governing documents. The sub's rules specify what it is responsible for as far as maintaining its common areas; who is responsible for the driveways, the mailboxes, address lights, driveways, etc. Not all subs have the same rules, so check your governing documents to be sure.

First a note on SCSCAI. We are not a closed homeowners association (HOA). That is, we do not have gates that control access and thus do not own or maintain the streets or street lights. We cannot do traffic control, can only do limited parking control and so on — all the things a gated community is responsible for. That distinction permeates what we can do about many issues.

I receive more calls about dog poop, coyotes and people speeding or running stop signs than all the other calls put together.

**Dog poop.** When you walk your dog, pick it (the poop) up! Note that some of what you think is from dogs might be from coyotes. If you can identify who is not being a responsible dog owner, let us know. Take a picture of the incident and tell us who the dog owner is and we can do something. Else there is not much we can do.


**Coyotes.** We have done what we can within very specific legal constraints. On the good side, coyotes help control the rabbits and rats. Be careful with letting small dogs and cats outside.

**Speeders and stop sign running.** There is little we can do that we have not already done. We ask for compliance in the Link. We put up flashing lights on stop signs. We installed speed warning signals. We considered speed bumps (very bad for golf carts), and we mention the issue at many venues. The streets do not belong to us and we cannot enforce any laws pertaining to speeding and stop signs. What we have done is spend many thousands of dollars to do what we can to alleviate the problem. We continue to look for solutions, but the only real solution is for all of us to obey traffic laws. And quit parking on the sidewalks.

Now, on to committees. The basic charter of the Deed Restriction Hearing Committee (DRHC) is to consider any violation of our development standards and, if appropriate, impose fines or suspension of privileges to our facilities for violations. If you paint your house blue with pink stripes, the DRHC may end up consid-

ering your choice of paint. The usual process is for the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) to decide there is a violation and forward the information to the DRHC for consideration. DRHC meetings are closed meetings. The reason for the "secret" process is that Nevada law requires it. Because of the possibility of appealing any decision made by the DRHC to the SCSCAI Board, the DRHC is the only committee chaired by a non-Board member and composed entirely of residents. Note: To be a member of any committee you must own a home in Sun City Summerlin.







#### Some Things to Know About the Smoke Alarm Project

As we move toward the end of the first phase (the learning phase) of the Smoke Alarm Project, we have learned a lot. The team of Sun City Summerlin volunteers will be taking a break from the town halls and blitz days during the holidays, and in the December Link the new program developed from the lessons learned over the last few months will be introduced. Even though the program will change a bit, the commitment will not. The goal remains to replace all smoke alarms in Sun City Summerlin homes that are over 10 years old. The changes, among other things, will:

- Introduce an easier way to get signed up.
- Eliminate the requirement to attend a town hall to qualify to sign up.
- Enable residents to schedule appointment installs outside of the blitz day.

For those homeowners who participated in the first phase, you were our guinea pigs on this project and we thank you. Without you we would not have learned what efficiencies, products and installation changes we needed to introduce. By your standing in line for tickets to and attending town halls, participating in our blitz days, and waiting at home without knowing exactly what time your installation would be, Las Vegas Fire & Rescue has been able to put together a program they believe will expedite the process and better serve Sun City Summerlin residents. We applaud LVFR for its commitment to Sun City Summerlin residents and this project.

For now we are not taking any new signups. Residents who are currently signed up will be contacted by Zachery Collins from Las Vegas Fire & Rescue to schedule an installation.

In December we will roll out Metro Fire Departments program, which will include how to sign up and other information about the program.

#### Community Projects Keep Staff, Volunteers on Their Toes

his month's Common Area Properties Committee meeting failed to establish a quorum at its meeting on October 1, however CAP Chairman Bruce Alitt opted to hold a modified meeting/workshop because he said he saw a few new faces in the room and wanted to give them a chance to see the Committee in action.

Before the workshop got underway, Bruce explained since there was not a quorum present, the Committee could not conduct official business or vote on any of the agenda items. Therefore, the meeting was held for information purposes only.

With that, Sun City department directors updated the Committee on the progress of several projects that had taken place over the course of the previous month.

Brian Bagwell, SCSCAI Director of Golf Course Maintenance, brought CAP members up to speed on the annual overseed project, which was nearing its

end. As for the Palm Valley irrigation project, Brian said, "It is now complete. The contractor is gone and everything is working really well."

Moving into the fall, Brian added, "A lot of the work we'll be doing now is detail work around the courses, which is normal stuff after the summer. And, I'm looking forward to the water bill coming down."

Following up on other golf news, Golf Director Donny Long updated the Committee on his proposed purchase for new rental

clubs, and the importance of keeping the equipment up to date.

"When we get calls from outside golfers, the first question they ask is what kind of rental club we stock," he said.

According to Donny, the type of club, along with its technology and age makes the decision for many golfers looking for a new course to play.

Next up, Building Maintenance Director Brandon Balek alerted Committee members to the status of several projects that were wrapping up at Highland Falls Golf Course. Brandon explained that he


scheduled his crew to complete annual maintenance work while the area was closed for overseed. At Tavern at the Falls, the kitchen received new flooring, which was recommended by the Clark County Health Department during a routine inspection. The new surface is a similar epoxy that carries a 10-year life. Another project that was checked off the list is one that has been talked about for a while. According to Brandon, the protruding curb located near the clubhouse entrance has been removed to allow access for two cars in the lane.

"If there is a delivery truck, or a car dropping off a passenger at the front door, another car can now safely pass on the outside," Brandon said. "Before, the curbing caused cars to back up. Now, the area has been widened."

When CAP Committee member Ed Turkin asked Brandon a question about pigeons, Brandon responded that he was working with Terminix on a "pigeon protection" program for Highland Falls and Palm Valley. The plan, he said, would cost roughly \$5,000 for the first year. And while the item is not budgeted in the current fiscal year, the need to address the problem may facilitate a move to find funds soon.

If you have a question about how Association funds are allocated, or want to suggest a project for community improvement, plan to attend the monthly CAP meetings. They are an informative way to spend 90 minutes.

of blue containing the stars representing the 50 states. Security Patrol Watch Commander Phil Pupanek read "I Am the Flag," a moving poem written in the voice of the flag, recounting its history in war and peace. The poem reminded all in attendance the cost of freedom and hope for the future.

Scout Master Robert D. Rourke explained the ceremony, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. As each stripe was reverently folded, a Scout read a passage from either the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, or iconic quotes from Abraham Lincoln, John F. Kennedy or Neil Armstrong. Following the reading of each stripe's representation, the stripe handed to a Scout who passed it to a brother Scout who then reverently placed it on the flames.

The keepers of the flame were Security Patrol volunteers Phil Pupanek, Joseph Tao and Richard Becker. As the smoke rose it symbolically carried with it the tears and prayers for fallen men and women of the military who died in defense of our country, as well as those who returned home with injures requiring a lifetime of care. We were reminded of the tragedy of 9/11 and the thousands of people who died, and the agonizing deaths of police officers and fire fighters who became victims of cancer as a result of their bravery. Continuing its path toward the sky, the dark

grey smoke also reminded many of the dreams of new citizens who proclaimed their first pledge of allegiance after years of study.

#### Healthy Sleep, Less Stress!

he month of November is dedicated to sleep and stress. The National Sleep Foundation reports that "Healthy sleep habits can make a big difference in your quality of life. Having healthy sleeping habits is often referred to as having good sleep hygiene."

> tions, it's possible they might be interfering with a good night's sleep, but never stop taking medication without the consent of your doctor.

# Built for Education

#### Volunteers' Work With Burro Helps Spread Message of Awareness, Conservation

There's the cowboy, of course, who many consider a wrangler of horses and cattle, and then there are other animal groups that have their own herders like sheep and goats, but burros? They're known to be a stubborn breed, right? So any type of wrangling, it seems, could be a mission in futility.

Not true, say two Sun City ladies and volunteers with the Friends of Red Rock Canyon who are official burro wranglers of the agency's 8-year-old burro named Jackson. Jackson is a little guy in the world of burros, standing only 11 hands (or 44 inches tall) compared to 60 inches of the average burro. He weighs 385 pounds, or 100 less than his adult counterpart. So he's a real cutie. He was born in Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area and is a product of the Bureau of Land Management's Wild Horse and Burro Program. Jackson is owned by Blaine Benedict, the former executive director of the Southern Nevada Conservancy, and he is the official ambassador of the BLM's conservation program.



"Jackson was built for education," said Blaine. "The program he belongs to was originally designed to protect the wild horses and burros on public lands as a symbol of America. Burros, you know, are not a native species. They were introduced by the Spanish and now there are thousands of them living on the range, and they put a stress on the land. So, Jackson helps promote awareness of wild burros, introduces people to what they look like and how they can adopt them, as well as how they are protected."

"Jackson also helps to educate people on how dangerous it is to feed a wild burro because they can get used to it and head onto roads, which is dangerous for them and for the people who feed them," said Stacie Coppens, volunteer wrangler No. 1 and the administrative coordinator for the Link Magazine.

"I don't know why I am so obsessed with this burro," Stacie said, running her fingers along the inside tuft of Jackson's ear. "He just has that effect on people. He was my little therapy burro when my dogs and my dad died. He's helped me through

some things."

Stacie's commitment to conservation took a natural turn when she met Jackson. In an instant, she was able to be hands-on with a unique educational opportunity, while helping to raise awareness about an important local issue – the stewardship of public lands.

Burro wrangler No. 2, Beth Dixon, knew about Jackson from her work at Red Rock NCA, and when a former wrangler had to take some time off due to an injury, Beth stepped in.

"I told her, 'Come on out, we can always use another wrangler,' " Stacie said.

In addition to her time working with Jackson, Beth also volunteers at Red Rock Canyon, removing graffiti and picking up trash along the trails.

An average morning with Jackson can include anything from cleaning out his stall at Cowboy Trail Rides in Red Rock Canyon, where the burro lives stall-free for most of the year as his space is donated by the horseback riding company. Wranglers also brush, feed and keep Jackson as free from flies as possible by spraying his coat and super-soft ears. But the most fun part of working with Jackson Stacie and Beth say is when they get the chance to take him for a walk.

Before wranglers can hit the trail, however, they must undergo a strict training program to ensure their and Jackson's safety. After all, walking a burro is not like walking a dog, unless you're talking about a 400-pound one!

Another interesting fact about Jackson, said Blaine, is that he's a public figure.

"He has a Facebook page, a line of swag and a personality to go with it. He has a sophisticated sense of humor and is occasionally sarcastic like when he tips over his full poop bucket after you've cleaned out his stall because he doesn't want you to leave. He recognizes voices and car sounds, and he's happy when his regular visitors come to visit him."

Next stop: training to get him out on the trails to carry water and sandwiches to Red Rock Canyon volunteers working on various restoration projects.

## ARE YOU AWARE OF THE NEW MEDICAID LAWS?





# So You Think You Want to Be a Board Member?

"The specific purpose for which this corporation is formed is to act as a community welfare and homeowners' association and to promote the recreation, health, safety and welfare of its members... to provide for the maintenance of the common area, association lands and facilities for the benefit of all of the residents of the community of Sun City Summerlin."

Articles of Incorporation, Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., June 15, 1989

This article is designed to help SCSCAI homeowners in good standing who may be thinking of running for the Board of Directors understand the responsibility of the position. The official filing period is underway, with the deadline to file, Friday, November 29, 5 p.m., at the Administration Office at Mountain Shadows.

The first thing to understand about a Board member's role is to understand Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., as well as how to work within SCSCAI's tradition and protocol.

It is expected that you are aware of and understand the importance of Nevada Revised Statute NRS 116. If you are successful in winning a seat on the Board of Directors, you will receive a copy of the most recent NRS 116 manual. NRS 116 is the statute that governs Homeowners' Associations (HOAs), HOA Developers, Condominium Hotels, and licensed Community Managers.

You also should be familiar with SCSCAI's Governing Documents, which include:

- Articles of Incorporation
- Bylaws
- Declaration of Covenants,
   Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R's)
  - Development Standards
  - Rules and Regulations

In addition to the above, candidates must be knowledgeable of Sun City's Age Restriction Policy, as well as aware of by accepting the elected position of being a Board member, you incur a fiduciary responsibility for the operation of the community.

It is strongly recommended that you read and understand our Governing Documents, including NRS116 and Robert's Rules of Order as one of your first priorities when thinking of running for office.

#### Sun City's Committees

As you begin your campaign, it is a good idea to attend as many committee meetings as you can, especially those that you are particularly interested in. Standing Committees are an extension of the Board of Directors. Standing Committees make recommendations to the Board of Directors. Many agenda items originate at the Committee level. Committees and staff work together to arrive at a particular agenda item. Attending Committee meetings will ensure you have the opportunity to participate in discussions and understand why a specific item has been placed on the Board agenda.

There is at least one Board member on each committee. You are encouraged to attend committee meetings to keep track of what is happening in the community.

Sun City's standing and advisory committees are:

- ARC Architectural Review Committee. The ARC enforces Community Standards and approves requests for architectural and visual changes to the outside of residents' homes.
- CAP Common Area Properties. CAP inspects Association buildings and grounds to see where improvement is needed. CAP recommends purchases, repairs and remodels in the Reserves.
- CCOC Chartered Clubs and Community Organizations. The Committee oversees the charters and budgets of clubs, and makes sure they follow the guidelines of the approved Procedures Manual. Oversight extends to Security Patrol, Sunshine Services, Sun City Charities/Volunteers and the Residents' Forum.
- DRHC Deed Restriction and Hearing Committee. Hearings are between the Committee and the owner not in compliance with community standards.
- Finance Serves in an advisory capacity and advises the Board on all items financial. There are three (3) subcommittees of Finance, Audit, Investments and Insurance.
- Fitness Makes recommendations to the Board of Directors and staff concerning Health & Fitness Department issues.
- Golf Oversight Consists of golfers and golf club representatives. Golf Oversight makes recommendations to the Board of Directors and staff concerning golf issues.

- IT Information Technology encompasses Suncitysummerlin.com, Golfsummerlin.com, and all programs and tech licenses.
- Legal An advisory committee to the Board of Directors. The LSC stays up to date on NRS 116 and makes recommendations to the Board of Directors on updating or changing the Association's governing documents based on new laws, community needs or at the request of the Board of Directors.
- Link An advisory committee to the Board of Directors, overseeing the monthly Link magazine and Suncitylink.com.

Beyond chairing your own Committee and visiting other Committee meetings, there is the monthly Coffee With the Board. This informal get-together welcomes residents to get involved in conversations regarding issues that affect our community. This particular event falls under the category of a workshop. The Board of Directors cannot vote or make decisions during Coffee with the Board, however, they may request the Executive Director follow up on items addressed during Coffee with the Board.

#### Attending a Board meeting

Board meetings typically start at 9 a.m. on the second Tuesday of the month at Desert Vista. They last about 2 to 2.5 hours, followed by the Board members and select staff meeting for lunch. After lunch there is usually an Executive Session that starts between 1 to 1:30 p.m. Executive Session meetings take place in the committee meeting rooms at Pinnacle or Desert Vista. There are several evening meetings (2 per year required by NRS) scheduled each year that start at 6 p.m. Before each Board meeting, it is very important that you review the agenda so you are prepared to discuss and vote on agenda items.

# The Executive Board may meet in Executive Session only to:

- (a) Consult with the attorney for the association on matters relating to proposed or pending litigation if the contents of the discussion would otherwise be governed by the privilege set forth in NRS 49.035 to 49.115, inclusive.
- (b) Discuss the character, alleged misconduct, professional competence, or physical or mental health of a community manager or an employee of the association.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, discuss a violation of the governing documents, including, without limitation, the failure to pay an assessment.
- (d) Discuss the alleged failure of a unit's owner to adhere to a schedule required pursuant to NRS 116.310305 if the alleged failure may subject the unit's owner to a construction penalty. Decisions can be made in Executive Session, but most actions of the Board must be held in open Board meetings. A motion

can be brought forth from Executive Session for a Board

meeting. Example: Settlement of a lawsuit.

#### Other Items to Consider

- Process one to 20 informational emails a day regarding Association business.
- Meet with the Executive Director regarding issues that have come to your attention that may need staff attention.
- Your telephone number and/or email is included in the LINK. As a result, Residents may call you on occasion.
- As a member of the Board of Directors, a large commitment of your time is required. Plan to devote a minimum of six to 10 hours per week on Association business. During annual Budget Hearings, several full days will be devoted to briefings by Staff on the annual budget.

As a Board member, it is important to understand that you have no power or authority as an individual, the SCSCAI Board is the authority. Your position and vote creates the policies and provides direction to staff and residents. The Board of Directors is composed of nine members. On occasion, the Board of Directors will not vote unanimously. As a result, once a vote is taken it is important to move to the next item on the agenda.

The residents will vote because you have their best interests at heart and support the community in which they live. Board members must always consider what is best for the Association.

# Meeting of the Board of Directors, October 8, 2019, Desert Vista Community Center, 9 a.m.

Board members present: Jim Akers, Bruce Alitt, Ellen Bachman, Barbara Holden, David Putney, Ken Resnik, Gerry Sokolski. Board members absent: Dick Clark and Leo Crawford.

- 1. Minutes of the September 10, 2019, Executive Board of Directors Meeting. MOTION: to approve the minutes from the September 10, 2019, meeting of the Executive Board of Directors as amended to correct Page 3, under Paragraph B, the motion shows being made by Mr. Clark. Mr. Clark was not present at the September 10, 2019, meeting. Staff to check records and update the motion accordingly. Motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Sun Shadows Fitness and Community Center Upgrade Fire System to Current Code. (No Motion) The Board of Directors had the bids for this project opened and read into the minutes as follows: A-1 National Fire Company bid amount of \$28,000; Siemens' bid amount, \$49,875; and COSCO Fire Protection, amount \$38,425. The Board of Directors referred the bids to the staff to prepare comparisons, as well as the Common Area Properties Committee and Finance Committee for review and recommendation to the Board of Directors.
- 3. Pinnacle Softball Field Fence Increase the Height of the Outfield Fence. (No Motion) The Board of Directors had the bids for this project opened and read into the minutes as follows: Red Star Fence Company bid amount, \$24,500; Fencing Specialists' bid amount, \$16,551; and American Fence Company bid amount, \$38,750. The Board of Directors referred the bids to the staff to prepare comparisons, as well as the Common Area Properties Committee and Finance Committee for comment and recommendation to the Board of Directors.
- 4. Reserve Fund and Capital Fund Create Spending Levels -Level 1 Projects and Level 2 Projects. MOTION: Pursuant to the Bylaws of Sun City Summerlin, Section 7.11, the Board at its discretion, shall establish such other spending limits for the Executive Director for funds that may be spent without prior approval of the Board, in consultation with the Executive Director, as deemed appropriate, the following policy is adopted: At the time the fiscal year budget is prepared for the Reserve Fund Account and the (New) Capital Improvement Account, staff will label each line item as a "Level 1 Project" or a "Level 2 Project." The Board of Directors will review and amend the labeling as part of the budget process and at their discretion. The definition of Level 1 Projects shall be projects approved by the Board of Directors with the adoption of the Reserve Fund or New Capital Budget that (a) do not require a contract (b) that the Board of Directors agree a bid is not needed and (c) will not exceed the budget amount when all components are included. All Level 1 Projects will be reported to the Board of Directors monthly in list format and ratified at the Board of Directors meeting. Level 2 Projects shall be projects approved by the Board of Directors with the adoption of the Reserve Fund or New Capital Budget that (a) require a contract (b) that the Board of Directors agree a bid is needed and (c) will exceed the budget amount when all components are included. Level 2 items will be

- agenda items that require sealed bids and approval by the Board prior to being scheduled. The limit as set forth in the Bylaws for authority to spend up to \$10,000 per incident for repair of facilities and maintenance does not change and is interpreted to mean operating expenses or reserve expenses to repair components that were not budgeted for in the current year's budget but are necessary to the operation of the Association and cannot be delayed. In the case of an emergency, the limit on the Executive Director's authority is waived, but must be ratified by the Board at the next Board of Directors meeting. *Motion passed unanimously*.
- 5. Bid Policy for Operating, Reserve Fund and Capital Fund **MOTION:** To adopt the following policy: Staff shall obtain three (3) bids for all Level 2 Projects and any other projects budgeted or unbudgeted where the Board of Directors requests bids. The contract, services or purchase of items may not necessarily be awarded to the lowest bidder, but will be awarded to the best bidder as determined by the Board of Directors. The requirement for three (3) bids may be waived by the Board of Directors depending on the circumstances, i.e., whether the work is an emergency, the Association has a long term standing relationship with a particular vendor who is especially knowledgeable of the project, when changing vendors would disrupt existing warranties, when the vendor is particularly knowledgeable of Association property, or is an expert in the field described in the scope of work, when there is a territory issue, when a specific manufacture of product is needed for consistency or functionality and when other vendors are not willing to bid on the project. *Motion passed unanimously*.
- 6. Executive Directors Submittal of Proposed Designations of Level 1 Project or Level 2 Project. MOTION: Mr. Resnik made a motion to table discussion and decision on the Executive Directors submittal of the proposed designations of Level 1 Project or Level 2 Project for the projects that were approved as part of the 2019/2020 Budget for the Reserve Fund and the New Capital Fund. Second by Ms. Bachman. Motion passed unanimously.
- Executive Director's Spending Authority. MOTION: To
  accept the Executive Director's spending authority policy as submitted by the Executive Director to be effective as of the October 8,
  2019, Board of Directors meeting. Motion passed unanimously.
- Ratify Desert Vista Indoor Pool Make Up Air Unit Replacement Final Cost Over Previously Approved Dollar Amount. MOTION: To ratify the additional \$5,800 needed to replace the Desert Vista Indoor Pool Make Up Air Unit, in addition to the \$30,000 approved by the Board of Directors at the January 7, 2019, Board meeting, noting that the replaced cost was \$35,800. Motion passed unanimously.
- 9. Request to Become a Chartered Club Sun City Social Duplicate Supervised Bridge. MOTION: To accept the recommendation of the Chartered Clubs & Community Organizations Committee from its August 15, 2019, committee meeting to approve the request to create the Sun City Social Duplicate Supervised Bridge Chartered Club by approving the proposed constitution and to approve the staff recommendation that Sun City Social Duplicate Supervised Bridge Chartered Club will not be assigned a designated room and will use

- designated space as scheduled by the Community Services Office and reserved for card play. If additional space is needed for meetings or functions it will be by reservation if space is available and per the restrictions in "The Chartered Clubs & Community Organizations Procedures Manual." *Motion passed unanimously.*
- 10. Request to Become a Chartered Club Sun City Library Club. MOTION: To accept the recommendation of the Chartered Clubs & Community Organizations Committee from its August 15, 2019, committee to approve the request to create the Sun City Library Club by approving the proposed constitution for the Sun City Library Club and to approve the staff recommendation that this Sun City Library Chartered Club will be assigned designated room space at the Library at Sun Shadow and Mountain Shadows; however, both areas must remain open to the residents during the current posted hours and if additional space is needed for meetings or functions it will be contingent upon if space is available, a prior reservation of the space and per the restrictions in "The Chartered Clubs and Community Organizations Procedures Manual." Motion passed unanimously.
- 11. Sun City Golf Rules Add Urinating and Defecating on Golf Course Prohibited (failed). MOTION: To accept the recommendation of the Golf Oversight Committee at its September 25, 2019, committee meeting to amend the Sun City Summerlin Community Association Rules and Regulations as adopted on April 3, 2019, Section VI. Sun City Summerlin Golf Rules, Sub-Section F. Golf Etiquette by adding that urinating and defecation on any Golf Course or upon the lands of adjoining homeowners is strictly prohibited. Motion failed with six (6) voting against the motion and one (1) abstaining. It was noted that a rule is not needed to enforce this and all residents need to do is call the Pro Shop.
- 12. Sun City Golf Rules Add Control of Noise Level for Talking and Music (failed). MOTION: To accept the recommendation of the Golf Oversight Committee at its September 25, 2019, committee meeting to amend the Sun City Summerlin Community Association Rules and Regulations as adopted April 3, 2019, Section VI –Sun City Summerlin Golf Rules, Sub Section F Golf Etiquette by adding that players shall not speak so loud or have music volume so loud as to annoy any adjacent homeowner. Motion failed with six (6) voting against the motion and one (1) abstaining. It was noted that a rule is not needed to enforce this and all residents need to do is call the Pro Shop.
- 13. **2019 Financial Statement Review. MOTION:** To accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee at its September 26, 2019, committee meeting to accept the previously distributed Financial Statement for the month ending August 31, 2019, subject to audit, and to acknowledge that pursuant to NRS 116.31083 (7) the Board of Directors has received and reviewed the financial information as required and accepts those reports subject to audit. **Motion passed with six (6) voting in favor of the motion and one (1) abstaining.**
- 14. **Legal Review NRS 116.31083(7f) Requirement. MOTION:**To acknowledge that the Board of Directors have fulfilled their duty as a Board in reviewing legal issues in accordance with NRS116.31083(7f) as stated in the report provided with this agenda. *Motion passed unanimously.*
- 15. Ratify Palm Valley Golf Course Lake # 18 Pump Replacement. MOTION: To ratify the emergency replacement of the

- motor for the water feature at Palm Valley Golf Course #18 in the amount of \$6,426.36. Water feature motors are part of the Reserve Fund and this was budgeted for replacement in 2028, and the life of pumps in the Reserve Fund need to be re-evaluated. *Motion passed unanimously.*
- 16. Architectural Add Colors to the Color Palette for Awnings. MOTION: To accept the recommendation of the Architectural Review Committee at its September 12, 2019, committee meeting, that the Board of Directors approve adding the proposed color palette as presented to the Board of Directors at the October 8, 2019, meeting for awnings and make the color palette as accepted or amended a part of these minutes. *Motion passed unanimously*.
- 17. Echo Mesa/Del Webb Turf Planter Area Beautification Project. MOTION: To accept the recommendation of the Common Area Properties Committee at its September 3, 2019, committee meeting and the Architectural Review Committee at its September 12, 2019, meeting to approve the Echo Mesa/Del Webb Turf Area Beautification Project as proposed and to make the details of the project an attachment to the minutes of the October 8, 2019, Board meeting minutes. The project is to be done in house at an estimated cost of \$3,600. Motion passed unanimously.
- 18. City of Las Vegas Restriping of Streets to Reduce the Size of the Driving Lanes and Add Bike/Golf Cart Lanes. MOTION: To acknowledge and support the recommendation from the City of Las Vegas to reduce the width of the driving lanes on Del Webb Boulevard between Rampart and Lake Mead, and add a 4-foot shoulder that would be for use by bicycles and golf carts. The Board gives its support with the caveat that it is noted that (1) the streets belong to the City of Las Vegas and an approval or support from the Sun City Board of Directors is not needed (2) the Board of Directors of Sun City Summerlin only offer their support because it was asked for. This consideration was not requested of the City of Las Vegas by the Board of Directors and (3) if this is the traffic calming measure the City of Las Vegas is choosing for this area, that the lanes be marked and signs be installed to designate their intended use to avoid confusion. Motion passed with six (6) voting in favor of the motion and one (1) voting against.
- 19. Pickleball Chartered Club Request for Use of Pickleball Courts and 2 Tennis Courts for Toys For Tots Tournament. **MOTION:** To approve the request from the Sun City Summerlin Pickleball Chartered Club to host a resident and non-resident Pickleball Tournament on December 7 and 8, 2019, to benefit the Marine Corps Toys for Tots, and to allow the exclusive use and accommodations for the tournament as follows: (1) All of the Desert Vista Pickleball Courts (2) Two of the Desert Vista Tennis Courts (3) Desert Vista Picnic Area (4) the two Tennis courts shall be prepared for the game of Pickleball by the Sun City Summerlin maintenance crew by using court tape to tape Pickleball court lines. At the end of the tournament the Sun City Summerlin maintenance staff will remove the tape and (5) adherence by Sun City Pickleball Chartered Club to the requirements set forth in the Chartered Club Common Area Use for Tournaments, Fund Raisers or Events With Participant or Attendees That Include Non-Residents form. Motion passed unanimously.




