President PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Changes Coming to Sun City's Board of Directors' Election



ood day Summerlin residents. For October let's look at one of our standing committees, the Election Committee. The Election Committee is responsible for conducting all SCSCAI elections and balloting, including counting the votes for those activities. Like all the standing committees, the chairperson is appointed each year by the president of SCSCAI's Board of Directors (me) with the advice and consent of the Board. Jeff Wilkinson is the present chairman of the Election Committee. The chairperson of each standing committee appoints the members of its committee (with the exception of the Architectural Review Committee, where Sun City's Board of Directors approves the members as well as the chairperson). Once appointed, only SCSCAI's Board can remove a committee member.

Working with a Board-appointed subcommittee made up of Ellen Bachman, Barbara Holden and Bruce Alitt, Jeff did an in-depth review of Sun City's voting processes to see if we could improve the ballots themselves, as well as the way we conduct our elections and balloting. As a result, at the August SCSCAI Board of Directors' meeting, the Board approved changes that will improve how the Election Committee conducts activities, including how ballots are sent to the membership and how ballots are secured. The February SCSCAI election will reflect those changes.

The election for SCSCAI Board members takes place every year on the fourth Tuesday in February. Other balloting for such things as changes to the CC&Rs typically also take place on that day on the same ballot, although they do not have to. The

counting of ballots normally takes place the day after the final day ballots can be submitted. Once counted, the results are given to the Board Secretary, who signs the tabulation of the votes and announces the results.

New subject. There are some issues that never seem to end. I'll briefly note three of those.

- 1. Parking on the sidewalks. Don't do it! Sidewalks are for walking, not parking. That seems to be a difficult concept for some people.
- 2. Please maintain your yard in accordance with our development standards. Sweep the rocks off the sidewalks, pull weeds, and trim bushes and trees off the sidewalks.
- 3. Contact the Community Standards Office before doing any work on the exterior of your home. Kate Carroll and Barbara Davidson, the Community Standards folks, will be happy to show you what color you can paint your home, tell you about setback requirements and so on. 

Request for Tree Removals Sparks Discussion

ommon Area Properties Committee Chairman Bruce Alitt brought the September CAP meeting to order on September 3, thanking committee members for their hard work and dedication. "CAP is one of the hardest working committees in Sun City. We do inspections once a month and

we're always running around, and I appreciate your efforts very much," he said.

Among the agenda items for the meeting were four homeowners who live along the 2500 block of Deer Lake Street who requested the Association remove

trees (at the residents' expense) on Thomas Ryan Boulevard that impact their views.

The item sparked a healthy discussion among CAP members, with the central issue focusing on a concern over setting a potential precedent for tree removal requests. As such, the item will continue to be researched by

SCSCAI Executive Director Mitzi Mills and return to the Committee at the October 1 meeting for further discussion.

Another tree issue was addressed by SCSCAI Landscape Director Louis Darling, who explained that irrigation work at the Palm Valley Golf Course caused significant damage to several pine trees located behind the Miller's Tavern/Palm Valley monument sign located at Echo Mesa Drive and Del Webb Boulevard. According to Louis, the trees will most likely need to come down as he does not think the root systems are strong enough to support the trees during a wind storm.

Aside from landscape concerns, the Committee reviewed an update to an emergency addition to the August Board of Directors' agenda regarding the installation of a security camera and license plate reader at Highland Falls Golf Course. The project, which was approved not to exceed \$12,000, was implemented in response to a recommendation by staff due to several reported break-ins at the parking lot.





STEPHEN EDEN: A LITTLE TOO LATE FOR WWII, BUT JUST IN TIME FOR KOREA

ack when I was growing up there was a cartoon in our local newspaper called "Born Too Soon," or something like that. Although not the focus of the series, in some way it characterizes many of the youth of America born in the late 1920s who were born just a little too late. These kids desperately wanted to fight in World War II, but they were just a little too young. Not that that stopped many of them. A "modified" birth certificate here, a

recruiter with a quota to make there and, voila! — they were in.

Look at the history of Sun City resident Stephen Eden. Being born at the very end of 1928 meant that Steve was barely 13 when Pearl Harbor was attacked. He and his two brothers were living in Chicago. By 1945, both brothers were in uniform. Oldest brother Edward was a Master Sergeant with three years of combat experience as part of MacArthur's Southwest Pacific command. Middle brother Bruno was in the Navy. Steve wanted in so he "modified" his birth certificate and went to the local Navy recruiting office. The modification wasn't exactly professional and the Navy sent him home.

Not to be denied, Steve tried again. Starting with another modified certificate he went to the Army recruiting office in April 1945 and volunteered for immediate induction, asking to start on May 16 because five of his friends were scheduled to report that day.

This time, whether it was because he did a better job of modifying the certificate, or because the recruiter hadn't met his quota, or because his story of enlisting along with his friends rang true we will never know. Suffice it to say, Steve took the oath along with his friends and they all reported to Fort Sill, Okla., for basic training. Steve's mother wasn't thrilled, but she went along for now.

But by late June that changed. Mother decided that she needed Steve at home more than the Army did. One phone call and on July 5, 1945, Steve was a civilian again. The war was about over anyway, so Steve began his civilian career landing a job as a printer. He was married at 19, divorced at 21 — just in time for the Korean War.

"In September 1951, I again enlisted in the Army. This time it took. After basic training and some advanced schooling I found

myself in Korea. I was assigned to a topographic company in the Corps of Engineers. My outfit was stationed about 10 miles south of the front lines, which at that time was around the 38th parallel. My job was to make maps. That included printing them in four colors so my civilian experience really helped. You see, the presses we had at that time were one-color presses, which meant that the maps had to be created with four overlays – one for each color and

then the image printed four times to create an accurate map. Not an easy thing at any time, let alone on a field press.

"The job also required that I go up to the front line to meet with the men from our survey platoon to get the information necessary to keep our maps up to date. The first time I did that was an experience that I will never forget.

As I said, my outfit was stationed about 10 miles behind the lines so we were required to maintain our uniforms, brass and boots as if we were in the States. So, dressed in a freshly starched set of fatigues, boots polished and the Jeep freshly washed, I ventured up to the front.

"No sooner that I got there, it seemed like every sniper in the North Korean or Chinese Army was shooting at me. I mean really shooting at me personally! I ran the Jeep off the road and dove into a nearby ditch. A sergeant was there and I asked him what the

heck was going on? His answer: To them you look like someone important, maybe a general because you were so clean. Next time, make sure that you and your Jeep are appropriately mud splattered so you'll blend in. You can bet that I took that advice!" Steve said.

In August 1953, Steve's hitch was up and he returned to the States to be discharged having obtained the rank of corporal. He remained in the inactive reserves until January 1960.

In returning to civilian life, Steve returned to his printing profession. By the time he retired he had learned some 60 different machines.

He and wife, Joan, (who passed away early this year) moved to Sun City in 2004.

A Walk in Sun City Summerlin



However, some things make, what should be a pleasant outing, an experience filled with irritations and even dangers. Many of these things are the result of negligence by homeowners, drivers and even walkers themselves.

All private property that abuts Sun City sidewalks and streets is the homeowner's responsibility and must be maintained by the homeowner.

While exercising a pet, please be sure it is leashed and controlled. After all, that is the law. Many Sun City residents

adore their four-legged companions, however, not all walkers share that same love of animals. Encountering a walker and his/her pet should be a pleasant experience, not one of fear or discomfort.


A further walking danger is inattentive automobile drivers. Walkers, all too frequently, encounter drivers who ignore stop signs and turn into an intersection while people are visibly in the cross walk. And when entering or exiting garages, many drivers neglect to check to determine if walkers might be passing by.

On the flip side, to ensure their own safety, walkers who enjoy strolls at sunrise and sunset might want to consider wearing light-colored and/or reflective clothing. Often, drivers and cyclists when encountering walkers during those times are unable to see walkers clearly. This is especially true of those who walk in the street. Meet the New **Watch Commanders**

atch Commanders are the daily managers of Security Patrol. They serve twelve-hour shifts and are responsible for smooth operation of three shifts of dispatchers, drivers and information centers. Watch Commanders respond to neighbors who ask for assistance with personal and security concerns, and reports involving Sun City properties. They respond to accidents in Sun City that are reported to the Base and remain on site until first responders come on the scene. It is guite a job!

Watch Commander candidates are approved by the Security Patrol Board of Directors, They are required to be trained as dispatchers and drivers. For example, if a candidate is not a dispatcher, he/she must complete the dispatcher training program prior to Watch Commander training.

Four experienced Security Patrol volunteers, Mel Chaloupka, Steve Douglas, Massoud Modarres and Bob Newton have completed their Watch Commander training and are on the job.

In a retirement community - a reward for years of hard work - why would anyone volunteer to stand twelve hours and assume responsibilities reminiscent of their careers? The answer, because they care about the community in which they reside.

"There is a need in Security Patrol for Watch Commanders. My training as a dispatcher and driver seemed a continuation to becoming a Watch Commander - a natural progres-

> sion," responded Steve Douglas to the question "Why?" He continued, "I'm willing to accept the additional responsibilities that come with the job. I bring thirty-three years of experience as a first responder."

Massoud Modarres responded to the question with "Security Patrol brings safety, security and peace of mind to the residents. A reassurance that we can help. It is good feeling in Sun City, and I'd like to "pay back. Communication skills are important since we deal with a larger portion of Sun City residents in

their specific situations." Massoud also drives a regular shift and is available for emergency fill-in if a scheduled driver is unable to work.

"Being a Watch Commander is more challenging, and I have experience in the field," said Mel Chaloupka, who is also serves as a dispatcher. "As a navy pilot for over twenty years, I have respect for procedures, leadership and, also, how to follow a leader. As Watch Commanders, we provide guidance to the Chief, dispatchers, and drivers."

"It is an expansion of responsibilities," responded Bob Newton to the "Why?" question. "A Watch Commander must be a leader, but he/she must learn to lead him/herself first," he continued. "I know how to work with people as a supervisor, communicate problems to the appropriate person and how to solve problems."

Steve Douglas reflected on the training. "There is an emphasis on decision making, record keeping, support to all disciplines, and support for the volunteers."

Modarres and Newton agreed that attention to schedules and reading the dispatcher and watch commander daily logs were essential to doing their job. The daily logs identify possible on-going problems as well as provide information on how dispatchers resolved issues on their shifts. Mel Chaloupka reflected that the training was more like an intern-

ship with candidates shadowing Watch Commanders as they went about their duties.

"We communicate with a larger Sun City community," reported Massoud. Watch Commanders make welcome home phone calls to residents who have returned and registered for a house check. Additionally, they interact with neighbors when a call comes in regarding the well-being of a neighbor.

Security Patrol is proud of our new Watch Commanders. They are on the job monitoring the activity of Sun City and helping to provide a peace of mind to all who live here. Security Patrol always needs volunteers. Please call 702-254-2303 and a dispatcher will get you started.






Failing to plan, is planning to fail. The threat of enhanced Medicaid recovery is real.

SITUATION: We met with a daughter whose parents had been divorced. Both had paid off their individual homes. Mom had some asset protection planning in place and passed away without having to use her Medicaid assistance. Dad had a simple estate plan in place, and had been declared incompetent because of dementia, but was otherwise in superb health. SOLUTION: We met with Dad, and suggested the family get him formally tested by a doctor, and it turned out he was competent enough for us to get better Durable Powers of Attorney and advanced Elder Law planning in place. The end result was \$320K would now be protected and not available for Medicaid "recovery". When the time comes for Dad to move into a skilled nursing facility, the cost of care could be covered by Medicaid assistance. The funds from the sale of both homes would be safe from Medicaid. The daughter and her Dad now have their assets and funds protected.

WHAT IS IMPERATIVE TO UNDERSTAND: Had the daughter not gone to an Elder Law Attorney, Dad's assets and funds would HAVE been used FIRST before Medicaid kicked in. He would only have about \$2K in assets left.




