## Understanding the Difference Between the Master and Sub-Associations

This month I will forgo a discussion on one of our committees and instead discuss our sub-associations.

Each and every month I get questions, comments and complaints that relate to one of the 39 sub-associations located in SCSCAI. A fair number of the folks living in a sub-association do not really understand the differences between what I will call the Master (SCSCAI) and their sub-association (Sub).

You can think of each Sub as a small HOA that must meet the same legal requirements of NRS116 (Nevada Revised Statute) as does the Master. That means the Sub must have a budget, elected officers that meet at noticed meetings where all Board business takes place in open session (except for very limited subjects that can be decided in executive session), a reserve study that contains the capital requirements of the Sub, insurance, votes by the Board, recorded minutes of meetings available for you to read and so on — all the same things that the Master does pertaining to how the HOA is governed.

One of the differences between the Master and the Subs is that the Subs are typically responsible for maintaining basically everything outside the interior walls of the home, including groundskeeping, the roofs, painting the outside of each home when needed and the repair of the driveway or sidewalk. Just as the Master has its own set of governing documents detailing such things as use of the tennis courts and swimming pools, Subs may have some specific requirements that pertain only to the residents of the Sub. The Master assesses each homeowner for the maintenance and operation of SCSCAI common properties and each Sub separately assesses its residents for the maintenance of the Sub common areas. Most Subs have contracted with a maintenance company to maintain the Sub's common area property, while the Master has internal staff to maintain the SCSCAI common areas.

When you bought your home, you were given a set of SCSCAI governing documents, as well as the governing documents associated with your Sub. When you have an issue with your Sub, such as the maintenance of your landscape, you need to call the company your Sub has set up as the procedure to get a common area issue resolved. It does no good to call SCSCAI. The Master cannot fix your issue; indeed, it would not be legal for the Master to do so unless it is a documented health and safety issue.

Call your Sub Board if you are frustrated.

Each Sub must follow the requirements of the Master governing documents. If the Master says houses can only be 10 different colors, the Sub can make it more restrictive and say it will only paint four of those colors. Where the Master can get involved with a Sub issue is when a property is not maintained in accordance with the Master's governing documents. After trying to resolve the issue with your Sub Board with no success and the issue pertains to the development standards, you can file a formal complaint with the Master and SCSCAI will work with the Sub to resolve the issue. But please, please work with the Sub first to resolve the issue.

I hope this helps you understand the differences between the Master and the Subs. For a listing of the Subs operating in Sun City, turn to the directory on Page 81. If you live in a sub-association, just as we recommend for the Master, get involved. Go to your Board meetings, run for office. Help keep Sun City Summerlin the wonderful community it is that we all enjoy.

Nevada Senior Games Comes to Sun City

un City Summerlin welcomes Nevada Senior Games competition next month, October 3-5, to Desert Vista as players position themselves to give it their all in Pickleball.

If you're looking to enter, the registration deadline is September 22. Registration is available online at nevadaseniorgames.com, or call Sun City Pickleball President Augie Costanzo, 702-301-2183. The cost to register is \$40 for Nevada state residents; \$45 for out-of-state residents. According to Augie, nearly 200 players are expected to participate in the tournament. Last year, the NSG Pickleball Tournament welcomed 170 players.

Competition is arranged by age group, in four-year spans from age 50-54 to 85-89, and then anyone above age 90. Play will be divided among men's and women's singles and doubles, and mixed doubles. As is familiar in Olympic-style competition, medals will be awarded to winners in each category for first through third places in the form of gold, silver and bronze medals.

"Sun City is excited to welcome Nevada Senior Games to its home courts, which were selected because of their top-quality and first-rate support facilities," Augie said. "We look forward to showing athletes and their guests what a great place Sun City is. We'll be set up to accommodate lots of spectator seating as we can use up to 18 courts for play, and that means lots of family and friends coming to see their love ones."

In all, Augie said there will be at least 50 Sun City residents vying for medals over the three-day weekend.

Currently in its 39th year, the Nevada Senior Games' mission is to promote healthy, active lifestyles for seniors.

So, mark your calendar to attend the opening ceremony on Thursday, Oct. 3, at 8:45 a.m. There will be a formal welcome, followed by the National Anthem. After that, Augie said, "This thing will be live! Every night after play, scores, rankings, news updates, photos and more will be uploaded to Pickleballtournaments.com. People will be coming from all over to see the Games – from California, Utah, Canada and more. It will be great way to get the word out about Sun City and all that we offer here, along with the spectacle and tradition people have come to expect from the Senior Games.



## **Inspecting Common Area Walls**

embers of the Common Area Properties Committee convened their monthly meeting on August 6 after taking July off. Working their way through a packed agenda, CAP Chairman Bruce Alitt asked one of the Committee's newest volunteers, Dave Bacchetti, to explain how he planned to attack his assignment: To inspect all of the community's common area walls for damage and decay, and then report said problems to Sun City's Maintenance Department for repair.

According to Dave, common area walls are defined as developer-installed perimeter walls and developer-installed retaining walls. In both cases, SCSCAI is responsible for the street sides of the walls.

Perimeter walls line the main streets (Rampart, Lake Mead, Thomas Ryan, Sun City, Del Webb and Anazasi boulevards, Cheyenne Avenue, Interstate 215 and Summerlin Parkway. The perimeter walls are constructed of masonry and stucco, and in most cases, are identified by a brown paint stripe recessed in the walls. Retaining walls are used to terrace residential lots that are on the sides of hills. Retaining walls are constructed of masonry blocks.

When asked to explain his plan, Dave referred to his written outline, saying, "Inspections will be based on three criteria of walls: Perimeter, retaining and golf/green space areas."

Due to the number of walls, estimated to cover 31 miles, Dave added, "Inspections will be conducted in four phases. Perimeter walls will be visually inspected from golf carts or walking tours. Retaining walls will be inspected by touring all the streets in the community, with inspections limited to walls facing the streets. Golf course/green space inspections will be carried out by golf cart tours and will require an escort due to traffic. Faults expected to be found include water seepage (most common), stucco delamination and general damage."

Following the inspections, visual markers, such as small flags, will be used to indicate the site of each fault. Photos will be taken and a work order will be created in SCSCAI's Maintenance Department database.

"When we determined that our various walls that are the responsibility of SCSCAI were not being routinely inspected, it was determined that a new CAP inspection group was needed," Bruce said. "Dave had just contacted me looking for an opportunity to help. The fit was perfect, and Dave is off to a great start. He will be working closely with our maintenance department on this very important new part of our committee."



Smoke Alarm Project Off to a Great Start

he community-wide Smoke Alarm Replacement Program, orgaized by the Neighborhood Preparedness Team, Sun City Summerlin Charities/Volunteers and Las Vegas Fire & Rescue, started off without a hitch on August 17 as firefighters, electrical workers and resident volunteers assembled to work through a list of 45 homes that had been scheduled for the day.

Three teams, each with 15 home assignments, departed the Pinnacle's home base around 7:30 a.m. Each home installation was expected to take about 30 minutes to complete as electricians who donated their time to participate in the event would install two smoke alarms (for a two-bedroom home) and three alarms (for a three-bedroom home), in addition to one combination smoke alarm/carbon monoxide detector, bringing the totals to three and four alarms, respectively. The number of installed alarms was determined by Fire & Rescue officials to meet the minimum fire code.

On this first day, Mojave Electric of Las Vegas was the designated company to work the event. Also, as part of the program, residents got a chance to meet with a city fire inspector who educated them on fire safety and helped them create a fire escape plan.


According to Barbara Holden, NPT leader, "Fire & Rescue approached Sun City Summerlin for this special opportunity to partner on the Smoke Alarm Project because we are a large HOA with infrastructure and a community organization such as Neighborhood Preparedness Team to field volunteers. Sun City's participation is intended to help develop a prototype program that can be refined and taken to other communities in the Valley. There is significant effort in the development phase and proving the concept. The initial boots-on-the-ground campaign would be difficult for a working community to support, but an adult community with retired professionals and emergency management efforts in place lends itself well to the partnership."

The next Town Hall meeting, where residents are able to learn more about the program, and sign up and pay for the installations, is scheduled for Monday, September 23, 7 p.m., at Desert Vista. This notice serves as a reminder to those residents who are already RSVP'd and have a ticket for entry into the event. Only residents with tickets will be allowed into the September Town Hall. Don't worry if you are not yet registered as the program will continue in 2020 with an even better process to handle the installations.




## Palm Valley Comes Alive After 2-Year Project

## **IRVING BONN: FOR KEEPING B-25 BOMBERS IN TIP-TOP SHAPE**

n 1944, there were nearly 11.5 million Americans in the armed forces. Of that total, approximately 3 million servicemen and women never left the United States. An equal number, 39 percent, fell into each of the following categories: They volunteered as opposed to being drafted, were enlisted as opposed to being officers and served in non-combat roles. Irving Bonn from Chicago, and currently of Sun City, fell into all three categories.

Born at the tail end of 1925, Irv and his twin brother Leon couldn't wait to join the service. Parental approval was out of the question


1945," Irv said.

"I was discharged in New Mexico. Myself and three friends chipped in to buy a 1937 Packard and headed for California. We didn't make it. The car died before we even left New Mexico. One of my friends was a mechanic, but the best he could do was to get it running on four cylinders. We limped into Las Cruces, sold the car and boarded a bus to Los Angeles."

Irv's civilian career was fairly typical of the period. He used his GI bill to attend Los Angeles College, built upon the plumbing











and you had to be 18 to enlist. One month after achieving that milestone, the brothers presented themselves at the local Army Air Force recruiting station and signed up. That was January 1944 and no one thought the war was going to end any time soon.

The brothers were sent to Shepherd Field outside of Wichita Falls, Texas, for basic training. After basic, Irv remained at Shepherd Field for training as an aviation mechanic specializing in the B-25 Mitchell medium range, twin-engine bomber. The B-25 gained fame in April, 1942, when Lt. Colonel Jimmy Doolittle used a flight of B-25s to bomb Tokyo.

For the remainder of 1944 and early 1945, Irv performed maintenance and repairs on the bombers.


"In 1945, I qualified for training as a bombardier and was sent to the University of Tulsa in Oklahoma for schooling, but before the course was completed the war ended. So, I went back to Shepherd Field and stayed there until I was discharged on November 2, and electrical skills he learned in the service, had a career as a commercial restaurant designer, married and had children.

In December 1993, he and wife, Willyne, moved into their newly built Sun City home.

Some of his more memorable military-related events occurred while living in Sun City. In 2013, Irv was honored to be selected as part of the first Honor Flight-Nevada.

"Senator (Dean) Heller came to the airport to see us off and, of course, we got letters from Senator (Harry) Reid and other politicians, but the best part was all the letters we got, addressed to us personally, from elementary students across the country. I have a two-binder scrap book of that trip," Irv said.

"And, almost as good, when I go out these days wearing my World War II veteran hat are the ladies who come up to me with a kiss on the cheek and say thank you. In fact, quite often someone insists on picking up my restaurant check," he said with a smile.



## Security 702-254-2303 SECURITY PATROL

## Come for a Ride-along and See What We Do!

et's say you have four hours in the week not calendared in your retirement plan. And, let's say you are curious about the Security Patrol cars driving in your neighborhood. Maybe you're curious about the entire organization – the how, what and why of the Patrol.

Security Patrol's ride-along policy is just the experience to satisfy your curiosity. Here's how it works:

All residents are invited to spend time with a driver, a dispatcher and/or an information center volunteer.

This writer signed up for the ride-along. Head Driver Norm Cohen met me at Security Patrol's base located at the end of the Desert Vista parking lot next to the Pickleball courts. He gave me a form to check off my request for a drive lasting one, two or four hours where I would observe the driver performing the duties required for the 0800 shift. Then I signed a waiver of liability for personal property damage or loss required by the Association.

Next were introductions to the watch commander, dispatcher and drivers on the shift, and a brief tour of the facility. Vacation house checks requested by residents are conducted on the 0800 shift. The dispatcher assigned patrol areas to the drivers along with the clip board holding the house checks in each area and a radio to communicate with the dispatcher.

Norm explained the car check that's required at the beginning of each shift. Inside the trunk were items for emergencies and a dog leash. We even took extra bottles of water for

> residents who might be experiencing difficulties while walking or running in the heat. Each driver did a radio

check on the car and handheld radios. The dispatcher acknowledged with a 10-4. It's another lan-

guage, but easy to learn.

During the next four hours, I observed the duties performed by Norm, including the hourly radio checks between the dispatcher and each driver and the volunteers at the Information gatehouses. Around 10:30 a.m. the dispatcher radioed that a neighbor had called

in a concern about a man going door to door in her neighborhood appearing to be looking at

each front door. The neighborhood was in our assigned area and we drove to investigate. We found the man and Norm asked him if we could be of any help and what he was doing in the neighborhood. The man replied that he was checking the address lights over the garage door. If they were out, he went to the front door and told the resident that he could change out the light for a fee. He showed Norm his licenses and permits. Since all was in order, Norm wished him a good day and told him that he could not solicit after nightfall.

The ride-along was an informative experience that I highly recommend to all new residents. Joining Security Patrol is a meaningful way to fill that activity blank in your calendar.

## Precautions In Place to **Prevent Hacking**

ood day to all our Sun City Summerlin residents. For the Information Technology Committee report this month I will highlight some of the ongoing or recently completed projects.

> The last few months we worked with our new computer support vendor, Information Technology Services (ITS), helping them learn our systems and us learning their per-

sonnel and processes. I'm pretty sure you have read the newspaper articles about the theft of user personal information from business computers. We are working with ITS, examining our network topology, firewalls, switches and all other vulnerable spots to minimize the possibility of someone stealing our data files. You can never be 100 percent safe, but we can take reason-




able precautions to prevent the hacking of our systems.

Because Microsoft intends to terminate support for Windows System 7 at the end of 2019, included in this year's budget is funding to upgrade any necessary personal computers to System 10. Along with an operating system upgrade, some PCs will be replaced.

We installed one more of the information displays at Pinnacle. The displays are a great way to get a quick overview of what is happening in SCSCAI.

A very big project that we will soon kick off is the migration from Microsoft Office to Microsoft Office 365. One of the biggest gains from going to Office 365 "on the Cloud" is that our office users will be able to access their Office applications from anywhere, and the new applications greatly simplify our support requirements.

As the last item, we were getting a lot of spam – the email junk, not the food, on our systems so we installed an anti-spam solution to cut down on those annoying and unwanted emails.

## Board of Directors

### August 13, 2019 meeting

- 1. 1.1.The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the August 13, 2019 Board of Directors Agenda as presented.
- 2. The Board of Directors approved a motion with 6 members approving and Mr. Sokolski abstaining because he was not in attendance at the July 9, 2019 meeting to accept the minutes of the July 9, 2019 Board of Directors Meeting.
- 3. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the Financial Statement for the month ending May 31, 2019 subject to audit, and to acknowledge that pursuant to NRS 116.31083 (7) the Board of Directors has received and reviewed the financial information as required and accepts the reports subject to audit.
- 4. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the Financial Statement for the month ending June 30, 2019 subject to audit, and to acknowledge that pursuant to NRS 116.31083 (7) the Board of Directors has received and reviewed the financial information as required and accepts the reports subject to audit.

Prior to this point in the meeting 7 Board members were present, Mr. Akers joined by telephone and was present through the rest of the meeting.

The Board of Directors approved a motion to accept for the purpose of putting the issue of Cumulative Voting to a vote of the Owners, to amend the Sun City Summerlin, Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions, Assessments, Charges, Servitudes, Liens, Reservations and Easements (Declaration) to change Article VI-Memberships and Voting – Section 6 – Cumulative Voting for Board Members to remove cumulative voting and state that in any election of members of the Board, every Owner of a Membership entitled to vote at such election shall have the number of votes for each Membership equal to the number of Directors to be elected. Each Member shall have the right to cast one vote per candidate up to total number of Directors to be elected. The candidates receiving the highest number of votes, up to the number of the to be elected, shall be deemed elected –and – pursuant to Article XVII, Section 2 of the Declaration that this proposed amendment be put to a vote of Members requiring the approval of 67% or more of the total voting power of the Association and pursuant to NRS 116.2117 which states the requirements for amending the Declaration, including among other things notification and recording of the amendment if passed. If

- approved by the Membership the effective date would be February 27, 2020. Motion passed with seven Board Members voting in favor and one abstention, Mr. Resnik.
- The Board of Directors approved a motion to amend the Sun City Summerlin, Master Bylaws - Article V -Board of Directors - Section 5.3 - Term of Office - to add the wording; a board member may not serve more than 2 consecutive three year terms, and there must be at least 12 consecutive months between the end of the last three year term and re-election or appointment to the executive board. If a Board member is appointed to fill a vacancy until the next scheduled Board of Director's election, the time served as an appointed member of the Board does not count toward the term limitation. Re-election to the Board is based on the day the term would start if elected, not the date the election process starts - and - pursuant to Article XI, Section 11.1 of the Bylaws that this proposed amendment be put to a vote of Members requiring the affirmative written ballot vote of a majority of those voting as long as there is a guorum of members of the Association voting and Article IV – Section 4.2 (d) which requires that an amendment to the Sun City Bylaws or CC&Rs/Master Declaration be done by a mailed ballot vote. If approved by the Membership the effective date would be February 27, 2020. Motion passed with six Board Members voting in favor, and two opposed, Mr. Resnik and Mr. Akers.
- The Board of Directors approved a motion to adopt the NRS 116.31034 (5) procedure for the 2020 Board Election that states; if, at the closing of the prescribed period for nominations for membership on the executive board, the number of candidates nominated for membership on the executive board is equal to or less than the number of members to be elected to the executive board at the election, then: (a) the association will not prepare or mail any ballots to unit owners and (b) the nominated candidates shall be deemed to be duly elected to the executive board at the meeting of the unit's owners at which the ballots would have been counted. This determination will be disclosed as part of the notice given to each unit's owner of the unit's owners eligibility to serve as a member of the executive board. Motion passed with seven Board Members voting in favor and one opposed, Mr. Akers.
- 8. The Board of Directors approved a motion to accept the "New Proposed Ballot Counting Double Envelope" flow chart dated July 29, 2019 rev 3.4 and written process dated July 29, 2019 rev. 1.4 as the updated process for pro-

- cessing of ballots for the elections. Motion passed with seven Board Members voting in favor and one opposed, Mr. Akers.
- 9. The Board of Directors approved a motion to accept the allocation of additional funds in an amount not to exceed \$21,500 to facilitate the proposed changes to the election procedures as follows; the ballot, prepaid postage return envelope, candidate statements and candidate disclosures will no longer be distributed as part of the Link Magazine and instead will be a separate mailing, sent first class US mail to each Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc. owner of record at their address on file with the Association. Motion passed with seven Board Members voting in favor and one opposed, Mr. Akers.
- 10. The Board of Directors approved a motion to accept the proposed changes to the Sun City Summerlin Community Association Election Policy as submitted with seven Board Members voting in favor and one opposed, Mr. Akers.
- 11. The Board of Directors made a motion to adopt a policy that in order to comply with NRS116.31034 (16) and NRS116.31035(1) that during a candidate's campaigning for election to become a member of the executive board they cannot place paid ads in the Link Magazine or on any Sun City Summerlin Community Association Websites. The motion failed with four Board Members voting in favor; and four opposed, Mr. Resnik, Ms. Holden, Mr. Akers and Mr. Sokolski.
- 12. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to install surveillance cameras, including a license plate reader at Highland Falls parking lot as soon as possible at a price not to exceed \$12,000.00. This is an emergency request based on fact that cars are being broken into at our common area parking lots, with Highland Falls having the most break ins.
- 13. The Board of Directors approved a motion granting an Age Variance for Jay and Ann Swanson with six Board Members voting in favor and two opposed, Mr. Alitt and Mr. Akers.
- 14. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion granting an Age Variance for Robin Embree.
- 15. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to ratify a Reserve expenditure for replacement Irrigation Heads in the amount of \$9,294.14 for Highland Falls. This expense is budgeted in the 2019/2020 Reserve Fund Budget in the amount of \$10,000.
- 16. The Board of Directors approved a motion to ratify a New Asset expenditure 40 Thousand Sq. Ft of sod for Collars

- for Palm Valley Irrigation Project Phase II (Back 9). in the amount of \$27,184.00 with seven Board Members voting in favor and one abstention, Mr. Alitt. This is part of the amount budgeted in the 2019/2020 New Asset Budget for sod for the Palm Valley Irrigation Project in the amount of \$275,000.
- 17. The Board of Directors approved a motion to ratify a New Asset expenditure 150 Thousand Sq. Ft of sod for Palm Valley Irrigation Project Phase II (Back 9) in the amount of \$98,940.00 with seven Board Members voting in favor and one abstention, Mr. Alitt. This is part of the amount budgeted in the 2019/2020 New Asset Budget for sod for the Palm Valley Irrigation Project in the amount of \$275,000.
- 18. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the 2020 Board of Directors Meeting Schedule as amended.
- 19. The Board of Directors approved a motion to ratify an emergency Reserve expenditure in the amount of \$3,943.00 to replace the existing A/C unit in the Mountain Shadows Administration Office. Air Conditioner replacement is budgeted at \$60,000.00 per year, since it is impossible to predict the exact air conditioner that will fail and when it will fail, instead a reasonable annual budget is established. The vote was 7-0. Mr. Akers was not present for this vote.
- 20. The Board of Directors approved a motion to ratify an emergency expenditure in the amount of \$1,001.92 to replace the Upblast Ventilator in the Mountain Shadows Pool Chemical Storage area. This expense is not budgeted. The vote was 7-0. Mr. Akers was not present for this vote.
- 21. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to ratify an emergency Reserve expenditure in the amount of \$6,603.91 to replace the existing A/C unit in the Desert Vista Fitness Center Exercise Room. Air Conditioner replacement is budgeted at \$60,000.00 per year, since it is impossible to predict the exact air conditioner that will fail and when it will fail, instead a reasonable annual budget is established.
- 22. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the proposal from American Pavement Preservation in the amount of \$10,917.48 to widen the driveway at Highland Falls parking lot dated July 8, 2019. The work is to be done while Highland Falls Golf Course and Restaurant are closed for over-seeding. This is a budgeted Reserve Item expense in the amount of \$15,000.
- 23. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to adjourn the Board of Directors meeting at 11:18 AM.

### **Concrete Coating**

At the December 12, 2018, meeting of Sun City Summerlin's Board of Directors, the Board unanimously approved a motion to accept the recommendation of the ARC at its November 8, 2018, committee meeting to amend Article III, Section 6, of the Development Standards. This change will be effective October 5, 2019. The amendment with the changes marked reads as follows:

Color Concrete Coatings – Color concrete coatings and stains of concrete driveways, patios and walkways must have prior written approval of the ARC. Only earth tone colors will be considered for approval. The color of the concrete coatings and stains must be from the approved color palette for homes. However, the color palette that has been approved for front doors is not approved for concrete coatings and stains. Color and texture samples must be provided with the application for approval. Sidewalks and driveway aprons in the public right-of-way may not be color-coated or altered from original concrete texture.

The clean version reads as follows:

Color concrete coatings and stains of concrete driveways, patios and walkways must have prior written approval of the ARC. The color of the concrete coatings and stains must be from the approved color palette for homes. However, the color palette that has been approved for front doors is not approved for concrete coatings and stains. Color and texture samples must be provided with the application for approval. Sidewalks and driveway aprons in the public right-of-way may not be color-coated or altered from original concrete texture.
