# Now Is a Great Time to Join a Committee

n previous Link months we have discussed one of our great standing committees that do so much to make Sun City Summerlin such a great place to live. For this month, let's take a general look at our 11 standing committees: Architectural Review, Deed Restriction Hearing, Finance, Common Area Properties, Clubs and Community Organization, Golf Oversight, Legal Services, Neighborhood Watch/Community Preparedness, Fitness, Election and Information Technology. The detailed charter for each committee is defined in the SCSCAI Bylaws, available online at the Suncitysummerlin.com, at "Administration," then "Resource Center" and "Governing Documents."

The charter of each committee is pretty much explained by its title, but two might need some explanation.

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) enforces Sun City's development standards, such things as house paint colors, landscaping and upkeep of properties, as well as processing, along with Community Standards, applications for landscape changes and other property changes. The ARC is the only committee mandated by the SCSCAI CC&Rs/Master Declaration.

The other committee name that might be confusing is the Deed Restriction Hearing Committee (DHRC). DHRC is responsible for determining what sanctions should be imposed when the development standards are not followed. Again, read our bylaws for more details on each committee.

Each committee has an SCSCAI Board member chairperson appointed by the President of the SCSCAI Board of Directors with the advice and consent of the Board. Each chairperson then selects the members of their committee. And, of course, there are exceptions. ARC members must be approved by the SCSCAI Board. The other exception to the process is that the Election Committee cannot be chaired by a Board member (potential conflict of interest) so the Board President, with Board consent, selects a non-Board member as the chairman/woman, who then selects his/her committee members.

I cannot say enough good words for the work done by our committees. The committees provide many hours of staff work (unpaid!), providing the Board of Directors and our Executive Director with information needed to make decisions on what to buy, color of furniture, assessment of legal issues, investment of our funds, budget assessment and so on. Without question, SCSCAI would not be the great place to live in without our committee members. Many, if not most, decisions made by the SCSCAI Board of Directors reflect a recommendation made by one of our committees.

So, who is on our committees? Glad you asked.

Our committees are staffed by your fellow owners, volunteers who have a vested interest and applicable skills in maintaining our community. As discussed above, in most cases, the committee chair selects committee members. Being a member of one of the SCSCAI standing committees is a very rewarding experience. Not only do you learn a lot about what goes on in SCSCAI, you also will help make our community an even better place to live. And, you will meet some great fellow residents. Many committees discuss their monthly activities in the Link, and the Link calendar on page 44 includes the committee schedules. Give some of your time and talent to SCSCAI by attending a committee meeting that attracts your interest and skills to get a feel for what that committee does. Then call the committee chair and discuss your interest in their committee. Page six of the Link includes the name of each Board member and what committee they chair.



hen you hear the term Lions Club, what is the first thing that comes to mind? If you said "Knights of the Blind" or anything associated with eyesight you would not have been wrong. But you would not have been 100 percent correct, either. While it is true that a major thrust of the Lions Club International has been helping both the blind and people with impaired vision, the Lions predates that mission and was founded in 1917 with a mission to address social problems created by World War I.

In 2016, as part of its 2017 100th anniversary mission review, a new mission was added:

Support for people with diabetes, a worldwide problem. Among those lobbying the international board were Sun City resident members of the Summerlin Lions Club. And prominent among that group was Donna Cutler.

Donna has been a Lion since 1996 when she joined the Los Feliz, Calif., Club. She moved to Las Vegas in 2003 and immediately joined the Summerlin Lions where she served as president in 2009 and 2010. After moving to Sun City in 2012, Donna, joined by other Sun City and Summerlin residents, began expanding the vision to include diabetes support and prevention. In September 2016, coincident with the international board's adoption of diabetes as a mission, a group of Summerlin Lions members split off to form the Las Vegas Diabetes Wellness Lions

club to focus on diabetes.

As with any new organization, it takes time to really get in motion. Eighteen months after founding, the Club held its first fundraiser and selected its first area of support: diabetic children. In conjunction with Downtown Summerlin merchants, the Club held its first poker run in October 2018. The funds raised were used to send a child to one of the five camps the Nevada Diabetes Association runs specifically for children with Type 1 diabetes. In October 2019, the Club ran its second poker run and raised enough money to send three children to camp.

NTERNATIONA

The Club has broadened its efforts and, in addition to the fundraisers for children, now

include diabetic outreach programs, including the very important foot screenings for the homeless, veterans and at Desert Springs Hospital. Many of these events are scheduled in conjunction with other local Lions clubs so that sight and diabetes screening are done in parallel.

"There are opportunities to do more and we invite Sun City residents to join us in these worthwhile programs. It's an opportunity to make life in Las Vegas a little better, one small step at a time, Debra said.

The Las Vegas Diabetes Wellness Lions Club meets every second and fourth Wednesday at McGoo's, 7360 W. Cheyenne Ave. Meetings start at 6 p.m. followed by dinner at 6:30 p.m.

"Please join us," Donna said.

# 2020 Board of Directors Candidates Announced

he SCSCAI Election Committee is pleased to announce that 11 candidates are vying for five open seats on the Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., Board of Directors. The candidates have submitted their names and meet the qualification of being a unit owner, a member in good standing and have stated they have no professional or personal relationship that would result or would appear to a reasonable person to result in a conflict of interest if elected to serve as a member of the Board.

As Sun City Summerlin is in the final year of a three-year transition from two-year to three-year Board terms, this year the top three vote recipients will be elected to three year terms with the next two highest vote recipients receiving one-year terms. Each voter has five (5) votes (one for each vacancy) and may distribute the votes among the candidates or give all votes to one candidate. The Residents' Forum will move to a new location this month at The Summit, starting at 6 p.m. Following an hour-long meet-and-greet, all 11 candidates will move to the Starbright Theatre where they will introduce themselves and answer homeowner questions.

Candidate statements of interest, prepared by the candidates themselves, and photographs appear beginning on Page 11 of this issue of the Link. Candidates will participate in the Residents' Forum Meet the Candidates event on Wednesday, January 8. There will be a meet-and-greet at The Summit Restaurant, beginning at 6 p.m., followed by brief statements and a question-and-answer session held in the Starbright Theatre, beginning at 7 p.m. Long-time Sun City residents, please note the change in location from previous sessions.

The 2020 election process has been revised in that ballots will be mailed to each homeowner as a separate and discrete mailing. Keep your eyes open for a large white envelope with "Election Committee" in the return address. The envelope will have stamped in red "Sun City Summerlin Election Material Enclosed, Time Sensitive." The ballot package should arrive toward the end of January. It will contain an election ballot, a ballot of proposed changes to community rules, as well as background material on all issues. All ballots must be received at Mountain Shadows by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, February 25. Ballots will be counted at the annual membership meeting on Wednesday, February 26, with elected candidates announced upon counting completion.

Detailed instructions on voting will be included in the ballot package. If you do not receive a package by February 7, please contact the Administrative Office at Mountain Shadows.

We look forward to a large voter response and encourage you all to participate in the SCSCAI electoral process.

## **Changes Needed**


**Golf Courses** 

We need to maintain all three (3) of our golf courses in premier condition. This must include the proper over seeding of all courses in the fall to properly prepare for winter play. One of the key factors to the bankruptcy of Black Mountain was their failure to over seed. The result was lost revenue. We need to improve our marketing to outside play and more importantly we need to implement an aggressive marketing campaign to attract more retiring golfers to our community.

- Get Food and Beverage Operation to revenue neutral. A Sports Bar at the Summit would deliver substantial revenue.
- Review and make needed changes to our CCR documents to provide us with the organization and flexibility to make changes quickly and proactively, as opposed to reactively
- Better Marketing both local and nationwide
- Engage local realtors to drive sales
- Form a Buying Consortium for the purchase of equipment for the golf courses
- Term limits and eliminating block voting (all votes for one candidate)



# Functional Fitness: What Is It?

unctional fitness, also known as functional training or functional movement, is a major trend in the physical fitness and wellness industry. But, if you think it is just a fad, think again. Functional fitness is here to stay, and for good reason.

In life, our daily activities include lifting, bending, pushing, pulling, reaching, rotating, etc. Functional fitness trains the body to function better by combining strength, coordination and range of motion. The focus is on training to complete a particular movement, not to strengthen a particular muscle. It can prepare you for better performance in a sport/activity or for carrying out day-to-day activities in a safe, confident and pain-free manner. Functional fitness training often includes some combination of cardiovascular, strength, flexibility and balance moves.

Functional fitness "trains your muscles to work together, and prepares them for daily tasks by simulating common movements you might do at home, at work, or in sports," revealed a report authored by the Mayo Clinic.

Functional training as we know it today originated in a reha-

bilitation setting. Post-surgery or post-injury,

physical and occupational therapists developed exercises that mimicked activities their patients needed to accomplish in order to return to work or daily living. The next big wave of functional training

was high-intensity boot camps, ninja warrior-type training and Cross-Fit. Over the last several years, it has entered the mainstream for the everyday individual looking to remain fit, healthy and functional in life.

The benefits of functional training are numerous. Let's separate these into lifestyle benefits and physical benefits.

# Physical benefits:

- Helps improve muscle strength, balance, flexibility, coordination and agility.
- Improves balance and posture by making the muscles work together to accomplish a movement or task.
- Improves muscle memory. You train your body using movements that mimic daily activities, so those movements become easier and more efficient.

# Lifestyle Benefits:

• Improved quality of life. Functional training improves your ability to perform everyday activities safely and with confidence.



- Maintain Independence. By improving your strength, mobility and balance you will be able to continue to function independently without assistance or assistive devices for much longer.
- No gym required. Functional training can be performed with minimal or no equipment, which means it can be done at home, in the park, or in the gym.
- Reduced risk of injury. Because you are training your body to perform regular daily tasks and activities, you are less likely to tweak your back when picking up a suitcase or pull a muscle when golfing.

Functional exercises usually involve more than one joint and more than one muscle group. This is because when we perform tasks or activities in our daily lives, we are using multiple joints and muscles. Let's take the simple task of picking something up from the floor and putting it on a shelf. The ankles, knees and hips are involved. Lower body muscles and core muscles are involved in standing up. Shoulder, elbow and chest muscles are used to put the item on the shelf. Throughout this simple process we also incorporate balance, flexibility and agility.

Some exercises that are considered "functional" that you might be familiar with are squats, lunges, push-ups, and planks. There are many more. In next month's Link, we'll discuss more specifics on getting started with your own functional training program.



# Your Brain On Good Food

There is a great article by the Harvard Health blog that talks about the relationship between your brain, mood and food. Contributing Editor Eva Selhub, M.D., writes, "Put simply, what you eat directly affects the structure and function of your brain and, ultimately, your mood." She makes the comparison between our brain and an expensive car. A Ferrari functions best with premium fuel, just like our brain. The premium fuel for the brain is high-quality foods full of vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. Processed and sugary foods are the "low premium" foods that are detrimental to the brain and to overall health. Dr. Selhub writes, "Multiple studies have found a correlation between a diet high in refined sugars impaired brain function – and even a worsening of symptoms of mood disorders, such as depression."



The challenge becomes fighting the urge to reach for the processed and unhealthy snacks and find healthy alternatives to fuel and nourish the brain. There is a branch of psychiatry that is becoming dedicated to your brain on food, called Nutritional Psychiatry. The medical field is now acknowledging the connection between mood and food. Below are some resources on nutrition for your brain.

appy New Year Neighbors! My name is Sandy Lyons and I have the privilege of serving as Security Patrol's Chief again this year. The Board members are Jim Strom, Assistant Chief; Dorothy Macchio, Secretary; Fred Bailey, Treasurer; and Judy Foy, Personnel Director. I joined Security Patrol in 2011 to learn about my community. It has been enjoyable with a lot of experiences.

Security Patrol is on duty 24 hours a day, seven days a week. When you need us, we are a phone call away. Anytime you need to speak to me please call the base at 702-254-2303. If I am not at base, the dispatcher will find me, and I'll return your call.

Security Patrol offers "Neighbors Helping Neighors" services. For example, when a driver notices three or more newspapers on a driveway, he/she will talk to the neighbors to ask if the resident is home. If the resident

is not home, the driver will pick up the papers and put them out of sight. The dispatcher will phone the emergency contact person listed to make sure the resident is okay.

The emergency contact information is so important for your safety and well-being. If

you haven't filled out the blue Emergency Contact form, please do so. Also, there may be changes in your contact information, such as a new phone number. This information is helpful when a neighbor or family member calls the base concerned that a resident hasn't answered their phone for a couple of days.

Some of the other services performed by Security Patrol are:

- Contacting the resident when a driver sees a water leak while patrolling the neighborhoods.
- When a resident calls the base concerned about a suspicious vehicle, we make sure to check it out.
- Drivers perform house checks when a resident is on a trip, which gives the resident peace of mind that their property is being monitored.

Join us. We would love to have you as a member and get to know you. We are a friendly group and being a volunteer is a great way to meet new friends. I so look forward to 2020 and another great year of helping our neighbors.

# Organization is Bringing a Lot to the Community in 2020

ne of the most visible efforts undertaken by the Neighborhood Preparedness Team is the Smoke Alarm Replacement project spearheaded by Las Vegas Fire & Rescue (LVFR). We've learned that smoke alarms are not functional after 10 years; the sensors stop working. Even if the batteries are replaced and we hear the familiar "chirp, chirp, chirp," the units need to be replaced. Sun City's program replaces all units in a home for \$135. This includes steeply discounted pricing for the units, professional installation, 10-year batteries for all units, a carbon monoxide (CO) detector and personalized fire safety education from LVFR during the installation process. Applications for the program are available at the Social Monitor desks at Desert Vista, Mountain Shadows and the Pinnacle community centers.

In 2020, the NPT will host monthly educational sessions on a variety of topics relating to the safety. Sign up at the Social Monitor stations. On the schedule for the first quarter of 2020 are:

**January 13, 1 p.m., Desert Vista** – Women's Self-defense. This 90-minute, women-only class will be taught by Laura Van Dyke from the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department. Be sure to wear comfortable clothes. You will leave the session with an

increased understanding and confidence. Note that this 50-person class will probably fill up quickly. Don't worry, we will schedule more classes as the demand warrants.

**February 19**, Active Shooter Civilian Response presented by Metro. **March 5**, "Talk Saves Lives" suicide recognition and prevention. The Neighborhood Preparedness Team draws upon many Sun City resources. Our backbone is the Neighborhood Watch program, which is organized on about 85 Sun City blocks. NPT partners with and has members who work with the volunteers of Security

Patrol. The Ham Radio Club is another part of the team. Some NPT members bring decades of experience in various fields that strengthen our group. Members are from military, law enforcement, FEMA, fire service and professional safety backgrounds. But most are residents who simply want to help keep Sun City Summerlin the safest place to live in all of Nevada. The key attributes of our members are caring and enthusiasm. If this describes you, consider becoming part of the Team. NPT meets the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 9 a.m. at Desert Vista. We can be reached at neighborhoodwatch@suncitylv.com.
