

everyone, *stay hydrated*. Summer activities are in full swing. The pools are in constant use and residents are trying to keep cool. Golfers are trying for early morning tee times and the walkers are out before daybreak and after sundown. Remember to carry extra water when you are out and about. Keep an eye out for your neighbors that might become affected by the heat. If we watch out for each other, it will be a safer summer.

August is Security Patrol Month. You may notice some additional articles in this month's Link about Security Patrol. Once again, Security Patrol is made up of all volunteers. They are your friends and neighbors. They want to give something back to this great community that we all live in and enjoy. Security Patrol is a major deterrent to crime in our community. It is first on the scene to many incidents in the community and although they **do not confront** anyone they certainly get the attention when they drive up with the flashers flashing. Once again when asked Summerlin Command stated to us that Sun City Summerlin is the safest community in the valley. The reasons are simple. We are a vigilant community. We all have gotten into the habit of "saying something if we see something". Administration, myself and Security Patrol personnel met with Summerlin Area Command recently and were very pleased to exchange much information with each other. You, the residents, should know that there are more undercover cars in our community than marked cars. Metro has determined that that is the best way to police our community.

Now might be a good time to remind everyone about some simple methods to help deter crime in our community. The single most important tool in Metro's arsenal to solve Breaking and Entering's in our community is cameras. Recently a great picture of a suspected thief was obtained from a camera on the neighbor of a victim. The Resident's camera did not capture the face of the bad guy but the neighbor's camera did. Also cameras on the block got pictures of the suspected vehicle as well. Other deterrents include but are not limited to: 1) Keeping your home well-lit both inside and outside 2) Cutting down any landscaping that obstructs a view of your doorways 3) Alarming your home. The detective that spoke with us could not think of any home in Sun City that had its alarm on and was broken into 4) Start a Neighborhood Watch program 5) Call Security Patrol if you see a strange vehicle on your street 6) Call Security Patrol if you see a strange person on your street 8) Vary your routines, do not leave home at the same time when you leave for an activity in the community 7) Drive around the block and return home every now and again when leaving your home 8) Look after your neighbor's home and maybe they will do the same for you.

Do **not** confront any thief. If you come home and find that your home has been broken into do not rush in and look to see what if anything has been

taken. Call Metro and then Security Patrol. We all know that Metro may take some time to come but we have been told that residents often contaminate the crime scene by touching or opening drawers, cupboards, etc., that might have "trace" evidence on them. Let Metro tell you when it is ok for you to check on what was

stolen and give them that list. If you take pictures of valuable items, especially jewelry, it can sometimes be helpful in locating same. Serial numbers of guns or other valuable items can also be very helpful. Let's all continue to keep our community as safe as we possibly can.

Be Safe, Be Careful, Be Vigilant, and Keep Cool.

riginally a Neil Diamond album, obviously he never lived in Vegas - 'hot' doesn't cover it. You can literally bake cookies in your car here! You run the water longer than you should just to get cold water to brush your teeth. We spend a lot of time looking into the fridge just for a cool breeze. Go outside to get the mail without shoes on? . . . not unless you want third degree burns on your feet.

Then there were the boots, the rubber boots, not the stylish ones of today, but the rubber ones that our shoes went *into*, with the glamorous name of "galoshes," kept in the cloak room and invariably got mixed up with all the others lined up! Of course, young men had the same things that only covered their shoes; neither were attractive and after school, finding the matching two that were yours was often an exercise in futility.

But when those "hot August nights" hit us, there are worse places. Not sure how or why any of us ended up here, but it's "home" and we learned to cope – most of the time. For me, having moved here years ago in the month of July, it didn't take long for my blood to thin so now, if it goes below 85°, the heater goes on in my car. We can always find something to complain about, usually things we can't change. That's human nature, sadly. So, as we face another August, keep hydrated, and above all, let us pray for rain!!! I would give anything to need an umbrella!!

ack in May, I wrote an article about the benefits of volunteering; after reviewing all the benefits I decided to volunteer for something I've been thinking about doing for a long time but just never did - Security Patrol.

My partner, Ken Caroccia, has been with the Security Patrol for almost 20 years, at least 16 of those years as Watch Commander. He told me that the Patrol lost a few good people when they left due to the COVID-19 crisis at the time, and the new volunteers didn't really want to take late night shifts. Apparently getting dispatchers for those shifts is particularly difficult. The shift he needed to cover was the 12:00 midnight to 4:00 A.M. shift (or in military/Patrol time, 0000 to 0400 hrs.)

I'm someone who is used to going to bed by 9:00 p.m. at the latest (and known to go to bed even earlier) but I tend to get up quite early. Committing to this shift even once a week might play havoc with my "beauty sleep," but I felt if a dispatcher was where they needed someone the most then that's what I would do.

Each "discipline" (Information Center or "IC," Driver or "DR" and Dispatcher or "DI") requires different training, and I learned that even as a Dispatcher I'd have to "cross-train" a little with a Driver Trainer and with an Information Center Trainer, just so I would be exposed a bit to the other disciplines.

Knowing I was going to write this article, I thought I'd keep track of my experience with each trainer that I had and then mention them in this article. Holy cow! Too many wonderful and kind people to even start listing for fear of missing someone! From my recruitment class where you are told the purpose or motto of our Patrol is "Neighbors Helping Neighbors," to learning we all work as a team and remembering we are all human as well as volunteers, to how we make a difference – it was an amazing class. Furthermore, the stats of crime in our area show that we are the safest Community in LV given our population here thanks to our Security Patrol!

Next came actual training. As a dispatcher you must ensure the safety of your drivers at all times by keeping track of them, including the Information Centers. They, in turn, are keeping track of your safety as a dispatcher. I won't go into the detail of how this is done because disclosure in a very public forum might not be a good idea.

But I can tell you that each of my trainers demonstrated their awesome skills, points of view and the "gems" of how they do the work; and all did it from a spirit of love for this Community. I feel so grateful to have been taught by what I feel were "the very best." In addition, I've learned skills that can be used in everyday life; even at my age, one is never too old to learn something that may prove invaluable down the road.

Recapping the benefits of volunteering, joining the Security Patrol has connected me to others; not just "others," but a whole bunch of caring, loving people truly dedicated to this Community. I have increased my skills (and brain power for sure!), and the Happiness Factor I spoke of in the May LINK issue, is true; you do feel pretty darn good when you're contributing.

So, once again, outside of the Security Patrol, which I chose, there are many clubs and activities like the Helping Hands or Sun City Charities that could use your help. I hope I've inspired – I'm already reaping the benefits!

# August: National Wellness Month Defining Wellness

The Global Wellness Institute defines wellness as the active pursuit of activities, choices and lifestyles that lead to a state of holistic health.

here are two important aspects to this definition. First, wellness is not a passive or static state but rather an "active pursuit" that is associated with intentions, choices, and actions as we work toward an optimal state of health and wellbeing. Second, wellness is linked to holistic health—that is, it extends beyond physical health and incorporates many different dimensions that should work in harmony.

Wellness is an individual pursuit—we have self-responsibility for our own choices, behaviors, and lifestyles—but it is also significantly influenced by the physical, social, and cultural environments in which we live.

Wellness is often confused with terms such as health, wellbeing, and happiness. While there are common elements among them, wellness is distinguished by not referring to a static state of being (i.e., being happy, in good health, or a state of wellbeing). Rather, wellness is associated with an active process of being aware and making choices that lead toward an outcome of optimal holistic health and wellbeing.

#### What Is Wellness?

Wellness is a modern word with ancient roots. The key tenets of wellness as both preventive and holistic can be traced back to ancient civilizations from the East (India, China) to the West (Greece, Rome). In 19th-century Europe and the United States, a variety of intellectual, religious, and







medical movements developed in parallel with conventional medicine. With their focus on holistic and natural approaches, self-healing and preventive care, these movements have provided a firm foundation for wellness today. Wellness-focused and holistic modalities have gained more visibility

since the 1960s/1970s. As these have evolved, proliferated, and gone mainstream, they have informed the healthy-living, self-help, self-care, fitness, nutrition, diet, and spiritual practices that have become a flourishing wellness movement in the 21st century.


## Allan and Mary Ann Clark

e took possession of our house on Palmridge Drive in November 1990. Ours was the first privately-owned house on the whole block, the rest were spec homes. There were no houses behind us, and Del Webb was just building the duplexes across the street.

Coming out here from downtown, Highway 95 was just two lanes with a turning lane. Lake Mead was partially gravel at that time. The only entrance to Sun City Summerlin was at Del Webb and Lake Mead. Rampart was not yet built. The sales pavilion was located between Echo Mesa Drive and Copperstone Drive, overlooking the golf course. There was no Crown Ridge Drive on that side of Del Webb. Later, Del Webb tore down the sales pavilion and built houses there.

Back then, the HOA Assessment was \$350 per year, per household. There were no houses of worship. Services were held in the large room at Mountain Shadows, which at that time was called the Recreation Center. There were no commercial businesses yet built in Sun City, not even Smith's.

Sun City Summerlin has come a long way and changed a lot in the last 30 plus years.

Please feel free to share this information with any golfers that you may know and if you have some friends that may question how both Golf and Food and Beverage are performing here are some numbers for you.

As you are aware both Golf and our Food and Beverage Departments are amenities, just like our Gyms, Tennis Courts, Swimming Pools, etc. One difference though is that both of these amenities generate revenue which helps offset their expenses. All other amenities (except for Community Services and the Link) are 100% funded through our annual assessment, meaning that our residents enjoy the use of these amenities for no additional charge.

Prior to Fiscal Year 2021 Golf (including the Pro Shops and Golf Course Maintenance) cost each homeowner approximately \$29 per month to bring Golf to revenue neutral. However, beginning in Fiscal 2021 and continuing this year, due to a vari-

ety of reasons, our Golf Team has delivered outstanding results. Fiscal year 2021 cost our homeowners \$15.25 a month and this year through May 2022 we are sitting at \$12.28 per month. All in through May 2022, Golf is beating their budget by \$1.6 million dollars.

We all owe a sincere thanks to our golf team. The golf courses are our single biggest asset driving property values here in Sun City Summerlin, and we all have something that we should be very proud of.

In addition, I would like to thank all of our golfers and residents that support our restaurants. This is another amenity that is supported through our annual assessment to become revenue neutral. That said through May 2022 (11 months of the fiscal year) the restaurants are also beating budget and their monthly cost to our homeowners is \$4.54. This is minimal and with just a little bit more support we can in fact cut black ink in our restaurants. I know that WE can do it.

In closing, thanks to all of you for your support. We live in a great community and it is our responsibility to keep it that way. Take the time to thank the individuals that work in Golf Operations (Pro Shops and Golf Course Maintenance) along with those that work in our restaurants for a job well done.
