

AARP Tax Aide

Sign-ups Start Monday, January 3, 2022

AARP volunteers will once again prepare your federal income tax forms for free this year. The program will run from February 10 to April 15 on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. This service will be offered in the Mint Room at Mountain Shadows from 9 a.m. to noon and 1-4 p.m. Appointments are necessary and may be made by phone or in person with the Social Monitor at Mountain Shadows. We will be using the same software as last year. You MUST bring a copy of last year's tax return, your Social Security Card and a form of picture ID. We also need any W2s, 1099R, Interest, Dividend, Social Security SSA1099, W2G, broker statements, proof of health insurance and any other receipts for your miscellaneous deductions. Please note that we will only prepare returns for electronic filing; no paper returns will be prepared. Also note that we cannot prepare state returns, rental property deductions, business, or partnership (K-1) income other than simple interest, dividends, or capital gains. For appointments only, call the Social Monitor at Mountain Shadows, 702-966-1410. Have tax guestions? Please call Mike Sanders, 702-724-0476.

Sun City Summerlin Holiday Light Contest

Deadline to enter the Holiday Light Contest is Friday, December 3 by 5:00 p.m.

Judging will take place: Tuesday, December 7, & Wednesday, December 8, between 6-9 p.m.

It's that time of year again! Start off your holiday season with a little friendly competition. Gather your lights and décor and show your holiday spirit by lighting up and decorating the outside of your home. Lights and decorations may be displayed no earlier than Thursday, November 25, 2021 and must be taken down by Thursday, January 9, 2022. All lights as well as decorations that create noise must be turned off by 9 pm each night. Any home can enter! Entry forms are available for pick up at any social monitor station. All entries must be submitted by **Friday**, **December 3**, **5 p.m.** to the Community Services Office. We apologize but no late entries will be accepted.

All entrants must illuminate their displays for judging **starting Tuesday, December 7 and ending Wednesday, December 8 from 6-9 p.m.** on these nights. If your display is not illuminated during these hours, then your entry will not be included in judging. Interview With Pam Shields




The LINK sat down in October to interview Pam Shields, Director of Health & Fitness. Pam embarked on a pilgrimage during her recent vacation to Portugal and Spain. Her destination: Santiago de Compostela by way of the Camino Portuguese. This route, dating back hundreds of years as well as many others, take pilgrims through France, Spain and Portugal.

You are just back from your vacation, and you did not do a traditional relax and upwind vacation, correct?

Correct. I went to Portugal and Spain to walk the Camino de Santiago. Historically, the Camino was a religious pilgrimage

with several routes from all parts of Europe, all ending at the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela which is where the remains of Saint James the Great are interred. While

many still walk the Camino for spiritual reasons, over the past couple of decades, it has become popular as a tourist or "bucket list" destination. My reasons for doing it were partially spiritual and because I love the outdoors and a good physical challenge.



Pam Shields, SCSCAI Health & Fitness Director I lived in England for a while when I was younger and have traveled to Europe several times but have never been to Portugal and Spain. I weighed all my options . . . I get my walk and pilgrimage and at the same time I'm seeing two countries that I had not vet visited.

Did you see the Atlantic Ocean during your walk?

Yes. There is a coastal route and a central route. I walked a day and a half on the coast. It was fabulous! The rest of the walk was through the countryside. Also, very beautiful.

Did you go with a group or by yourself?

I went by myself. The nice thing about it is there are other people walking and as you get closer to Santiago de Compostela you see more and more people with backpacks...that are doing the pilgrimage. Early on, I didn't see many others. I would walk for hours and not see another person. I was alone, but I never felt that I was out there all by myself. I speak enough Spanish to get by but Portuguese is very different. Luckily, many Portuguese speak some Spanish . . . so I was able to make my way.

Where did you stay at night?

Hostels, hotels, and in one case a home. It was a woman's home and she let pilgrims stay there for a donation. Probably 75% of the time, I stayed in hostels and then the rest of the time in small hotels. That took some planning and was a bit stressful. Each day, once I reached my destination, I would figure out how far I was going to walk the next day. I average 12-13 miles a day. But let's say I was planning to do 15 miles, I would have to see which towns were on my way, within that range. Some of those towns are so remote, they don't have places to stay over. In that case, you either have to make it a shorter or a longer day and then pick a place. In addition, you are praying that you have a good internet connection to find that place online.

Did you meet many Americans?


Lots of people, some Americans, but many more from other places in the world, of all ages. Most of the people I met had walked the Camino before and they loved the experience so much that they wanted to do it again. The ones that were doing it for the 1st time, it was more of a "bucket list" thing, not so much a spiritual thing.

So, how many days did it take you to get to Santiago de Compostela?

I walked for 23 days.

What impressed you the most during your pilgrimage? Was it the people you met, the sights, what you learned about yourself, did it change your outlook on life?

The most impactful aspect of the trip was spiritual. My Mom passed away last year in August. I took some of her ashes with me and I felt as if she were my guardian angel along the way. There is a town about a 2-hour drive from Santiago, called Finisterre. Centuries ago, it was thought that this place was the



end of the earth because it's located at the tip of Spain over-looking the Atlantic Ocean (in the province of Galicia). After completing my 300+ mile walk to Santiago, I went to Finisterre and scattered her ashes in the ocean. That stands out for me as the BEST experience of my pilgrimage.

Outside of the spiritual piece . . . it's the people I met. You meet so many different people and everyone gets up and heads out in the morning and maybe in the next town, you see them again and maybe they are staying in the same hostel, and you get to know them. I had my birthday while I was there. I

arrived in Porto, a major city in Portugal, on my birthday. Some of the people I had previously met agreed to meet up with me for a birthday dinner. We were sitting outside a French restaurant on the bank of the Duoro River in Porto, and they sang Happy Birthday to me together, each in their own language: German, Spanish, Dutch and South African. That was a highlight . . . such wonderful people.

Another thing, when you meet others on the Camino you don't say to yourself: That person has brown skin, or that person is from Japan, or that person is a corporate executive or that person is a janitor. What you say is: Here is another person on a similar journey and the discussion goes to stories of blisters, accommodations, starting points and the like. I only spoke about work and occupations with about 10% of the people I met. It just did not come up. It is an automatic camaraderie and it's wonderful.

What would you recommend to residents who are thinking of doing the same journey?

Don't be afraid. It's so safe and probably the second thing would be to decide how far you want to walk each day and from there pick the city you want to start in. It doesn't have to be 300 miles. You can walk 20 miles and get to Santiago de Compostela. But to obtain a Compostela Certificate you have to walk at least 100 kilometers. Pam got her certificate!



Starting later in October, the Southern Nevada Health District began hosting COVID-19 Booster Shots for the community on Thursdays from 8 a.m.-1 p.m. at the Mountain Shadows Community Center. The community has been so grateful for this partnership.







Fitness Classes



SECURITY PATROL

We Have a Very Fine Security Patrol

ur Residents may be proud and thankful to the one hundred eighty or so Patrol Members. Actually, there are about twenty-nine recruits going through training at present. Our optimal strength is 250 members. We are all Residents of Sun City who have volunteered to Patrol, Dispatch, or staff our Information Centers for a minimum of four hours a week. Additionally, there are currently about 40 administrative positions requiring staffing. There is always something to maintain everyone's interests.

Most Residents do not have a clear understanding of what their Security Patrol may, or may not do, for Sun City. We have no enforcement capability. Rather, our purpose is to be of assistance to Residents. The very presence of our cars, with flashing light bars, indicate to the "bad guys" our ever-watchful Patrols. Officially, we are the eyes and ears of Metro.

Crime in Sun City has the lowest incidents in the Valley, due in part to our Patrol Members. There has been an increase in some types of crime of late, but this has been rectified. Should we see, or be alerted to suspicious behavior, our immediate response is to quickly investigate the incident and report, if necessary, to the Police. In most cases, when the Police arrive, the Security Patrol Officers are on site and have secured the area of concern. This is a great assistance for Metro.

We provide dozens of peripheral services, such as house checks when Residents are vacationing. It is important that before leaving on vacation, Residents come to our Office and request we check their home. This gives us authority to go onto your property and investigate issues such as water leaks as well as a myriad of other inspections. We will respond directly to you with any problems we find, if we have your contact information.

Perhaps the most important element of your Security Patrol, is that of Training.

All Volunteers go through a program of education in each of the three primary skills: Patrol Driver,

Dispatcher, or Information
Center Staff. After Training,
a member will choose a
skill. Training is ongoing.
We have annual specialized
education as well as
Refresher Courses in each

skill set. All members must attend these sessions in order to keep current with the changes we implement.

As well as providing Security for Sun City, members enjoy a social element. In that we are liked minded individuals, several events annually keep us socially involved. Though we may be "like minded", we come from every walk of professionalism. This is reflected in the expertise demonstrated by each and every Sun City Security Patrol Officer.

Ballots are due by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, February 22, and ballot counting takes place at the Association's Annual meeting which is scheduled at 8 a.m. on Wednesday, February 23.

The good side & park side of gift giving

t appears as I write this article that holiday gifts may not only be in short supply this year but also cost much more due to high demand and short supply.

Why do we give gifts anyway? Wouldn't giving a loved one our time and attention be better than a materialistic gift? Did you know that there's a good side and a dark side to this tradition?

In search of answers, I first turned to Dr. Darlene Silvernail, a psychologist at South University – West Palm Beach. Turns out that giving gifts has psychological benefits; a way to show appreciation and gratitude for an individual as well as strengthening the bond between two people. When we give with no concern for getting something in return, when we give unselfishly, our psychological health improves. Seeing the expression of joy on someone's face can provide enormous satisfaction. What we give for gifts often reflects our relationship with the receiver. For example, a gift to a friend may be thoughtful, while a gift to a romantic connection may be more sentimental.

Gift giving may also be a way to assuage guilt; if the gift giver cannot be with loved ones during the holidays but finds the perfect gift, this may not only reduce guilt but can also bring emotional happiness for both the giver and the recipient.

In many cultures feelings of reciprocity often accompany gift giving. Advertisers play into the emotions of the consumer suggesting that the perfect gift is bound to bring great joy. They also know that the consumer likes a good deal – a gift that looks expensive but has been bought on sale. Have you noticed that the holiday advertising seems to start earlier and earlier every year?

This brings us to the darker side of gift giving. If a person receives a gift and feels the gift giver has not put enough thought into it or hasn't spent enough money, they may then feel undervalued and resentful. Further, looking for just the right gift takes a lot of time and effort not to mention the cost of a gift and what it takes to package it, which can create very real stress and financial burden.

Might there be a better way to share the love of the season without as much stress and financial burden? The answer is yes!

Research shows that holiday cards with family pictures and perhaps a holiday letter sharing news makes those who receive these feel that they are in the network and connected to the sender important enough to update and keep in touch with.

The year before COVID-19 started, sharing memories by

enjoying a vacation together or some unique experience had become very popular. I believe as a semblance of normalcy slowly returns to our lives that this method of gift giving will make a big comeback.

Even a holiday movie for kids while they visit, at home arts and crafts or baking cookies; there are many experiences to share with family that don't involve the stress and cost of gifts.

Furthermore, we are blessed to have so many options right here in our own backyard where you can spend time with guests and give them attention but not even have to leave the community.
