

Vote Now for the Sun City Board of Directors

As you read this article, you should have received your packet in the mail to vote for your choice of candidates running to serve on the SCSCAI Board of Directors. If you have not received your large, white envelope with the red marking "SCSCAI Election Materials Enclosed, Time Sensitive", please contact the Administrative Office at Mountain Shadows, 9107 Del Webb Boulevard. There is one envelope per property, not per resident.

Board positions open, each with a three-year term. The top vote recipients will be elected to the Board. Please read the instructions on the back of the ballot carefully so your vote will be counted. Note that you MUST use the yellow envelope to return your ballot and you should NOT write anything on that envelope – no return address. Do not cover the bar code as it is needed to validate your ballot. To ensure privacy, the envelope will be separated from the ballot before counting.

The envelope contains everything you need to know about the 7 candidates running for the Board. There are statements to acquaint you with their qualifications and experience as well as a disclosure statement required by Nevada State Law, which states that the candidate is a member in good standing with the Association and has no conflict of interest in serving on the Board.

Each candidate participated in a Residents' Forum sponsored "Meet the Candidates" evening on January 10 and a recording of that event is linked on the SCSCAI web page for your review or in case you missed it (see link below*).

Most importantly, in the packet you received via mail, you will find the yellow ballot you need to vote. There are three

AARP Tax Aide

Sign-ups Started Monday, January 3, 2022



AARP volunteers will once again prepare your federal income tax forms for free this year. The program will run from February 10 to April 15 on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. This service will be offered in the Mint Room at Mountain Shadows from 9 a.m. to noon and 1-4 p.m. Appointments are necessary and may be made by phone or in person with the Social Monitor at Mountain Shadows. We will be using the same software as last year. You must bring a copy of the 2019 and 2020 **tax return** (this is a new requirement due to Covid-19), your Social Security card and a form of picture ID. We also need any W2s, 1099R, Interest, Dividend, Social Security SSA1099, W2G, broker statements, proof of health insurance and any other receipts for your miscellaneous deductions. Please note that we will only prepare returns for electronic filing; no paper returns will be prepared. Also note that we cannot prepare state returns, rental property deductions, business, or partnership (K-1) income other than simple interest, dividends, or capital gains. Wood in Sun City Summerlin

ood is a wonderful, versatile material with a huge presence in basic home construction, as well as with many common exterior home accessories.

Unfortunately, most exterior wood applications are not compatible with our Nevada desert weather. Wood is not very resilient in our extreme heat and high UV environment and therefore does not readily maintain its long-term natural beauty, nor its beneficial shape, strength or construction characteristics. While most paints and coatings can help preserve wood, they have not provided the long-term protection these items require.

We are finding more and more unapproved decorative wooden items, such as trellises, fences, benches and lattices in our community's yards that are not permitted. We are also finding more substantial items, such as patio covers and pergolas, which have not been approved.

Several violations have been imposed because exposed wood surfaces have dried out and deteriorated, creating peeling, warping, splitting, rotting and loose fasteners, which may make structures unsafe. Of serious concern is that these dry wood conditions eagerly react with natural oxygen, creating a high propensity for the wood to ignite and burn.

For the above reasons, wood items have been restricted for exterior use in Sun City Summerlin since the Community was first constructed. These restrictions remain in place and are broadly defined in our Development Standards. Despite its versatility, wood is not permitted for any exterior purpose in Sun City Summerlin.

Community Standards has identified a satisfactory substitute for some structures, that being aluminum products which have a wood grain finish, the appearance of wood and most of the construction characteristics, we desire. These products have long lifespans, which will minimize future repair and replacement.

Remember, aside from wood, plastics, chain link fences, chicken wire and any type of lattice are not permitted for any exterior purpose.

The Real Story of Valentine's Day!

(Sadly, this is one way to show your love!)

There's a true-life story. It's a story that teaches us a lot about love, sacrifice, and commitment—the true meaning of Valentine's Day.

In the third century, the Roman Empire was ruled by Emperor Claudius II Gothicus. He was nicknamed Claudius the Cruel because of his harsh leadership and his tendency for getting into wars and abusing his people. In fact, he was getting into so many wars during the third century that he was having a difficult time recruiting enough soldiers.

Claudius believed that recruitment for the army was down because Roman men did not want to leave their loves or families behind, so he canceled all marriages and engagements in Rome. Thousands of couples saw their hopes of matrimony dashed by the single act of a tyrant. And no one seemed interested in standing up to the emperor.

But a simple Christian priest named Valentine did come forward and stood up for love. He began to secretly marry soldiers before they went off to war, despite the emperor's orders. In 269 A.D., Emperor Claudius found out about the secret ceremonies. He had Valentine thrown into prison and deemed that he would be put to death.

As Valentine was awaiting execution, he fell in love with a blind girl who happened to be the jailer's daughter. On the eve of his execution, with no writing instruments available, Valentine is said to have written her a sonnet in ink that he squeezed from violets. Legend has it that his words made the blind woman see again. It was a brief romance because the next day Valentine was clubbed to death by Roman executioners.

St. Valentine gave his life so that young couples could be bonded together in holy matrimony. They may have killed the man, but not his spirit. Even centuries after his death, the story of Valentine's self-sacrificing commitment to love was legendary in Rome. Eventually, he was granted sainthood and the Catholic Church decided to create a feast in his honor. They picked February 14 as the day of celebration because of the ancient belief that birds (particularly lovebirds, but also owls and doves) began to mate on that very day.

RX for a Healthy Heart. If the first thing that comes to mind when you think of a prescription for a healthy heart is Lipitor or Warfarin, think again! While pharmaceuticals can be vital to keeping your ticker ticking, there are many lifestyle options that can strengthen your heart and help reduce your risk for heart disease.

Social interaction and friendships can be as important to your heart health as diet and exercise. Social isolation and loneliness have been closely associated with a higher incidence of heart disease. The question remains whether it is the lack of social interaction that causes the heart disease or if the lifestyle habits of many who are socially isolated (poor nutrition and limited physical activity to name a few) are the culprit. Either way, social interaction is an important part of keeping your heart and your spirit healthy!

As most of us already know, **Diet and Exercise** are key components in the prescription for a healthier heart. The American Heart Association has three basic recommendations:

1) Use up at least as many calories as you take in; 2) Eat an

overall healthy dietary pattern that emphasizes a variety of fruits and vegetables, whole grains, healthy sources of protein, minimally processed foods, minimal added sugars, minimal salt, and little to no alcohol intake; and 3) Live tobacco free.

Just as there is a long list of side effects to consider before using pharmaceuticals; you'll need to watch out for some of the common side effects of changing your lifestyle habits . . . lifelong friendships, weight loss, improved fitness, and feeling great!!!

What do you know about your heart?

We have heard many of the facts about heart disease: one person dies every 36 seconds in the US from cardiovascular disease, heart disease is the leading cause of death in the US, etc. Here are some interesting facts about the heart that you may not have heard:

- Your heart beats over 100,000 times per day.
- The heart is about the size of your two hands clasped together.
- Your heart pumps about 1.5 gallons of blood every minute. Over the course of a day, that adds up to over 2,000 gallons.
- There are 60,000 miles of blood vessels in your body. That's enough to go around the world twice.
- The average heartbeat of a woman is about 8 beats a minute faster than a man's heartbeat.
- Your age and fitness level impacts your heart rate.
 According to the NIH, the average heart rate of children 10+ and non-athletic adults is 60 100bpm. In athletic adults it is 40-60bpm.
- The highest number of heart attacks occur each year on Christmas Day. The day after Christmas and New Year's Day are close behind.
- More heart attacks happen on a Monday than any other day of the week.


OUR VALENTINE STORY



Lite the Nite

If your family does not want an uninvited guest, please, please light up your property!!!

ven though many break-ins happen during daylight hours, the nighttime covers illegal activities with a curtain of shadowy places for questionable persons to hide and attempt to grab your treasures!

Have you been outside this year after sunset to check your address lights? Grab a coat and do that tonight. If you do have an emergency of any kind, no one can help you if they can't find you. Check with Security Patrol on replacement bulbs or replace the address equipment with an HOA approved new model. So many of our neighbors do not even realize their address lights are inoperable. If you cannot go outside after dark, give call to our office and we may be able to have one of the patrol officers check for you as they make their regular rounds.

Look around your property while you are out there shivering in the night air chill. Is it dark and attractive for creeping around or is it well lit and unappealing to a would-be intruder. Our good friend from Las Vegas Metro Police, Randy Klenosky, says "This can be accomplished with porch lights near your front door, carriage lights over your garage, up lighting in your landscaping and fixed lighting along the sides and rear of your home." (Note: don't forget to turn them on!) He further suggests, "Most home improvement stores have a wide variety of affordable options these days to consider. If homeowners are not handy and are looking for 3rd party vendors to provide lighting or security enhancements: a great resource is the Nevada Security Association. Members are all licensed, insured, and bonded and can be located at nevadasecurityassociation.org" or use your favorite handyman.

Also, if adding lighting – consider 2-in-1 systems that have surveillance cameras along with motion sensor lighting. These systems provide lighting when someone enters the set motion zone, but also records to provide potential evidence if a

crime is committed. These systems also provide instant alerts to the homeowner, who can then actually speak through the device to the subject and/or activate a siren alarm to deter unwanted

behavior on their property.

So many folks in Sun City are dog owners. They are out and about any time of the day or night when the pooches ask to head down the street for exercise and, well, you know. After the

sun goes down, can drivers see you? Or are you and your doggy just a big black shape? SOLUTION: Have a vest with reflective material for the human half of the duo; grab it before leaving the house. Better yet also have reflective material on the collar or lead of your favorite canine. Check your favorite pet supply store or on line for these bright and colorful lifesavers. Suddenly the image seen by a driver DOES "Lite the Nite".

Next, remember the interior of your home, especially if you are having a night out. Calling on Randy again for suggestions, "When away at night or on vacation, have lamps, TVs, or radios on timers so it gives the look of occupancy. Criminals are less likely to target homes if they believe someone is inside."

Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives By Rick Rozier, Deputy Fire Marshal

he "Sun City Smoke Alarm" program started in August of 2019 with one simple mission: to make the residents of Sun City safer by modernizing obsolete and failing smoke alarms and by providing important fire and fall prevention educational tips. Nearly two and a half years later we are well on our way to accomplishing this goal. As with most good things, bringing this program from a good idea to a reality has not been easy. We evolved from hosting monthly town hall meetings to a more user-friendly sign up process. We are navigating this unprecedented global pandemic with all its frustrating variants. We have had to solve supply chain issues with our resource partner, Lowe's. We have also dealt with labor shortages within our department. With the help of five separate licensed electrical and fire alarm contractors, countless volunteers, Michael Pennock, your Neighborhood Preparedness Team (NPT) and the tireless efforts of the program's manager, Fire Inspector Zach Collins, we have kept the program on the right path and continued to provide this valuable service to our friends in Sun City.

What have we accomplished to date? As of January 2022, we have installed nearly 5600 new smoke alarms in 1210 homes. This included providing additional smoke alarm coverage in hundreds of homes to bring the properties more in line with current codes and standards. It also included installing carbon monoxide detectors in all the residences, where none previously existed.



What can you expect in 2022? Due to the uncertainty of this pandemic, we have decided to limit the number of new applications accepted per month. Starting January 17, 2022, we will accept the first 250 applications. If you will be available from January 17 – February 28, 2022, feel free to sign up. Additional months will open once the prior month's installations are completed. Please note that additional delays could occur if smoke alarms become unavailable due to supply chain issues. Applications are available at the Social Monitor Stations.

Standing Committee Membership

The SCSCAI Executive Board, through its Standing Committee Chairs, is currently seeking SCSCAI Owners to serve on standing Committees. In order to serve SCSCAI as a committee member, you should be able to fulfill the following expectations to the best of your ability. Please consider the checklist as you consider serving.

- Attend Committee Meeting (usually one a month);
- Actively help the Chair with the work of the committee.
- Meet the expectations specific to the committee on which you serve.
- Reply to Committee Chair and staff emails and specific requests for information.

Standing Committee Appointment Process

SCSCAI Owners may register to be on a Standing Committee for an annual term of March – February. Owners interested in serving on a Standing Committee must submit a committee member application (including new and returning committee members). The Chairperson of each Standing Committee, except for the Architectural Review Committee, whose members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors, shall select, and appoint the other members of the committee from the SCSCAI Owners.

Standing Committees

Finance Committee

This Committee has general oversight of the financial policies, included but not limited to, investments, audits, and insurance subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, including ways and means for obtaining funds necessary to meet the authorized budget for carrying out the work of the Association. The Committee will review the annual budget, prepared by the Executive Director, make recommendations with respect thereto, and submit the annual budget and their recommendations in writing no later than the May Board meeting for Board approval.

Common Area Properties Committee

This Committee shall conduct a thorough inspection of all the Association's real and personal property. The Committee shall determine that said property is maintained in a manner to ensure safety of personnel, long life and efficient operation. The Committee shall be available for consultation to the Finance Committee during the budget process. The Committee is also consulted by the Executive Director on all individual purchases of machinery, electrical and mechanical equipment, this applies to new and replacement fixed assets and included examination for a "need to replace." The Committee consists of two divisions: (1) Engineering and Technical services and (2) Inspection, Investigation, and Restoration services. The members of this Committee shall be selected, when possible, with the skills appropriate to the Committee needs. The Committee voting authority shall be vested in those Inspection's Team and Engineering/Technical Group Leaders appointed by the Chairman.

*Clubs and Community Organizations Committee

This Committee reviews and recommends to the Board of Directors action to be taken with respect to Chartered Clubs and Organizations (club) applications. This Committee also develops and recommends to the Board policies and procedures as standards for club oversight, facilities use and for the administration of proper relationships between the Association and its Chartered Clubs and Community Organizations. This Committee may hear complaints involving chartered clubs and/or community organizations in accordance with the Association's Complaints and Hearing Protocol.

*Architectural Review Committee

The Architectural Review Committee is the **only** standing committee of the Association mandated by the CC&Rs/Master Declaration, and the only Committee with the authority to make decisions. Prior written approval by the Architectural Review Committee is required for all new construction in SCSCAI. This Committee reviews and renders decisions on all alterations or modifications to the exterior of homes, hardscape, and landscape, advises staff on violations of approved plan and updates the Design Standards. The decisions of the Architectural Review Committee are final.

*Hearing Committee

This Committee is delegated authority by the Board of Directors to hear formal complaints brought by the Association alleging violation of the Development Standards. Any hearing conducted by the Committee shall be in accordance with the Association's Complaint and Hearing Protocol. If, after a hearing, the formal complaint is upheld, the Hearing Committee may sanction the respondent up to and including the imposition of a fine for each violation and when circumstances warrant, the Hearing Committee may recommend to the Board of Directors partial or full suspension of privileges.

*Legal Review Committee

This Committee reviews the Association's Governing Documents, hearings and related affairs. The Committee shall be comprised of members with legal or general business oversight skills that may include a working familiarity with managing updates to Governing Documents and knowledge of dispute resolution, mediation, and arbitration processes. Neither the Committee nor its members shall render legal advice to the Association or render any services constituting the practice of law. The Committee may review and provide recommendations to the President, the Board or Executive Director regarding SCSCAI involvement in Ombudsman intervention, mediation, or arbitration cases or on issues where and independent review is requested. The Committee's functions may include but are not restricted to; (a) Review of Governing Documents and recommending updates or revisions to the Board. (b) Review of pending or adopted state and federal legislation to determine the impact upon the Association and make recommendations to the Board. (c) Draft and recommend changes to the Complaint and Hearing Protocol and serve as a hearing panel when necessary. Members may be appointed by the Chairperson to serve as Hearing officers. (d) Review and provide recommendations on strategies to keep legal costs at a minimum. (e) Upon request of the Board of Directors or Association management, provide training and seminar services in areas where they have expertise. (f) Upon request of the Board of Directors, develop, review, and recommend selection criteria for new legal counsel.

Golf Oversight Committee

This Committee keeps the Board advised of suggested improvements, enhancements, or maintenance to the golf courses and makes recommendations as to golf operations, golf fees, golf reserve funds, outside play and other pertinent golf issues. In addition, the Committee hears suggestions and complaints from the residents in

general, resident golfers and adjacent property owners.

Information Technology Committee

This Committee shall review and evaluate the adequacy of both the hardware and software requirements of the various departments. The Committee will recommend cost effective improvements and changes in order to optimize the flow of user required information and responds to specific requests as identified by the Board and Administration, including training requirements and dissemination of information.

Fitness Committee

This Committee advises the Board of improvements and enhancement to the facilities and fitness equipment. The Committee reviews and suggests maintenance and operation of the fitness centers and other related community fitness assets to the Board. In addition, the Committee advises the Board and makes recommendations

regarding residents; fitness suggestions, and complaints and studies other fitness related matters as requested by the Director of Fitness, Executive Director, and or Board.

*If you are selected to serve on any committees whose name is proceeded by an *, you do so with the understanding that if you are chosen to serve on the Committee, information about individuals is confidential. This includes, but is not limited to, information, testimony, deliberations, and determinations made during Hearings. At your first meeting you will be given a copy of NRS 116.31031, SCSCAI Bylaw section 8.7 and a copy of the SCSCAI Fine Schedule. In addition, you will be asked to sign a form containing the following statement: "I understand that all testimony, hearings, evidence of any kind are confidential and are not to be discussed outside of my duties as a member of this Committee".

People Walking on the Golf Course

Just a reminder, pedestrians and dogs are not allowed on our golf courses at any time. Some of you may come from areas where in the winter when the course is closed, early morning or late afternoon people may be allowed to use the courses for walking.

Our courses are not only open year-round, between maintenance and tee-times our courses are either being maintained or golfed on all daylight hours.

There are many safety reasons why pedestrians should not be on the courses at any time, some you may not have thought of;

- The courses are designed to be accessed by golf carts, the ground, turf, and cart paths were not built and are not maintained for walking.
- Walking while golfers are on the course is dangerous. According to Golf Digest, an estimated 40,000 people each year seek emergency medical treatment due to injuries caused by errant golf balls and flying club heads. A golf ball hit by a golfer can be traveling as fast as 148 mph or more.
- When there are no golfers on the course, we are maintaining the courses with chemicals, fertilizers, and watering with non-potable water. While none of

these things are poisonous, you certainly do not want to subject yourself or your pet to them.

- We use large noisy equipment on the courses. Our workers know where the golfers are and know how to look out for them. The same cannot be said about pedestrians and dogs.
- Our golf courses have no lighting and do not have pedestrian walks so they can be dangerous for you to walk on.
- Coyotes have dens on our courses, and we would hate to see your pet attacked or you injured trying to protect your pet.

Seasonal golf courses have the flexibility of allowing people and pets on their courses during the winter months when there is no maintenance, watering or fertilizing, since our courses are open year-round, we have limited hours to care for our courses and we do put chemicals down during the times no one is to be on the course.

For your safety, safety of your guests and safety of your pet, please do not access the golf course for any purpose other than to golf and then do so by checking in at the Pro Shop during business hours.
