

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

ell, the Las Vegas winter is mostly done. The rest of the country can still have its snow and cold but I, for one, am ready for spring like weather. The golf courses are showing a slight amount of green in areas other than the greens and fairways. The pickleball and tennis courts are being used more and more hours each day. Trees and plants are showing leaves and buds. Yes, Spring is almost here.

Everyone should have received a ballot a few days ago in the mail. Please vote. Three Board seats are being voted on right now and this is your opportunity to participate in the selection process. Information about each candidate has been provided and will hopefully help all residents as they decide whom to vote for this year. Almost immediately after the election, there will be a Board meeting wherein the "new" Board will select its officers for the new year. This is an open meeting but only the sitting Board members can vote for and select the officers for the upcoming year. Shortly after that the Board members, Finance Committee members and Department Directors will begin reviewing data and recommendations for the Budget Hearings that begin in March. "Out of the frying pan and into the fire," pretty well describes that period of time from the end of February until the end of March. All Budget Hearings are available to all residents in person or via Zoom. The data and info is all available online for any resident to review and comment about.

At the Board's first meeting in March, the President will make appointments of Board members to serve as Chairpersons of the standing committees in the community. There is so much talent and knowledge available in our community that can be used if you, the residents, will volunteer to help out by joining a committee. If you have any interest in being on a committee, please contact our Executive Director, Mitzi Mills so that she can pass on your contact information to the appropriate committee chair. There are other ways to volunteer in our community as well. Security Patrol with its 200 or so members is on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and 365 days a year. It is always looking for residents to become drivers, dispatchers, and Information Center workers. The Sunshine Services Group loans out to residents free of charge medical equipment such as walkers, wheelchairs, etc. They are open 5 days a week and have offices with equipment next to the Security Patrol office, which is next to the pickleball courts. Sun City Volunteers is also a community organization which is housed in the same building as Security and Sunshine. They are an independent group that helps the community in many ways including but not limited to providing rides to doctor appointments or provid-

ing some minor handyman work for residents. Lastly, the Neighborhood Preparedness Team coordinates Neighborhood Watch with Metro. It also provides programs free of charge to educate residents on home safety, how to turn off gas or electricity in the event of an emergency. It also

is providing programs on what to do in the event of a natural disaster. All of these groups would welcome your involvement to help make our community an even better place to live. Contact information for all of these groups is on page 60

Vote Now For Sun City Board Of Directors

As you read this article, you should have received your packet in the mail to vote for your choice of candidates running to serve on the SCSCAI Board of Directors. If you have not received your large, white envelope with the red marking "SCSCAI Election Materials Enclosed, Time Sensitive", please contact the Administrative Office at Mountain Shadows, 9107 Del Webb Boulevard. There is one envelope per property, not per resident.

The envelope contains everything you need to know about the 4 candidates running for the Board. There are statements to acquaint you with their qualifications and experience as well as a disclosure statement required by Nevada State Law, which states that the candidate is a member in good standing with the Association and has no conflict of interest in serving on the Board. Candidates are:



Each candidate participated in a Residents' Forum sponsored "Meet the Candidates" evening on January 11 and a recording of that event is linked on the SCSCAI web page for your review or in case you missed it (see link below*).

Most importantly, in the packet you received via mail, you will find the yellow ballot you need to vote. There are three Board positions open, each with a three-year term and the top vote recipients will be elected to the Board. Please read the instructions on the back of the ballot carefully so your vote will be counted. Note that you MUST use the ballot envelope to return your ballot and you should NOT write anything on that envelope – no return address. Do not cover the bar code as it is needed to validate your ballot. To ensure privacy, the envelope will be separated from the ballot before counting.

All ballots must be received at Mountain Shadows no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 21, 2023. Please make sure that you mail your ballot in time for it to be received by the deadline, or you may hand deliver it to the Administrative Office at Mountain Shadows and place it in the ballot box. All ballots remain sealed until they are opened and tabulated at the Association's Annual Meeting on Wednesday, February 22; there is no room for delay or looking at the postmarked date. Call to order for the Annual Meeting is 8:00 a.m.





AARP Tax Aide



There are two ways to sign up. Appointments can be made by using the Google voice phone number or using the AARP website. The Social Monitors at Mountain Shadow are unable to make appointments and do not have any information. Please Don't call the Social Monitors at Mt. Shadows. Appointments can be made by the Taxpayer using the AARP website: nvtaxaide.org. Website should be ready the middle of January.

The Google voice phone number to call for an appointment is 702-381-0655.

AARP volunteers will again provide free federal income tax. The program will run from February 2 to April 15. This service will be offered in the Mint Room at Mountain Shadows on Thursday, Fridays and Saturdays. Our hours are from 9-12 and 1-4. We are using the same software as last year. You MUST bring a copy of last year's return, Social Security cards and some form of picture ID. If you want a direct deposit or direct debit, please bring a Cancelled Check. We also need any W2's, 1099R, Interest, Dividend, Social Security SSA1099, W2G, broker statements, proof of health insurance and any receipts for your miscellaneous deductions. Please note we will only prepare returns for electronic filing, no paper returns. Also note that we cannot prepare state returns, rental property deductions, business or partnership, We can prepare K-1 returns with simple interest and dividends. If you have any tax questions, feel free to call Mike Sanders at 702-724-0476.



THE ELECTION COMMITTEE

Dedicated To Overseeing SCSCAI'S Fair & Open Election Process

Interview with Lynn Kasner-Morgan, Chairwoman

In 2020, Lynn was appointed to be Chairwoman of the Election Committee. There was a Search Committee of three that made a recommendation to Leo Crawford, President of the Board, who then appointed Lynn. That was back in June 2020. The upcoming election will be Lynn's 4th term as Chairwoman (she has served 2020, 2021, 2022 and also in 2023).

And they keep re-appointing you? No, it is like all our Committees in Sun City Summerlin, every appointment is a new appointment each year. Some people stay, some don't. It is up to the Committee Chairperson. In this case, it is up to the President of the Board to ask me to serve and then I pick the members of the Election Committee.

Have you served in a similar capacity before you came to this community? Not with elections per se. I have been on nominating committees for national organizations. I have been

What do you like about your role? I feel like I am contributing to the Community. Also, I get to meet people who I have not known before . . . our paths cross during the election process. Counting the ballots is a major responsibility and being part of it is rewarding. We have a great team of people! After I agreed to chair the Committee, I met with Fred Wagner who had done it for years . . . he shared his procedures with me. He advised me that he thought our Committee was too small, but I think it is the right size. We have a great Committee made up of truly committed people.

How many members serve on the Committee? There are four members in addition to me. I think that the bylaws require a minimum of three including the Chairperson. I select those people.

For how long do they serve? For one year. The Committees are re-appointed each year.

Do they have different responsibilities? No. We all share in the responsibilities. The most significant thing that we all do is the counting of ballots.





President of two national organizations. So, I am familiar with electoral procedures.

What are your responsibilities? To get things organized and started...to make sure the notifications are done and, to put together the calendar. I draft the documents: the candidate election packet, the ballot and ballot information packet, the articles that are published in the Link Magazine and other items as needed. I then send drafts of what I have put together to the Committee members for proofreading, to check for accuracy. I also chair a meeting with the candidates (who are self-nominated) to review the process. Any questions about the election come to me. And, of course, most importantly, Committee members and I validate and manage the counting of the ballots. One other thing that I do personally is attend the Organization Meeting of the Board which is held the morning after the ballots are counted. At that meeting, I count the votes for Board officers as Board members vote for their officers.

What do you see as the main (primary) role of the Election Committee? Conducting a fair and open election. When I have an opportunity, I try to encourage people to "throw their hat in the ring". We have a self-nomination process, so anyone can nominate him or herself to run for a Board position. It is not like other organizations; we are not a nominating committee. We conduct the election and people self-nominate.

What else do you think the Link readers would be interested in knowing about the Election Committee?

Primarily that we conduct the election, we don't lobby, and we don't endorse. I think that one of the things that is not clear that I try to stress all the time...is that we do not hold candidate events! The candidate events are done by the Residents' Forum.

IN RECOGNITION OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH


uring the month of February, we reflect on the achievements and history of African Americans. In 1915, historian Carter G. Woodson co-founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History. Subsequently in 1926, the second week of February was declared "Negro History Week". The goal was aimed at recognizing the contributions of African Americans in U.S. history. Why the second week of February? Because it includes the birthdays of two notable individuals: Frederick Douglass (an abolitionist) and former U.S. President Abraham Lincoln.

In 1976, under President Gerald Ford, the week-long event became Black History Month. The ceremonies and events that take place during the month of February honor Black citizens from all periods in our history, dating back to the early 17th century to present day.

Notable individuals who are recognized include Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. who fought for civil rights during the 1950s and 1960s. As well as Justice Thurgood Marshall, the first African American justice appointed to the United States Supreme Court. We also spotlight Mae Jemison, the first female African American astronaut to travel to space in 1992. Barack Obama is part of this impressive group – the first African American President, elected in 2008 and re-elected in 2012.

Black History Month celebrates the contributions of African Americans in our society through art and museum exhibits, films, music, cuisine, and educational activities. To learn more about the events happening in Las Vegas go to:


The International African American Museum will open its doors to visitors later this year in Charleston, South Carolina. The museum (20 years in the making!) is located above Gadsden's Wharf, the dock where more than 45% of African slaves first set foot in America. Nine galleries and special exhibition spaces immerse visitors in the life stories of captives brought to America documenting their journeys and achievements. What these brave individuals endured and their resilience to overcome adversity is a testament to the strength of the human spirit.

The museum sits atop 18, 13-foot columns honoring the sacred ground beneath. The gardens, located on the ground

level, feature the African Ancestors Memorial Garden – the original shoreline where captive individuals first set foot in America. It is a place of quiet contemplation, a hallowed site honoring the memory of those who endured the African Diaspora.

Visitors can trace their African American genealogy at the Center for Family History. A team of genealogists will assist visitors in tracing their family history. The museum features a large collection of historic, marriage and bible records. Those interested can also search the growing digital collection of obituaries and funeral records.

Heart Health Month: Cardio or Strength Training?

ebruary is American Heart Month, and the American Heart Association's mission is to build healthier lives, free of cardiovascular diseases and stroke. One of the best ways to build a healthier life is through physical activity, but which activity is better cardio or strength training? The answer is both and the studies show it.

According to the American Heart Association, physical activity in any form is good for your heart. Being sedentary is a major risk factor for cardiovascular disease.

Cardio for Heart Health

- Reduce blood pressure
- Lower cholesterol levels
- Improve blood sugar control
- Help with weight management

Other heart-healthy benefits include:

- Lowers resting heart rate
- Aids Circulatory and Respiratory Systems
- Helps reduce stress

Strength Training for Heart Health

Strength training, on the other hand, may not offer as many obvious heart benefits, but they're there. Strength training builds strong bones, aids in weight management, and improves symptoms associated with chronic conditions. Strength training has many of the same benefits as cardio training:

- Improved control of cholesterol
- Better blood sugar management
- Help with weight management
- Lower blood pressure
- Reduced risk of health issues like hypertension, diabetes, and cardiovascular disease

Other heart-healthy benefits include:

- Increases Calorie Burn at Rest
- Reduces Fat Around the Heart
- Improves Blood Pressure

The Bottom Line on Strength Training vs. Cardio for Heart Health

Combine Cardio and Strength Training. All exercise is good for the heart and marrying the two forms of exercises leads to the best possible outcomes.

Clock Enough Time. American Heart Association recommends strength training at least twice a week and 150 minutes of moderate-intensity cardio or 75 minutes of vigorous cardio each week. Talk test: Be able to talk to friend but while moving but aim for conversation to be "breathy."

Pick an Activity You Enjoy. Ultimately, the best exercise is the one you'll stick with and incorporate into your routine. Do something that you enjoy. While the greatest cardiovascular benefits come from a combo of cardio and strength, any intentional movement will always leave you feeling better, stronger and your heart healthier.

Get Other Lifestyle Habits in Check. Strength training and cardio training won't cancel out a bad diet. Sleep, social connection, and stress management play a critical role in keeping your heart healthy, too. Take care of your heart, and your heart will take care of you.

lan retired after 38 years as CEO of a large social service agency in Chicago. His company was about the same size as Sun City Summerlin with a \$20 million budget and close to 500 employees. Alan and his wife, Melanie, bought their home in the community in 2010, and they fell in love with Sun City Summerlin and the people they met. They love the weather, the city, and most of all the incredible lifestyle of SCS. They did not move here full time until 2012 because Alan was writing a book about his life experiences and all the notable people he had met and worked with.

After Alan and Melanie settled in the community, he asked if there was a Men's Club. Alan was told by staff that there was no Men's Club, though it had been tried several times unsuccessfully. Alan said: "I am going to try starting up a Men's Club." He had difficulty getting 50 men to sign his petition to form the club, since men "just don't join a club like that!" (Actually, most of those men did eventually join when they saw what a great club it had become.) The Men's Club became one of the largest and most active clubs at SCS during Alan's 8 years as President.

While Alan was President of the Men's Club, members of Temple Bet Knesset Bamidbar (which meets in SCS and serves the Jewish community here and throughout the valley) approached him. They were in search of a spiritual leader and wanted Alan for the role. Alan accepted and asked John Berthelsen to take over as President of the Men's Club. Alan compliments John on the excellent job he has done leading this awesome club.

Alan's first service as the spiritual leader of the Temple was in June 2021. It was a celebration of the congregation coming out of COVID-19, with Mitzi as guest speaker. Although Alan attended theological school for nine years, he did not seek ordination as a rabbi. Instead, Alan has chosen the title of: Moreh – which means teacher and leader; someone who teaches and inspires people by leadership. Alan is thankful for all the wonderful people he has met, both in the Temple and in the community.

Alan comes from a small town in Missouri where his father was the lay religious leader in the Jewish community and loved helping people. Alan's career as CEO of a non-profit organization was dedicated to helping people with disabilities and carrying on his father's tradition of service to others. Alan was so proud of being able to serve thousands of people with severe disabilities in Illinois and of all the historic innovations he had initiated.

Alan and Melanie are blessed with five children and 10 grandchildren. Alan's wife, Melanie is active in SCS clubs and committees and is also a talented performer in the community and the valley, both as a solo act and with one of her bands.

"The purpose of the Development Standards is to preserve and promote the character and orderly development of Sun City Summerlin as designed and developed by the Declarant. By acceptance of a deed to any Lot or Parcel, each Owner thereof and his successors and

All residents are invited to contact the Community Standards Office to file a complaint if they believe that poor maintenance and disallowed structures or decor have become evident on neighboring properties. Appropriate steps will be taken to correct issues that fall within the Community Standards responsibility, which may include issuing violation notices and/or taking other corrective actions, if necessary.

An important goal of the Community Standards office, and its Architectural Review Committee, is to assist residents as they plan and carry out projects to update and enhance their properties, by helping them stay within the bounds of the Development Standards and the CC&R's. Whether to explain a particular Standard or to assist with applying for project approval, we are available anytime during normal business hours.

In case these important documents have found their way into some obscure home-office file, we remind all residents that they are easily accessible at any time on the SCSCAI website.

All attached homes require application and project approval from both their Sub-Association President and the Architectural Review Committee.

As for the Development Standards, we understand that things do change and that the Standards are an "evolving" document. When reasonable to do so, the Standards will be updated to incorporate appropriate adjustments, which must then be approved by the SCSCAI Board of Directors, followed by release to residents. Some things will never change, but those that are deemed to improve "how we look" are always in our sights. We heartily encourage residents to share their ideas and suggestions with us so they may be considered as we prepare future updates. The most current version was published in July of 2021.

SECURITY PATROL

Working Together to Promote a Safer Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol, Neighborhood Preparedness Team and Neighborhood Watch

ewly elected Chief of Security, Steve Douglass and Assistant Chief Terry Carey, met with the newly elected heads of the Neighborhood Preparedness Team (NPT), Mary Fairhurst and John Lange, to explore ways these organizations can coordinate efforts to address challenges Sun City Summerlin will face when criminal, natural or industrial disasters occur.

Steve, who was a first responder in Los Angeles for 33 years, dealt with disasters from riots to earthquakes and understands how a community must work together and communicate it's needs when threats occur.

Mary, who has organized 28 new Neighborhood Watch programs since July 2022, discussed how the Neighborhood Watch programs focus on local issues that impact one block and how NPT is a community wide organization that blankets our entire community. All three need more resident involvement.

COVID-19 reduced the numbers of Security Patrol members. Likewise, the number of active Neighborhood Watch programs is also down. NPT is being restructured to better serve our community. The goal is to build all three programs back to prior levels.

A criminal who invades one home, or an earthquake that impacts all, are of concern, but we are a community of seniors. What happens when someone suffers a heart attack or has an accident and is lying alone on the floor?

Touring with the Security Patrol is an eye-opening experience. Each month the Security Patrol finds an average of 160 open garage doors. An open garage door is an invitation to a criminal, but Security Patrol has over 70 miles of community roads to cover. It cannot be all places at all times and that is when the local Neighborhood Watch program assists. Question, if you see your neighbor's door open, or newspapers accumulating, do you knock on their door to check?

The Neighborhood Preparedness Team, Neighborhood Watch and the Security Patrol have also teamed together to encourage

all residents to file an emergency contact form with the Security Patrol. The emergency contact form provides necessary information used in the event a medical, or other type of incident, occurs. All residents are urged to fill one out.

Any resident can get involved with one, or all three of the organizations and all residents are automatically By Norman Wright / Link members of NPT. There are no dues



or fees. To find out how to join NPT, or Neighborhood Watch, contact Mary Fairhurst by phone or text at 435-214-6123.

Her generosity and caring really meant a lot to me, and it surely tells us a lot about Lee Anne's genuine character and warm personality. This is a person we all should get to know, and I could not hesitate to pass this on to you. Our great thanks to Lee Anne for sharing herself with us.

- Today, I interviewed my grandmother for part of a research paper I'm working on for my psychology class. When I asked her to define success, in her own words, she said: "Success is when you look back at your life and the memories make you smile."
- Today, after my 72-hour shift at the fire station, a woman ran up to me at the grocery store and gave me a hug. When I tensed up, she realized that I didn't recognize her. She let go with tears of joy in her eyes and the most sincere smile and said; "On 9-11-2001, you carried me out of the World Trade Center!"
- Today, after I watched my dog get run over by a car I sat on
 - the side of the road holding him and crying. And just before he died; he licked the tears off my face.
- Today at 7 a.m., I woke up feeling ill, but decided I needed the money, so I went into work. At 3 p.m. I got laid off. On my drive home I got a flat tire. When I went into the trunk for the spare, it was flat too. A man in a BMW pulled over, gave me a ride. We chatted, and then he offered me a job. I start tomorrow.

- Today, as my father, three brothers, and two sisters stood around my mother's hospital bed, my mother uttered her last coherent words before she died. She simply said, "I feel so loved right now. We should have gotten together like this more often."
- Today, I kissed my dad on the forehead as he passed away in a small hospital bed. About 5 seconds after he passed, I realized it was the first time I had given him a kiss since I was a little boy.
- Today, in the cutest voice, my 8-year-old daughter asked me to start recycling. I chuckled and asked, "Why?" She replied. "So you can help me save the planet. I chuckled again and asked why do you want to save the planet?" "Because that's where I keep all my stuff."

- Today, I was traveling in Kenya. I met a refugee from Zimbabwe. He said he hadn't eaten anything in over 3 days, and he looked extremely skinny and unhealthy. Then my friend offered him the rest of the sandwich he was eating. The first thing the man said was, "We can share it."



Love Is Not Reserved Just for Humans!

was taking a friend to a cancer clinic two months ago. As I walked into the center, the obviously elderly woman in front of me was pushing a pink stroller. I was curious to see what infant or toddler she had in that stroller and took a look. To my surprise, there was a very tiny dog (not sure what breed) peeping out, happily beholding her surroundings . . . and dressed in a Christmas outfit! I expressed to the lady how adorable the dog was, and her response was "Thank you! We are tied at the hip." I was so touched. Here's a woman on her way to see an oncologist or perhaps even have a treatment and she took the time to dress up her pup and bring her beloved "sidekick" with her. And I was grateful they allowed her to do so as the dog seemed very well trained; I felt many patients would smile to see this!

Here we are in February, the month of St. Valentine's Day – recognition of love for partners, friends, and neighbors. And we know scientifically what love and hugs do for us humans. I wondered what science had to say about the benefits of sharing those emotions with a pet — any kind of pet or just cats and dogs? I researched a couple of scientific websites, and this is what I found from the National Institute of Health (pet lovers already know about some of these benefits): A pet gives unconditional love. According to NIH, 68% of households in the U.S. have a pet; the gamut running from fish, birds, guinea pigs, cats, dogs, and more. Most pet owners realize that having a pet lowers blood pressure, and levels of cortisol, the "stress hormone." Certainly, pets reduce loneliness, boost one's mood, and may increase feelings of social support.

There's far more! For example, researchers are now exploring how a pet may aid in influencing child development, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, and autism. Research also has found that some pets have "mindfulness qualities," particularly dogs that visit hospitals. Dr. Ann Berger, a researcher and doctor at the NIH, says "The foundations of mindfulness include attention, intention, compassion, awareness, all of those things are things that animals bring to the table. People kind of have to learn it. Animals do this innately."

Do not be deceived that it's only dogs that possess the ability to lower stress and blood pressure. One study found that children with autism, playing with guinea pigs for a mere 10 minutes was able to lower their anxiety. Another study found that diabetic Type 1 teenagers caring for fish actually managed their diabetes better than those who didn't and were more disciplined about checking glucose levels, imperative to managing diabetes. Research suggests that young children exposed to a pet in the house may have fewer allergies and asthma than those who do not.

The article ends with suggesting that while pets are beneficial for human health, pets are not for everyone. They require care, which may be fatiguing and stressful; young children in particular do not recognize the boundaries in such a situation and dog bites can be life-threatening. Having spoken with friends and neighbors about getting a dog or cat, most recom-

mended that, especially for us retired folks, that adopting an older pet is wise; kitties and puppies can be a handful – no matter how much you love them!
