

Each elected candidate will serve a three-year term. Candidates met with the Election Committee on December 2 to review the details of the election process and hear about the extensive time commitment required of Directors.

Candidate's statements of interest, prepared by each candidate himself, appear beginning on page 10 of this issue of the LINK. There will be an opportunity to meet with the candidates on Monday, January 10 at the Summit followed by the Residents' Forum Meet the Candidates event in the Starbright Theatre.

Ballots will be mailed to each homeowner in mid-January and will include all the information you need to exercise your vote. Please keep an eye out for a large white envelope labeled in red "Election Materials Enclosed." There is one packet per household owner, not per household resident. Ballots may be mailed and received or placed in the ballot box at Mountain Shadows no later than 5:00 pm on Tuesday, February 22. Counting will take place at the annual membership meeting starting at 8:00 am on Wednesday, February 23. The new Board will take office at a 9:00 am meeting on Thursday, February 24. We urge everyone to exercise the privilege of voting for the Board.

GENERAL CAMPAIGN RULES - SCSCAI BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION

- 1. **Election Period** The election period begins with the Candidate Orientation Meeting and ends on February 22, 2022 at 5 pm.
- 2. Positive and Fair Campaigning- The following is not allowed:
 - A. Written or verbal campaigning against another candidate.
 - B. Defamatory, Libelous or profane information.
- 3. **Limit on Spending** There is no limit on how much the candidate spends on their campaign.
- 4. **Paid Ads** The only limit on paid advertising is that a candidate cannot take out a paid ad in the Link Magazine or Webpage.
- 5. Campaigning Candidates and their supporters may campaign in and around any of the SCSCAI facilities providing it does not interfere with ongoing activities. If an authorized Association employee asks that a campaigner (candidate or supporter) leave the area, the person must do so immediately. In addition, if the campaign activity has caused litter, it must be removed immediately.
- 6. **Common Areas** Candidates are prohibited from leaving or posting campaign materials in SCSCAI Common Areas. This includes SCSCAI signage, bulletin boards, benches and information distribution areas.
- 7. City of Las Vegas Street Signs, Traffic Signs and Light Posts Candidates are prohibited posting campaign material on and street signs, traffic signs or light posts.

- 8. **Homeowner Mailboxes** Candidates are prohibited from placing items in or attaching items to Homeowner mailboxes.
- 9. Campaign T-Shirts, Buttons, Hats, etc. There are no restrictions.
- 10. Campaign "Swag" There are no restrictions
- 11. **Direct Mailing** Candidates may request a list of the mailing addresses of each home, which will not include the names of the owners or tenants. Paper format is 25 cents per page for the first 10 pages and 10 cents per page thereafter, in the format of a compact disc or thumb drive at a cost of \$5.00 or by electronic mail at no cost.

12. Social Media -

- A. During the "Election Period" the candidate cannot post on any SCSCAI Facebook Page.
- B. Candidates who have access to Chartered Club mailing lists cannot use their access to the list to campaign.
- C. Candidates cannot post on any SCSCAI or Chartered Club Social Media Account.
- 13. Chartered Club Participation, Meetings and Events Candidates cannot campaign during participation in a Chartered or at Chartered Club meetings or events unless invited to do so by an officer of the Chartered Club.


Currently I sit as a director on my Sub-HOA, and have the understanding and experience of directing an HOA.

In 2013 Norman and Barbara Wright moved to Sun City from New Jersey where he worked as an Infection Preventionist and later as the Director of Nursing in a 180 bed Long Term Care and Rehabilitation Facility supervising over 150 Nursing staff. In 2013 he became the Director of Nursing at Mountain View Care Center in Boulder City and later returned to lead infection prevention initiatives at Royal Springs and Kindred Hospital. He retired from full time work in 2018 to be active in our Sun City community.

Norman was a professional photographer and photographed over 1,500 weddings. Since retiring he became the President of the Photography Club and is active in other clubs. He writes and photographs "Club Spotlight" articles for the LINK and also "Stories of Service" honoring the military service of members from our community who defended our Nation and who continue to do so.

Norman is on the board of the LINK and uses his professional photography experience to work with members of our community promoting our clubs and Sun City in general. However, since February 2020, we have battled COVID, a virus that continues to attack and divide us.

AS A CERTIFIED WHOLISTIC HEALTH EDUCATOR.

I was trained to help clients by examining five areas in their lives: physical, emotional, nutritional, environmental, and spiritual. The goal was to help the person deal with whatever problems they were having by dealing with the "big picture." All well and good!

BUT as one religious leader said to me, "Good intentions pave the road to hell." So, how do we become the best person we can be in the New Year when it's so hard to keep those resolutions? Why do sometimes we feel like we take two steps forward towards our goals only to take a step back? Is there any way to somehow train our brains to reevaluate old habits and create new ones? To help us all improve ourselves in the New Year, I took a mini course on "Neuroplasticity: How to rewire your brain," and would like to share the information with you:

It turns out, you can "teach an old dog new tricks" as our brains are constantly making and building connections. Simply put, the more you shake things up in your world via change, the more connections are built. A brain that isn't challenged ceases to grow and eventually deteriorates. Simple things to help challenge the brain that one can do, and I tried are:

- Shower with your eyes closed. Caution! I did this and to be on the safe side, be sure that you only close your eyes cleansing with your cloth or sponge.
- Try using your non-dominant hand to write yourself a note.
 Do this throughout the day. Doing this exercise, I felt I had to slow down and concentrate so I was more "mindful" of what I was writing.
- Eat something new, paying attention to the texture and taste.

Just shaking up our routine will stimulate the brain! Leave your comfort zone and do something new, be it learning a skill, a language or traveling.

But how do we replace a bad (or old) habit with a new more positive habit? The brain will literally do what you tell it to do but will follow routine. And the brain will resist change if you simply say, "I'm on a diet to lose weight." In fact, the brain may resist in such a way that despite your good intentions you end up eating more than you ever would have. So, what do we do?

Professor Gregory Caremans suggests the following in the mini-course I took:


- Make a list of things you enjoy doing.
- Establish enjoyment with the new habit. By joining the new habit with something you enjoy, the brain easily adapts to the new habit.

Write down a goal or a couple of goals you'd like to work on in this brand New Year. Figure out the baby steps you will take towards this goal.

One final word about whatever goal you choose – be it losing weight, getting fit, becoming more organized in the house, following a new budget; remember this: We humans are a work in progress the whole time we are on earth, and so "slips" or realistically being able to meet even half of your goal is cause for celebration and a pat on the back."

We have a brand new year to look forward to. This is the perfect time to reflect where we'd like to be or what we'd like to accomplish in this coming year, and with a good positive and forgiving attitude, we can do this!

"When you're young, you're encouraged to try new things. At a certain age, nobody says that to you anymore. If you're lucky enough to be alive, why not say yes to all of it at any age?"

Join us for a discussion of emerging investment trends, tips for keeping track of your investments, strategies for spotting and avoiding fraud, and tools offered by financial regulators to help you become a smarter, more informed investor, etc. It is also very important for YOU to know how FINRA and the Nevada Security Division protect you.

FINRA is the single largest independent regulatory body for securities firms operating in the United States. FINRA oversees more than 3,500 brokerage firms, 154,000 branch offices, and nearly 625,000 registered securities representatives, as of 2019. FINRA regulates the trading of equities, corporate bonds, securities futures, and options.

FINRA has the power to fine or ban brokers and brokerage firms that violate its rules. FINRA has 19 offices across the United States and over 3,000 employees. In its enforcement capacity, FINRA has the power to take disciplinary actions against registered individuals or firms that violate the industry's rules. In 2019, FINRA reported that it initiated 854 disciplinary actions, levied fines totaling \$39.5 million, and ordered restitution of \$27.9 million to investors. FINRA expelled 6 member firms and suspended another 21, while barring 348 individuals from the securities business and suspending another 415. In 2019, FINRA referred 827 fraud and insider trading cases to the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and other government agencies for prosecution.

The Nevada Secretary of State's Security Division law imposes a statutory fiduciary duty on Broker-Dealers and Investment Advisers. It prohibits the unethical or dishonest practice in the securities business of utilizing certain "senior designation" certifications, as well as other unethical conduct. It is a violation of the Nevada Uniform Securities Act to make any materially false, fraudulent, or fictitious statement or representation; present as genuine a document or record that has been forged or fraudulently altered; destroy, alter, erase, obliterate, or conceal any document or record with the intent to conceal violations of the Nevada Uniform Securities Act, conceal the identity of any person who has violated the Act, or to delay or hinder an investigation.

The Sun City Smoke Alarm Replacement program is moving along. We are finishing up installations for people who, in many cases, paid for the project just before the start of The Pandemic. They've been patiently waiting almost 2 years!

This is a program of the Las Vegas Fire and Rescue, with some organizational help from the NPT. And, NPT has stepped up to help move things along faster. We recently took over responsibility for scheduling installation appointments. Previously the Fire Service had been doing this. But we know how it goes. Somebody calls you, you don't recognize the number, so you don't answer. That was happening waaay too often for the fire service. They would spend up to 40% of their time just trying to schedule appointments. Now it's done by the NPT so 100% of our installer's time is spent actually installing alarms! How cool is that?!"





LIGHTS ON IN SUN CITY



he people in Sun City that I most admire are the members of the Security Patrol. In speaking with a few of them they agreed, lighting and a few other things are some of the most important things you could do to deter break-ins and burglars.

Your home should look like someone is inside. The simplest solution is that most of the units (both individual and condominium) have a work light right above the kitchen sink that (usually) can be seen from the front and back, depending on your floor plan. Before leaving home, why not turn on a light. Electricians can also install a "timed switch" so the light goes automatically on and off at random times. If you have some lamps, you could purchase timers for about \$5 each. That would be of great importance.

The more lighting the better. The use of LED's, though expensive to purchase, helps with the electric bill. Interior lighting in your home could possibly be the first step.

If you want to go further, exterior lighting is a great example. Lights that are either battery operated or solar

powered cost more, but they come with LED light bulbs. They also have a timer built in that is usually set to go on at dusk and shut off at dawn automatically.

The next step might be to have some wifi-remote lights that YOU could turn off or on with a smart phone (if you have one.) Possibly wrought iron security gates at the front and back doors as well as a security system might be some things to think about.

Another product on the market is clear plastic film that adheres to the interior side of your windows. It provides a barrier to possibly prevent a burglar from breaking in. The purpose of this product is that if some tries to break in through a window, the glass will shatter, but it will stick to the film and still provide a deterrent to open access of your home. The product can also be tinted to cut down on the sun's rays and use less electricity to cool your home. This product has to be professionally installed.

Whatever you do, please make your house look "lived-in!" The worst thing you could do is do nothing!
