Please be aware that COVID-19 is not gone. We all know a friend or relative who has had COVID-19 in the last month. Protect yourself as much as possible and follow the guidelines



## IN HONOR OF JULY 4TH, I FEEL THE MOST AMERICAN WHEN...

wanted to write about how very lucky we are to live in the United States of America despite our country's challenges. I also wanted to ask myself when had I ever felt so grateful to be born in the USA?

The answer came to me almost immediately. Just a few years ago, when I was in my 20's (okay more than a few years ago) my husband and I went on a vacation to the Turks and Caicos Islands. At that time a relatively unknown chain of islands, and an overseas territory of the United Kingdom in the West Indies. The brochures looked promising and though still unknown, we also looked at it as a place to visit that was still "unspoiled." At that time, I hadn't traveled outside the United States that much and was looking forward to an experience of a lifetime, another culture with a different way of life, and I was curious about how "others" lived.

While the "resort" we stayed at was okay, the English owners warned us to be careful of all the mosquitoes because they don't spray for them. When we took a walk around the local area, we discovered open sewer canals the U.S. Army had excavated while stationed there.

The natives were wonderful; they hoped for, but probably, it seemed might never have opportunities to better their lives.

At one point, I had a sore throat and noticed a kind of white nodule in my throat. I went to the clinic, the only medical service on the island. As I waited, a native came in with a leg 3 times its size. When I asked what had happened to him, he said

that he had forgotten to shake his curtain out and a scorpion had stung him. (I have never been able to take a shower since without inspecting the shower curtain.)

While we were put in separate cubicles, there was just a curtain between us. The doctor addressed me first (presumably because I was an American) and told me I needed penicillin to address my sore throat. Then, as I waited for the prescription (which you could get right there at the clinic), I heard him address the native with the scorpion problem saying, "that's quite a sting you have there, I'm going to give you penicillin to address the infection." I soon realized that basically, penicillin was all they had to treat a rainbow of medical problems, which made me feel pretty insecure.

Later, I saw a scuba diver with a broken leg being carried onto the plane on a "stretcher" using only a wooden stick to stabilize her leg.

We left our vacation early. It was the very first time in my life I wanted to literally kiss the ground in Florida when we got off the plane. What I realized was that if more Americans were to experience what I did, they would so value how lucky we all are here.

Even now, in these times, how grateful we should continue to be!

May you relish the 4th of July as much as I do!







Last year we had @120-130 active players. This year we anticipate expanding to 10 teams from our current number of 9.

The Club also has tournament teams. Throughout the Southwest, there are tournaments held every year and our Club enters teams in different age groups. Our teams have won several tourney championships and by doing so qualified for the Tournament of Champions held in Florida. The age groups range from 50 into the 80s. We have a few players over 80!

Our scheduled season ends in May. The season lasts 54 games per team and is followed by play offs. In the Summer, we have pick-up games on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and welcome players of any skill level. We also have batting practice on Saturdays. Our draft is in August for the 10 teams. And, then we start the league up again at the end of September with each team having a different color jersey as selected by the team manager.

At our age, guys who grew up playing baseball move here, see the facility, and say: "Wow, I would like to play again." They see the beautiful Pinnacle Field, and that motivates them to join the Club and get back into playing.

The Club has two leagues: The American League and the National League with 12-13 players per team. The 2 leagues differ in their approach to the game. The American League players are very competitive. These are the guys who are out there to win and play hard. The National League players are there to have fun, exercise and, see their friends in a much more relaxed atmosphere.

And, thanks to the Board of Directors, we will be getting a new scoreboard (to be installed soon)!

#### PICKLEBALL CLUB

Interview with Suzanne Esber, Pickleball Club President

Pickleball is one of the fastest growing sports in the U.S. today having been invented by 3 dads in Bainbridge Island, WA in 1965. It's becoming known as a really fun, friendly game and you can participate as competitively or as socially as you want.

We have 10 Pickleball courts at Desert Vista and about 225 members! Suzanne is blown away by the popularity of the sport. She has received calls from people out of state who are considering moving here and want to make sure that we offer Pickleball!

Just like in tennis you can gravitate to various skill ratings. You can be a 1.0 up to a 6.0+ player, depending on your experience and ability. However, what's nice about Pickleball is that one can learn the game easily and all levels can play together. The equipment is simple – a paddle which is slightly larger than a ping pong paddle and a Wiffle-like ball. Most Club games are placed as doubles, (a foursome) however, the game can be played as singles too. We play on an outdoor court that is smaller than a tennis court and the game is scored to 11 points.

When we introduce people to Pickleball, we get them out on the courts and show them the basic strokes and tell them about the safety tips. Then, they start playing and we coach them where to stand on the court and how to keep score.

We offer novice4 games for beginners as well as challenge games for more advanced players. Depending on a person's experience with a racket or a paddle, we find that those who have played tennis, paddle tennis or ping-pong can get into Pickleball quickly. Our members are willing to play with newcomers and get folks involved. Once people try it, they get hooked!

During the year, we host events to get our club members together to socialize, including picnics and our holiday party. We also have round robins, clinics, Pickle Skills sessions, and Halloween event that we call Pickleboo! It's great fun, featuring trickster games. We also host two (2) charity tournaments a year, and usually get about 125 to 150 club members that will come and play. One is the Toys for Tots in December; the other is the Assistance League of LV in April. Many friendships come out of these events.

### Flying Flags in Sun City Summerlin

othing describes the meaning of flying our American flag better than the brief statement below from the United States Government website.

"The United States flag stands for our nation and the shared history, pride, principles, and commitment of its people. When we properly display this powerful symbol, we signal our respect for everything it represents." — USA.GOV

Many patriotic Sun City Summerlin residents proudly fly their flags every day of the year, signifying that respect, pride, and love for our country. With patriotic holidays approaching, we will see more American flags flying in our neighborhoods and on Sun City's main streets. Additionally, numerous residents have favorite sports teams, holidays or schools, whose flags they would like to display to signify their pride, interest, and loyalty. American flag flying and, flag flying in general, necessarily brings with it a couple of responsibilities.

The Community Standards office wishes to remind everyone that our Development Standards offer a few guidelines that define which flags may be flown, how they may be flown and, in what configuration.

**For Free-standing Flagpoles:** Flagpoles can only be used for displaying USA, US State or US Military flags, with a maximum of two (2) flags flown at the same time. Approved US Military flags are POW/MIA, Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, and Space Force.

For Garage Wall Flag Receptacles: Flag Wall Receptacles a. A maximum of two (2) flag wall receptacles are permitted on any Dwelling; one (1) on either side of the garage door. b. Up to a maximum of a six (6) foot pole may be used to display a flag from a wall receptacle. c. Only one (1) flag may be displayed from a receptacle, no larger than 3' x 5'. d. Additional flags permitted on wall receptacles include themed flags such as holiday/seasonal, or sports teams/colleges.

Please refer to Development Standards. Pages 12–13, Sections D, 1–2–3, for full flag flying details. We also refer you to U.S. Code Title 4, Chapter 1 – The Flag, for all aspects of flag flying, including Important requirements for flying in inclement weather, flying at night, proper lighting, storage, handling, and disposal of worn flags.

Acknowledging that flags do wear out in our hot and windy

climate, the appropriate handling of worn or frayed American flags is an important facet of flag flying. We remind everyone that our own Sun City Security Patrol hosts two formal flag-burning events with the Boy Scouts of America, every year. Residents may deliver their worn flags to the Security Patrol office for proper storage and patriotic disposal at one of their events.





### Time To Hydrate: Make Water Your Best Friend Jessie Miles, Director of Fitness



The heat of the summer makes it prime time for dehydration. And the easiest solution is to drink a lot of water. If you ignore the body's fluid needs, you'll likely experience headaches, dry skin, dizziness or even feeling light-headed. What if you don't like the taste of plain water or don't want to carry a water bottle wherever you go? And how much water do you really need to drink?

### Tips for Staying Hydrated

Cleveland Clinic says, "Water is necessary for nearly every bodily function, from lubricating joints to regulating body temperature and pumping blood to the muscles. So not getting enough of it can have serious health consequences. Many of the earliest signs, like dry mouth, fatigue, dizziness, and muscle cramps are nonspecific and could easily be attributed to other medical conditions, medications, or natural effects of aging."

As we age, the sense of thirst diminishes, and you might not realize when your body needs to be replenished. Dehydration is

a common cause of hospitalization among older adults. The easiest way to check to see if you are dehydrated is to look in the toilet. Your urine should be a pale yellow and if it's darker, then it means to up your fluid intake.

Here is a list of alternatives to plain water that can keep the body hydrated and healthy:

- Add some sparkle. Try seltzer or bubbly water-based drinks.
   Read labels carefully.
- Flavor it up. Add a chunk of fruit (fresh or frozen), cucumber, or sprigs of mint to plain or sparkling water.
- Try a splash of 100 percent juice. You'll skip the extra sugar and calories by adding a splash or two of your favorite juice to flat or fizzy water.
- Turn to fruits and veggies. Almost all fruits and veggies are mostly water (except corn, peas, and potatoes). Cucumbers have the highest water content of any solid food, at 95 percent. Other top choices are celery, cauliflower, spinach, broccoli, dark leafy greens and tomatoes (technically a fruit). You can't go wrong with all fruits, especially watermelon, cantaloupe, strawberries, kiwis, and oranges. If you're monitoring calories, include all produce, but swap out more veggies rather than extra fruit. Salads are the perfect all-in-one meal choice for a fluid boost.
- Think about soup. Hot or cold, you'll get the same hydration choosing a clear or vegetable-based soup. Make your own soup or try some of the blends of "sipping soups" that are single serve and microwaveable.

The "eight glasses of water per day" rule is a general recommendation. If sitting down and drinking a full 8-ounce glass of water is too filling, little sips throughout the day is better and makes hydration an all-day event. Purchase a nice mug, cup, or tumbler that you enjoy drinking from and keep it by you all the time.








### "Update From Mitzi" Coyotes

June 14, 2022

Dear Sun City Summerlin Homeowners and Residents,

I originally sent this notice out on November 7, 2017, to alert homeowners that Sun City Summerlin and surrounding communities are prone to have coyotes and what individuals should do to detour the coyotes away from their homes and to keep their pets safe. Many of you helped by taking "hazing coyotes" seriously and for numerous months sighting of coyotes around the homes have been rare. Recently, I have started getting reports of coyotes in front and back yards so I want to remind each of you of the action and precautions we all have to take. Remember, if you see a coyote near your home (or other homes) send me the address by email so we can go out and look for the den and remove the den. Removing the dens push the coyotes away from the homes without causing any harm to the coyote.

It is always concerning when we see wildlife such as coyotes wandering our community. This is one of the most difficult and controversial concerns that communities across the United States face. Whether it is bears, snakes, raccoons, coyotes, elk, javelina, alligators, bobcats, or other animals, it seems that every community, no matter where they are, is faced with learning how to live with the creatures that inhabited the area before their homes were built.

As each new development is built the wildlife that called the area home is forced to move out during the construction or adapt to the new conditions. Since there is no way to permanently eradicate the wildlife population around us, removing those who have come into the community only makes room for others to move in and results in mother nature increasing the frequency and size of the litters in those remaining.

The best defense is learning to live with the wildlife in this area and develop the defensive skills that make wildlife, such as coyotes, afraid of people. To keep coyotes away from our homes and pets we need to be diligent. So many people tell me if they are golfing and see the coyotes, they just ignore them, however this just makes the coyotes not see people as a threat. Keep your distance and make noise to scare them away, blow a whistle (they hate the sharp sound) – the more we scare them away with noise the more likely they are to retreat to areas where people are scarce. Remove all sources of food from outside your home and put your garbage into cans with lids when it is out for pickup.

### HAZING COYOTES

Hazing coyotes is a widespread practice used in communities to persuade coyotes who have adapted to living in housing communities to retreat into areas away from homes. If coyotes see humans as a food source and very little threat, they will move closer and closer to your homes.

Hazing is a method that Nevada Game and Fish and The Humane Society of the United States recommend. Sun City

Summerlin residents practiced hazing in late 2017 and early 2018 and it resulted in the coyotes moving their dens and hunting grounds away from the homes and common areas, some reported that our residents did too good of a job because in 2018 the rabbit population exploded.

Coyotes are naturally afraid of people, however, living in a community where people do not threaten them in anyway, they lose their fear. Following are the recommended hazing methods to re-establish their instinct to be reclusive and avoid people.

- 1. When you see a coyote wave your arms and yell, make yourself appear as big as possible by waving your arms above your head while you yell as loud as you can.
- 2. Carry a noise maker with you when you are out walking, in your golf cart or on your bike. Coyotes hate shrill, high pitched or loud noise. Use whistles, air horns, bells. Clang pans together or make a "shaker" can full of rocks, coins or marbles. When you see a coyote make noise!
- 3. Throw small rocks, sticks or tennis balls at them. Coyotes see these items as projectiles that could harm them and want to get away.
- 4. In your yard spray them with the hose, and/or carry a spray bottle or squirt gun with vinegar in it to spray them with. Once the vinegar gets on them, they are not able to get it off quickly and they associate the smell with the location and people and usually will not return to that area.

Keep in mind, if a coyote has not been hazed before, it might not immediately run away, this does not mean hazing does not work, it means you need to continue the hazing, get louder, throw more rocks, etc. They coyote may retreat for a distance and then turn to look at you, if it does you need to start up the hazing again.

- 5. **In your yard** remember coyotes can easily jump over a 6-foot fence.
  - a. Do not leave your pet unattended in your yard. Coyotes see your pet as food.
  - b. Do not leave food out in your yard for your pet.
  - c. Pick up after your pet immediately. The smell from your pet's waste tells the coyote there is prey in your yard.
  - d. If a coyote comes in your yard, bang pots together.
  - e. Keep a squirt gun (super soaker) filled with ammonia or vinegar and squirt the coyote.
  - f. Make a lot of noise, they especially do not like the sound of pans being hit together or air horns.

"Personal Independence: You Can Make It Happen"



### "But Wait . . . There's More"

Many remember this from late night TV. Think Ginsu Knives and the Popeil Pocket Fisherman.

Now we can add this phrase to our Sun City Smoke Alarm Replacement Project. Many readers know that Las Vegas Fire and Rescue will replace existing, outdated alarms with new units with a ten-year battery life, and add additional units if needed. All for \$135.

"But wait . . . there's more!"

In our program the more is the combination smoke and Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarm. This goes into every house that is serviced. CO is a deadly colorless, odorless, tasteless gas. You need an alarm to detect it. It can be produced from the natural gas used to heat our homes and cook our food.

"But wait . . . there's more!"

A resident recently called Sun City Administration and explained that her new alarms really did save her life!! The alarms had only been in a couple of days. Then they went off in the middle of the night. Awake, she looked for fire or smoke. Nothing, but the alarms were blaring. So, she called the fire department.

The firefighters used their metering instruments to test for CO. What they found was killer levels in the garage and increasing levels inside the house. They told her that without the alarm, there was a good chance she would not have been alive to greet the dawn. She has since encouraged us to tell her story to others.






### Mah Jongg




