# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



ell summer is almost here, and our pools are filled with residents keeping cool and socializing. I have had the opportunity recently to visit some of our pools and talk with some of our residents using those pools. I am convinced that their attendance at the pools daily has had a positive impact on their lives. They meet, talk, and walk and that has been such a positive for so many of them. I have said it before and will say it again now, Your Board is gratified when we see and hear about residents using our facilities.

The garage sales are behind us. Except for the rain and wind of the first day everyone seemed quite pleased with the format and the results. Even the wind on the other days could not deter the community from shopping and/or selling. I want to thank the Security Patrol for their extra efforts during the garage sale. The Chief and Assistant Chief created a program that they named, "operation swarm". Basically, all five patrol cars were out during the peak hours of the garage sale every day. In addition, for the last two days of the garage sale we had between 20–30 Security Patrol member volunteers put placards in their windows and not only drive around the community during those peak hours but stopped to interact with as many residents as possible who were selling. The patrol members were in uniform and drove either their personal cars or golf carts. *Thank you, Security Patrol*.

While on the subject of Security Patrol. You may have noticed several volunteers driving around the community at dusk. They are looking for homes whose address lights are not working or are so dim as to be ineffective. The patrol members are leaving contact information for the residents as to how and who would be able to help them rectify this situation. Security comes in many forms. This is just one more step in protecting our community.

I attended two Future Planning Committee meetings in the last month. The committee has gathered all the data to be used in finalizing a report. The committee will provide data and comments to the Board but will not make any decisions on what should be done in the future for our community. It is the purpose and goal of the committee to get others talking about where the

community should be going in the next three to five years. Cost will be a major factor to be considered on some of the "wants" of the residents. Drafts of the several sections of the report are done and being finalized. The committee wants to thank the nearly 100 new residents and nearly 500 existing residents who have provided comments and suggestions. The committee will address as many as possible but

frankly some are either too expensive or not practical. The goal of the committee is to have a document to the Board by the end of June. The primary purpose of getting the conversation started and providing the initial "talking points" identified will mean that the committee fulfilled its assignment.

# From My Collection of "Life Changing Thoughts"



don't know about you, but my mother was very protective of her children when it came to lightning. As a storm approached, she'd say "Don't use the telephone, don't go near water, don't stand by a window, no TV!" So I grew up with "an abundance of caution" when it came to lightning. But recently I decided to separate fact from fiction, feeling sure that most of my mother's "Dont's" would be fiction.

To research the "facts," I went to the Center for Disease Control, National Center for Environmental Health, and to my surprise, much of my mother's warnings were correct! Here's what the website says:

Their motto is: "When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors!"

The website offers some interesting examples of caution: The weather forecast indicates a slight chance of thunderstorms and all you see when you look out are some white fluffy clouds, so you and friends go off to

the pool, tennis court, or whatever outside activity, and suddenly you hear thunder.

What do you do, asks the National Center for Environmental Health? Keep swimming or playing until the thunder and lightning get closer, go sit on a metal bench under the trees to see what happens or get in your car and drive home?

The correct answer is that if no substantial, nonconcrete shelter is nearby, get in your car and wait out the storm.

The site goes on to explain, "Why? Because being outside when lightning is present is not something to take lightly – ever."

The article reports that lightning most often strikes people who work outside or engage in outdoor recreational activities. If you are caught in an open area, here are some of the things you can do:

- Get down from elevated areas, such as hills or mountain peaks.
- Never lie flat on the ground, crouch down in a balllike position with your head tucked and hands over your ears.
- Immediately get out of and away from pools, ponds, lakes and other bodies of water.
- Stay away from objects that conduct electricity and concrete floors/walls.

As far as my mother's advice about being indoors and taking safety precautions, the website says that about one-third of lightning strike injuries occur indoors:

- Avoid contact with water; do NOT bathe, shower, wash dishes; lightning can travel through plumbing.
- Avoid electronic equipment of all types.
- Avoid corded phones, they are not safe. Cellular phones are safe to use in a storm.

My mother always said "Better to be safe than sorry."

#### **Pool Etiquette**

It is important to follow a few simple rules for everyone's safety and enjoyment. Each fitness center has facility rules printed at the Fitness Monitor station.

- On-site showering before entering pool is required by the Health District.
- Food and drink are allowed only at the outdoor pools and must be kept at least 4 feet away from water.
- Bottled water is allowed in any pool area. Glass containers, alcohol, and gum are prohibited.
- Children must be 42" tall without shoes.

\* Per Southern Nevada Health District, due to stricter regulations in regards to the sizes of pools and/or gallons of water they hold, the Mountain Shadows Outdoor Pool is required to have dedicated supervision in the pool area during operating hours. We had hoped we could get a waiver on this due to our demographics and the depth of the pool, and while they waived the requirement for us to have lifeguards in the area, we recently learned they are going to require us to have a Monitor stationed in the pool area during the hours the pool is open. We currently have coverage at Mountain Shadows from 6 a.m.-6 p.m. Once fully staffed, operating hours will return to 6 a.m-9 p.m. Mountain Shadows is the only pool impacted by this regulation.

## 'Twas The Night Before Christmas

'Twas the night after Christmas, and as usual I was up. As I passed the bath-

room, (TMI: my wife's bathroom seat is down) I heard water rushing, looked inside, and saw the water gushing. From inside the bathroom, the water was covering the floor with 2 to 3 inches of water throughout most of the house.

I woke my wife, and we went outside. We dialed 911 for the Fire Department. Unfortunately, the Fire Department did not know how to turn off the water to the house. However, they came within 15 minutes, and they brought huge "squeegees" to push the water out of the house. We also called my neighbor because he knew how to turn off the water in the house. Then the mitigation and restoration service arrived with giant fans and dehumidifiers and put them all over the house.


Two days later, the restoration service suggested we evacuate the house because of awful smells and mold was growing. The insurance company had a service to find us a hotel, but they failed because this was just before New Year's Eve and CES would be at the Convention Center, which usually draws about 150,000 visitors to our city.

We were told this might be up to a 3-month stay. We ended up finding a long-term "suite" hotel that had units with more than one room. We found one near the airport and we were very comfortable for 68 days!

We are writing this article to inform our residents that this could happen to anyone. We were mostly prepared because I keep all my medications in large clear plastic shoe boxes. We also were given many cardboard boxes to pack clothes and other things we might need. My wife also packed many important documents and papers which we also needed.

The restoration company took a little over two months. They had to replace the bottom three feet of most walls as well as rip up the carpeting and the tiling throughout the whole house. Most of the furniture had to be removed and stored in a special warehouse. Some furniture was even given to the "Furniture Medic" to repair and restore the bottom 3 to 4 inches. Most of the rooms were either partially or completely painted. The house was completely dried out and then all new flooring, both carpet and vinyl "wood" flooring, was installed. We chose both the new carpeting and other flooring ourselves. In addition, all new baseboards were installed.

Our home now looks like a brand new house and our warning is *be prepared for anything*. Also, make sure that you have *enough home insurance* to cover an emergency like this!

The Pet Officers used our chip reader to find the name of the owner . . . who no longer owned the dog. What to do, what to do.


The dog info was put on various social media sites. And we got a hit. The dog's real, current owner called and claimed his pet.

# COMMUNITY STANDARDS

#### **Exterior Residential Lighting**





iven the need to improve the security of our homes, we have a myriad of new and improved lighting options to select from. Many of the newer lights are LED-based and give off much more light – as well as brightness and glare – than the standard older floodlights.

While we welcome the enhanced security these lights provide, we are also aware that, if these brighter lights are not properly aimed, they can become intrusive and offensive to surrounding neighbors, walkers and, even drivers. Incorrectly aimed lights can be considered "nuisances" if they are improperly placed and could lead to complaints, which will need to be remedied via the Community Standards formal complaint process.

The best way to avoid lighting complaints is to be sure that lights are aimed downward, where they can do their job, but not be offensive to their surroundings. Also, correct placement on your home is crucial because poorly placed lights are often ineffective and a waste of energy. Importantly, properly placed lighting can also provide a measure of pleasing aesthetics.

Security professionals tend to prefer flood-type lighting that lights up broader areas, rather than concentrated beams that are said to decrease the deterrence-effect. Professionals encourage placing lighting closer to rooflines to make them more secure from tampering and to broaden the light-flooding effects on the ground. Some security professionals also prefer

"motion detector" lights, which tend to provide a "surprise effect" and may be more likely to drive would-be thieves away.

While we do not recommend any particular system or lighting fixture, we suggest that the placement of exterior security and other lighting on your home should be done with some forethought and consideration of the above points.

There are a great number of lighting options available, and it is important to choose what is best for your application. Security lights can be expensive. Their selection deserves your time and attention if they are to provide maximum benefits and minimize surround neighbor issues.

#### Landscape And Miscellaneous Exterior Lighting

We bring to your attention the following from page 9, Lighting – sections e. and f. in the Sun City Development Standards manual.

e: "Clear garden/landscape lights, including regular and

solar powered lights, are permitted in landscaped yard areas. Spotlights are acceptable, providing they do not intrude on surrounding property, common areas or street. Hard wired systems must have cables buried."

f: "Decorative miniature clear lights may be permanently installed on trees, shrubs, front and back patios."

Temporary colored Holiday lights are permissible as long as they adhere to the Association's install and take-down dates.

Regardless of use, the placement and installation of lighting on the outside of your home must follow the Standards and they require pre-approval from the Community Standards office. Applications are available on-line or at the Standards office located in the Mountain Shadows Community Center building.

### RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SUN CITY SUMMERLIN COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, INC. <u>PUBLICATION & DECORUM POLICY</u>

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is authorized under Nevada Law, the Association's Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions ("CC&Rs"), and Bylaws to promulgate rules and regulations in connection with the operation of the Association pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes ("NRS") §§ 116.3102, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a);

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has consulted with legal counsel retained to determine and confirm that its Publication Policy complies with Nevada law (NRS 116.001 *et seq.*), and the Association's CC&Rs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has obtained the opinion of legal counsel that the adoption and imposition of rules proposed by this resolution outlining the Association's rules relating to limitations or restrictions placed upon a unit owner's ability to publish material through the Association's sources of publication and submit remarks at meetings in accordance with NRS 116.31035, NRS 116.3108, NRS 116.31083, and NRS 116.3109;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Association adopts the following rules and regulations for all persons in the community and imposition of penalties apply for violation thereof:

- 1. Applicability: This Policy shall apply to all publications and remarks governed by NRS 116.31035, NRS 116.3108, NRS 116.31083, and NRS 116.3109 and Unit Owners' rights related thereto as well as publications and remarks submitted by clubs or residents for inclusion in Official Sources of Publication. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- 2. <u>Definition of Official Association Publication:</u> Official Association Publications are publications or statements that the Board of Directors has approved by a majority vote prior to its distribution through the Association's Official Sources of Publication that contain any mention of a candidate or ballot

question, views or opinions of the Association, the Board, Association Management or an officer, employee or agent of the Association concerning an issue of official interest. For the avoidance of doubt, the definition of Official Association Publication excludes any publications or statements that are distributed through the Association's Official Sources of Publication or other similar forum without the prior approval by the majority vote of the Board of Directors, are not and will not be deemed an Official Association Publication subject to this Policy and will not be subject to Unit Owners' rights under NRS 116.31035.

- **3.** <u>Definition of Remarks:</u> Remarks are the materials, remarks, comments or other information made at a meeting of the Association, by a unit owner (or guest where permitted by the Board) or submitted by a unit owner (or guest where permitted by the Board) to be included in the minutes of a meeting of the units' owners. [NRS §§ 116.3108, 116.31083, 116.3109; Roberts Rules of Order ("RONR") (11<sup>th</sup> ed.) § 43; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- **4.** <u>Definition of Official Sources of Publication:</u> Official Sources of Publication include, but are not limited to, the following sources of publication that are maintained under the control and direction of the Board: 1) an official website; 2) an official newsletter or other similar publication that is circulated to each Unit Owner (Link Magazine); or 3) an official bulletin board that is available to each Unit Owner. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- **5.** <u>Definition of Unit Owner Publication:</u> Unit Owner Publications are publications distributed through the Association's official sources of publication as a result of a Unit Owner's request to exercise their rights under NRS 116.31035 or permissively submitted by a club or resident. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- **6.** <u>Definition of Issues of Official Interest:</u> Issues of official interest are: (1) issues on which the Board of Directors or Unit Owners will be voting as further addressed herein, including, without limitation, elections (hereinafter referred to as "Voting Issues"); and (2) the enactment or adoption of rules or regulations that will affect the Association. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)
- 7. Qualification of Voting Issues: Voting Issues are limited to Association issues that the Board of Directors or Unit Owners will be voting on in accordance with the requirements of Nevada law and/or issues that the Board of Directors or Unit Owners will be voting on pursuant to the requirements of the Association's governing documents. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- 8. Official Association Publications That Simply Identify Issues of Official Interest Do Not Trigger the Unit Owner Publication Rights Under NRS 116.31035: Official Association Publications that simply identify Issues of Official Interest without further description shall not be deemed to trigger the Unit Owner Publication Rights of NRS 116.31035. Examples of such potential Official Association Publications are documents objectively identifying candidates and/or ballot questions. Unit Owner Publication Rights of NRS 116.31035 are not triggered in such scenarios because as detailed in this Policy, Unit Owner Publications are limited to the same terms and conditions applicable to reciprocal Official Association Publications and therefore Unit Owners would not maintain the authority to publish any description/information additional to what was already identified in the Official Association Publication, e.g. candidates and/or ballot questions. Requiring the Association to subject itself to the time and

cost of having to distribute an identical Official Association Publication runs contrary to the purpose of the law and therefore NRS 116.31035 will not be interpreted in such a manner. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]

- **9.** Publications Are Strictly Limited to the Topic(s) of the Reciprocal Official Association Publication: Publications that may be produced by Unit Owners pursuant to NRS 116.31035 must be limited to the topic(s) discussed and/or at issue within the reciprocal Official Association Publication. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- Terms and Conditions Applicable to Reciprocal Official Association Publications: Publications that may be produced by Unit Owners pursuant to NRS 116.31035 are restricted to the parameters in which reciprocal Official Association Publications are contained. Such parameters, dependent upon the Source of Official Publication, may include, but are not limited to, font size, number of words, number of pages, number of images, time constraints for audio and/or audiovisual publications, and other applicable format terms and conditions. Such parameters shall include identification of the person(s) making the statements for publication. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- 11. Unit Owners Must Submit to the Association Their Request to Exercise Their Rights Under NRS 116.31035 Within Ten (10) Days of the Publishing of the Association Publication Applicable to the Unit Owners' Request: Unit Owners must submit to the Association their request to exercise their rights under NRS 116.31035 within ten (10) days of the publishing of the Association Publication applicable to the Unit Owner's request. Unit Owners must submit such request in writing to Association Management via certified U.S. Mail, other certified delivery service, or hand delivery. Requests may not be submitted via electronic mail and any attempts to submit such requests through electronic mail will not be recognized. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]
- 12. <u>Publications and Remarks Must Not Contain Inappropriate Statements:</u> As more specifically delineated herein, Publications and Remarks must not contain any statements, art, or information that is defamatory, libelous, profane, violent and/or threatening, derogatory, or denigrating.
  - A. The terms defamatory, libelous, profane, violent and/or threatening, derogatory, denigrating or disparaging shall bear the meaning of such terms as established by Nevada statute, Nevada common law, general common law, generally accepted definitions (ex: Webster's Dictionary), as well as the definitions/restrictions set forth within these rules.
  - B. Defamatory and/or libelous statements include, but are not limited to, statements where an assertion of fact and/or an opinion harmful to the reputation of another is presented as factual but fails to be substantiated by supporting documentation establishing the fact(s) presented: (a) for Publications, within three (3) days of the Association's notice of a violation and/or non-conformance with these rules or request/demand for supporting documentation; (b) Remarks may be addressed immediately by the Board of Directors during a meeting without prior notice and despite the provision of supporting documentation because such averments at a meeting violate RONR (11th

ed.) for decorum.

- 1. Allegations of criminal acts must be supported with documentation establishing the facts presented, which must include, at a minimum, official court records demonstrating a conviction for the act alleged. Absent such documentary proof of an allegation of a criminal act, the allegation shall be treated as defamatory under these rules.
- 2. Allegations of a person's lack of ability and/or fitness for trade, business, or profession must be supported with documentation establishing the facts presented, which must include, at a minimum, a record demonstrating a criminal and/or civil adjudication by a court, commission, or arbitrator affirming the assertion at issue or a settlement or stipulated determination affirming the assertion at issue. Absent such documentary proof an allegation of a person's lack of ability and/or fitness for trade, business, or profession shall be treated as defamatory under these rules.
- 3. For Publications the Association may demand that a Unit Owner submit supporting documentation establishing the fact(s) presented by a Unit Owner through any means that may be documented, e.g. email, mailing of a letter including such demand, affidavit confirming oral demand made upon Unit Owner.
- 4. The Association reserves the right to deem any statement harmful to the reputation of another that is veiled as an opinion but presented as factual to be a statement of fact upon which supporting documentation may be required by the Association.

- E. A derogatory statement is one which includes, but is not limited to, racial, sexist, homophobic, demeaning statements and/or statements that may be found to attack or threaten an individual based upon their national origin, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, physical disability, or mental disability.
- F. A denigrating or disparaging statement is one which includes, but is not limited to, statements that attack the character, reputation, mental state, and/or capabilities of an individual.
- G. Statements utilizing the words "fraud," "liar," or "lie" in reference to another unit owner, resident, or employee of the Association violate this policy.
- H. Any statements which are defamatory, libelous, profane, violent and/or threatening, derogatory, or denigrating violate this Policy. The Association is not obligated to distribute or produce any statements that contain information believed to be defamatory, libelous, profane, derogatory, denigrating or disparaging. Persons making

such statements during a meeting of the Association may be immediately censured. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; RONR (11th ed.) § 43; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]

13. Permissive Publications Must Not Contain
Inflammatory Statements: In addition to not including
Inappropriate Statements as set forth herein, publications that are submitted to the Association for publication in the Official
Sources of Publication must not include inflammatory statements. Inflammatory statements include, but are not limited to, any opinion on politics, national origin, sex, religion, race, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression. The Association's Official Sources of Publication are intended for sharing information about community events and not the opinions of clubs or residents that other residents may consider controversial. This section does not apply to Unit Owner Publications provided pursuant to the exercise of publication rights under NRS
116.31035. This section applies to Link Magazine but does not apply to other Association publications.

14. The Association Reserves the Right to Refuse to Publish Any Unit Owner Publication or Allow Remarks that Fail to Comply With the Requirements of this Policy: Should a Unit Owner submit a Unit Owner Publication to the Association for Publication or Remark for inclusion in meeting minutes that fails to comply with the requirements of this policy the Association may refuse to publish such publication or include such remark. The Board of Directors may immediately suspend a unit owner's right to speak at a meeting in the event the unit owner's remarks at the meeting violate this Policy. [NRS §§ 116.3102, 116.31035, 116.31065; CC&R, Art. XII, §§ 1 and 2; and Bylaw § 6.1(a)]

Statements by Board Members. Because all Board members have an opportunity to contribute before such publications or statements are deemed an Official Association Publication, Board members may not distribute through the Association's Official Sources of Publication or other similar forum publications or statements that are inconsistent with the Official Association Publication and thereby also inconsistent with fiduciary obligations imposed upon a Board member by NRS 116.3103. designated in writing by the unit's owner within thirty (30) days of the date of execution below and electronically mailed to any electronic address provided for such notices. Said resolution shall be effective thirty (30) days after the date of such notice, which may be proven by a proof of mailing and/or delivery retained in the Association's records.

THE RULES ESTABLISHED BY THIS RESOLUTION shall be effective and remain effective from the date set forth herein until such time as they may be amended, abolished, changed, or otherwise eliminated by the Association's Board of Directors.

INCORPORATION INTO OMNIBUS RULE DOCUMENT, subsequent to and in accordance with this Resolution, the Association may incorporate the rules and regulations established within this Resolution into a single, omnibus, document containing other rules and regulations for the Association. The language of the Resolution must be incorporated into such an omnibus document in the same manner as it is set forth herein. Incorporation of the language of this Resolution into an omnibus document shall be considered a courtesy or convenience to residents and shall in no way be construed to require the delivery or mailing of the omnibus rules to remain effective. The rules established by this Resolution shall be effective and remain effective from the date set forth herein until such time as they may be amended, abolished, changed, or otherwise eliminated by the Association's Board of Directors.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has consulted with legal counsel retained in order to confirm that the Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy adopted pursuant to this Resolution complies with Federal law (42 U.S.C. §§ 3601 *et seq.*), Nevada law (NRS 116.001 *et seq.*), and the Association's CC&Rs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has obtained the opinion of legal counsel that the adoption and imposition

of the Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy proposed by this Resolution conforms to the requirements for rules adopted by community associations pursuant to NRS 116.31065; and

WHEREAS, the rules and regulations of the Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy are in addition to the rules and regulations previously established by the Association, but should a rule or regulation previously adopted by the Association conflict with the rules and regulations provided in the Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy, that rule shall be deemed and read to conform to and/or be superseded by the rules provided within the Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Association adopts the following Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy as specifically set forth herein:

- 1. Individuals within the Association Shall Not Threaten the Health, Safety, and Welfare of the Association and Individuals therein or Otherwise Create a Hostile Environment in the Association [NRS 116.3102, 116.31031, 116.31065, 116.31184, and 116.4117; CC&Rs §§ IV(2)(h), IV(2)(aa), and V(3); Bylaws §§ 6.1(a) and 6.2(b)]: A member of the Board of Directors, an officer of the Association, a unit's owner, resident, tenant, or guest of the unit owner, resident, or tenant shall not, without legal authority, be permitted by any act, omission, conduct, or by any other means, to threaten the health, safety, and welfare or otherwise engage in a course of conduct which causes harm or serious emotional distress (or reasonable apprehension thereof to that person), or creates a hostile environment for any other person who is the community manager; an agent or employee of that community manager; a member of the executive board; an officer, an employee, or agent of the Association; another unit's owner or resident; a guest or tenant of a unit's owner; a vendor; or a contractor.
- 2. Harassment or Other Conduct which May Create a Hostile Environment [NRS 116.3102, 116.31031, 116.31065, 116.31184, and 116.4117; CC&Rs §§ IV(2)(h), IV(2)(aa), and V(3); Bylaws §§ 6.1(a) and 6.2(b)]: Harassment or other conduct which may create a hostile environment shall include, but is not be limited to: a) physical violence and/or threats of physical violence or other harm; b) verbal abuse; c) intimidation; d) bullying; e) physical abuse; f) committing any

tortious acts; g) committing any criminal acts; h) using profane language; i) yelling or screaming in a manner to offend or intimidate individuals within the community; j) discrimination and/or discriminatory conduct on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicap, sexual orientation, and gender identity or expression; or k) unwelcome conduct that is sufficiently severe or pervasive as to interfere with the use, provision, or enjoyment of a home, Association facility, or service. Hostile environment harassment does not require a change in the economic benefits, terms, or conditions of the dwelling or housing-related services or facilities, or of the residential real estate transaction.

3. Determination of Harassment or Other **Conduct which May Create a Hostile** Environment [NRS 116.3102, 116.31031, 116.31065, 116.31184, and 116.4117; CC&Rs §§ IV(2)(h), IV (2)(aa), and V(3); Bylaws §§ 6.1(a) and 6.2(b)]: The Board shall determine, in its sole discretion, whether acts occurring within the Association create a hostile environment or constitute harassment. Acts may be deemed to create a hostile environment or harassment regardless of whether they occur in person or through other communication mediums. Whether harassment or other conduct which may create a hostile environment occurred or exists depends upon the totality of the circumstances. Factors to be considered include, but are not limited to, the: (a) the nature of the conduct, (b) the context in which the incident(s) occurred, (c) the severity, scope, frequency, duration, and location of the conduct, and (d) the relationships of the persons involved. Neither psychological nor physical harm must be demonstrated to prove that harassment or other conduct which may create a hostile environment occurred or exists. Evidence of psychological or physical harm may, however, be relevant in determining whether a harassment or other conduct which may create a hostile environment existed or occurred and, if so, the severity of the violation and related fines that may be imposed. Whether conduct is sufficiently severe or pervasive as to constitute harassment or other conduct which may create a hostile environment is evaluated from the perspective of a reasonable person in the aggrieved person's position.

- 4. Interpretation Consistent with State and Federal Law: Harassment or other conduct which may create a hostile environment under this policy/rule shall be interpreted in a manner consistent with the laws governing such terms under both state and federal laws, including, but not limited to, the chapters, codes, and sections of law generally referred to as 42 U.S.C. §§ 3601 et seq, NRS 116.001 et seq., and the regulations and cases arising thereunder.
- 5. Violations of this Resolution May be Deemed a Health, Safety and Welfare Violation [NRS 116.3102, 116.31031, 116.31065, 116.31184, and 116.4117; CC&Rs §§ IV(2)(h), IV (2)(aa), and V(3); Bylaws §§ 6.1(a) and 6.2(b)]: Any violation of this Resolution by any member of the Board of Directors, an officer of the Association, a unit's owner, resident, tenant, or guest of the unit owner, resident, or tenant who violates this section may be deemed a threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the Association; a member of the executive board; an officer, an employee, or agent of the Association; another unit's owner or resident; a guest or tenant of a unit's owner. 
