## **Letter From The Executive Director**

#### **Building A Sense Of Community**

Since beginning my position as Executive Director of Sun City Summerlin, I have met so many wonderful homeowners; and in talking with them about the community a strong sense of urgency has been expressed to me regarding the rise in community burglaries.

A safer community can be achieved through effective communication among residents and their neighbors. This is

why I am inviting each resident to begin participation in a new program that is coming to our community through the City of Las Vegas, Neighborhood Watch. Some of the benefits of enacting a Neighborhood Watch program include deterring criminal activity, building bonds with neighbors, stimulating neighborhood awareness, providing

instruction to residents on how to observe and report suspicious activities and encouraging residents to work collaboratively to build a better community.

In addition to communicating more effectively with neighbors and Neighborhood Watch groups, direct communication with local law enforcement is critical. We are fortunate to have our all-volunteer patrol service; however, a Neighborhood Watch program will involve both the residents as well as representatives from the Metropolitan Police Department. Metro will assist in ensuring the effectiveness of the Neighborhood Watch program by providing training, equipment and specifically assigned officers. The officers who are assigned to a particular neighborhood attend watch program meetings and inform the watch group on the

types of crimes to be on the alert for by providing reports from the surrounding area.

A Neighborhood Watch program can make Sun City Summerlin a safer community for all. I encourage all residents to get to know their neighbors. Aside from the benefit of increased public safety, a Neighborhood Watch can

make a more friendly and pleasant community for all who call Sun City Summerlin home.

Copies of the minutes in their entirety can be purchased for 10 cents per page at the Administration office 30 days after the meeting.

- The Board of Directors unanimously approved for the staff to go out for bids on the Mountain Shadows renovation project. The project is now budgeted at \$200,000 in the Reserve Study ending FY 2013.
- The Board of Directors approved Snell & Wilmer's offer of settlement of disputed legal fee amount with SCSCAI in connection with property tax appeal by agreeing to pay Snell & Wilmer \$9,787.10 (a reduction of \$10,000) of the disputed amount, but not paying \$931.50 for work on a federal tax matter that was not requested by SCSCAI.
- The Board of Directors acknowledged the rate increase of attorney Jim Susa, Snell & Wilmer, from the hourly rate of \$405 to \$410, beginning January 2013.

## • The Board of Directors approved a motion to "not" appeal the 2013-2014 tax year property tax assessment on community facilities.

- The Board of Directors approved the engagement letter from Jackson Lewis regarding representation of SCSCAI in connection with an EEOC claim.
- The Board of Directors moved that the Legal Services Committee recommend a new general counsel firm that deals with NRS116 and HOA issues to the BOD.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved that the Board resolve to endorse a strong Worker's Comp "Return to Work Policy" for SCSCAI and instruct staff to develop one ASAP.

confidence, and promotes heart health, general health and brain function.

Strength is the most often neglected element of fitness in the 50-plus crowd. As we age we lose muscle mass. Our muscles contribute to the support and stability of our joints. An arthritic knee joint, for example, needs as much muscular support as it can get, since the cartilage is compromised.

Functional strength is the real world use of our muscles. Getting out of a car, climbing stairs, getting out of the bathtub, carrying groceries and opening a jar are all examples of functional strength. Strength training gives us the ability to perform these activities that, in turn, gives us the confidence we need to live day to day.

We are never too old to get fit. Eighty-year-old muscle will respond by getting stronger just as 18-year-old muscle will. Walking, as our sole form of exercise, will not provide enough range or load to effectively recruit sufficient muscle mass to restore or preserve the functional strength we need.

Remember that a fitness program should address strength, endurance, cardio or aerobic activity, flexibility and balance. You can start now by attending an equipment orientation class or one of our group fitness classes.



## **Common Area Properties (CAP)**

#### Landscape Inspections Ensure Blooming Beauty



Each month, an inspector with the Common Area Properties Committee climbs into Louis Darling's truck to ride around the community and check for landscaping-related issues. Louis is the director of landscape for Sun City Summerlin, and he is extremely knowledgeable about all of the plants in our community.

The inspection takes the two on a circuit of Del Webb, Sun City, Thomas Ryan, Lake Mead and Rampart boulevards and Anasazi Drive. Within the community, both sides of the streets and the medians are scrutinized, as well as both sides and the median of Lake Mead boulevard, west of Anasazi Drive. From there, only the north side of Lake Mead boule-

vard is ours, along with the west side of Anasazi Drive and the west side of Rampart Boulevard.

The inspection team is looking for any dead or dying plants, whether they are trees, bushes or ground-cover plants. The goal is to identify, as soon as possible, the areas that require the attention of our Landscape Maintenance staff. It is not unusual for Louis to get on his radio during the ride to immediately direct his staff to an unsightly area. Of course, they also watch for any apparent watering problems. Louis is especially good at knowing when a plant looks stressed due to lack of water.

Louis is careful to let the inspector know of all the plans to work on various areas, especially where the watering system is being reconstructed, new flowering plants are to be placed or replacement plants are imminent. Winter inspections are a challenge due to the deciduous trees, and many plants are simply placed on the watch list to return for a look as new growth begins in the spring.

Our Landscape Department does an outstanding job of keeping up with all of our common area landscaping, making our community one of the most beautiful in the Las Vegas Valley. We can thank our very dedicated Director, Louis Darling, for our wonderful aesthetics. His caring shows!

## Landscape

#### Time to Love Your Lantanas



Spring marches on, and if the weather holds up it will be time to wake up your garden soon. One thing you can do now is trim and fertilize your lantanas. The landscape department will resume its fertilizing programs, and I suggest you do the same. As I normally say, "Always be sure to use a well-balanced fertilizer. And, if you can add organic material to your plants, then do so." I know it can be difficult, but if you add organics, your plants will love you.

#### A few quick reminders on how to do it:

- Rake back the decorative rock from around your plants and spread mulch, soil conditioners and fertilizer
- Lightly cultivate the mixture into the soil
- Spread your rock back over the area.
- Water thoroughly when you are done.
- Keep in mind you do not need to do all your plants at the same time.



Be alert and report unusual vehicles, loiterers, trucks with no visible identification, anyone with a clipboard who appears to be canvassing homes, or a stranger looking into a mailbox to the Security Patrol.

Burglars see Security Patrol cars driving through the community. Often, that is enough to deter them. Drivers wave to let everyone know they have seen them and they develop instincts to spot something out of the ordinary. Patrol Officers know dog-walkers, when and where they walk and even their pet's name. They become familiar with landscapers, mail carriers, bike riders, joggers, and they recognize residents who regularly walk in certain areas.

It was daytime when an open garage door off Button Willow Drive caught Security Patrol Chief Lou Polizzotti's attention. Lou said, "Something about it didn't seem right." After finding no one at the house, Lou relayed the address to the Patrol dispatcher, who called the resident's Emergency Contact Number. Sure enough, the resident was away and the garage should not have been open. It was one of 238 garage doors that patrol officers discovered and had secured last month.


Other items to consider to help boost your security at home include:

• Always keep car keys nearby if they have an alarm button. If you hear a noise outside your home, don't hesitate to

depress the key alarm to activate the car's horn. Don't worry about waking a neighbor; the loud horn will discourage any intruder.

- If your dog barks at night, do not try to quiet him/her. He/she senses something outside that you don't hear. Let them bark; that's their job.
- It is always important to lock the door between the garage and your home. Do not rely on a closed garage door for absolute security. Garage doors can be breached. Lock your car doors while the car is inside the garage.

#### Sun City Survey Results Turned Over to Department Managers

Because there were so many comments (about 5,000 total), I just can't address each individual comment so, you ask, what did we do with the responses? Section three of the Policies and Procedures manual provides a detailed description of the SCSCAI committee structure. The various committees are responsible for certain aspects

of our community, such as Common Area Properties, Finance, Legal Services and so on. Committee members are residents just like you who look at issues and make recommendations to the SCSCAI Board of Directors when needed. Each month the Link publishes a calendar showing the date when each committee meets. To highlight one very busy committee, the Common Area Properties Committee, which is responsible for our facilities and grounds, you will see how members are tasked to tour each facility on a regular basis to determine needed improvements. Your comments concerning our properties were referred to that committee for consideration.

Equally, all survey comments were sent to the appropriate committees for consideration.

Many of the recommendations were contradictory (too much vegetation/too little vegetation; pools too hot/pools too cold). Committee members are busy sorting through all responses to arrive at the best decision based on their experience. (Note that residents are encouraged to attend committee meetings if they want to partake in discussions about particular comments.) Don't wait for another survey if you want to make a recommendation on making things better. Instead, go to the appropriate committee meeting and make your thoughts known.

One last point on the comments received: Even if approved, implementation can take some time due to budget issues or the prioritization of in-house manpower.

Please believe that we do care. I have read EVERY one of the almost 600 resident responses. Thank you so much for taking the time to help make Sun City Summerlin a better place to live.

#### **Keeping Residents Safe**

What: Sheltering In Place When: March 14, 7 p.m. Where: Desert Vista

It is 8 p.m., the wind is gusting at 50 to 60 miles per hour, your lights are flickering, it has been raining all over the valley for eight hours, all streets are flooded and the water in your back yard covers your patio.

Are you prepared; will you be ready?

If you live in Sun City Summerlin, you will be ready.

Your Sun City Summerlin Preparedness Committee (CPC) has been working for the last two years to prepare a plan to face such an emergency and we're initiating a new series of meetings with the community to ensure that our residents will be ready also.

Our first meeting will be on Sheltering In Place, March 14, 7 p.m., at the Desert Vista community center.

CPC and the Sun City Security Patrol will be co-

sponsoring a presentation by the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's Homeland Security/Emergency Management Bureau to discuss the concept of "sheltering in place" for 72 hours.

They will discuss making a plan and building a kit that will get residents through a natural disaster for the first 72 hours, or until professional help arrives.

This will be the first of several classes that the CPC will conduct over the next few months, featuring speakers from the Red Cross for CPR training; Las Vegas Fire & Rescue, NV Energy, Southwest Gas, the Las Vegas Water District and the Las Vegas and Clark County Emergency Response teams.

In addition, we will continue our program of training community volunteers to become members of our Community Emergency Response Team (CERT).

Our goal is to make Sun City Summerlin the safest community in the country.
