

Make Your Appointment Now for Free IRS Tax Filing



AARP volunteers are hard at work helping residents file their tax returns. The service is free and takes place Thursdays and Fridays in the Mint Room at Mountain Shadows community center. Appointments are required and may be made in person with the Social

Monitor at Mountain Shadows. Taxpayers need to bring in a copy of last year's return and social security cards, along with all W2s, 1099 R, INT, DIV, MISC, social security SSA-1099, W2G and broker statements with purchase date and cost of any stocks or bonds sold. Add 1095-A if health insurance was purchased through Nevada Health Link. You also will need receipts for itemized deductions for medical expenses, mortgage interest, real estate taxes paid, gifts to charity and any other miscellaneous deductions. Preparers file electronically with the Internal Revenue Service; paper returns are not permitted. Also note that volunteers cannot prepare state returns or returns with rental, business or partnership (K-1) income, other than simple interest, dividends and capital gains. 

Nutrition 101

- Make half your plate fruits and vegetables
- Choose low-fat dairy, skim or 1% milk
- Make at least half your grains whole grains

- Pay attention to portion control
- Drink plenty of water



Turf Reduction Tops Committee's Project List

The following information was submitted by Common Area Properties Chairman Bruce Alitt. CAP meets at 9 a.m. on the second Tuesday of the month inside the Committee Room at Desert Vista. This month's meeting is scheduled for March 10.

- **1.** CAP continues its regular property inspections.
- **2**. CAP has reviewed and approved for submission to the Board of Directors the fiscal year 2016 golf course turf reduction plan submitted by SCSCAI Golf Maintenance Director Brian Bagwell. The estimated area is 300,000 square feet. The net cost to the Association after the Southern Nevada Water Authority rebate will be negligible and the savings in water costs will be in excess of \$20,000 per year.



- **3**. The golf course turf reduction for FY 2015 is complete. While final figures are not in the costs, they will be significantly under the SNWA rebate amount.
- **4.** The FY 2016 common area turf reduction plan is nearing completion. The actual work on the FY 2015 turf reduction is well under way and should be completed on schedule.
- **5**. The initial FY 2016 capital expenditure plan was submitted by the executive director during the January meeting. It is being reviewed.

Landscape

March Is Prime Time to Trim Lantanas

March is the time to get your garden ready for the growing season. It's time to trim your lantanas. You may have noticed that the Landscape Department has trimmed some early this year, but only the yellow ones. We will trim the others now. Why only the yellow? In the past, they have proven to be more accepting of the early trimming time than the others. If this proves to be effective, I will pass the information on to you.

Also, it's a good time to fertilize your plants and start your feeding programs, as you are well aware the soil here is very bad and has very little nutrients in it. So, feeding is very important to the health of your plants. If you can add organic material such as mulch or compost, your plants will love you for it.

We are still working on turf and plant reduction throughout the community and will continue to do so. This will save on water, which will save you money. We will work hard on these changes so that they will be beautiful.

The Landscape Department is watering turf on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays at night/early morning; drip



is watering on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at night. I hope everyone has a wonderful spring.

Emergency Contact Card Is Most Valuable Thing You Can Carry



Who Am I? Do you carry an identification card with you? This card should have your name, address, and the name and phone number of someone who can be called if you are in an accident or become ill when you may be bike riding, walking with your dog, or just out walking alone. Time becomes a critical factor for emergency responders to properly treat you, or contact someone who can make decisions about your care. "When time is of the essence, a basic identification card could save minutes and maybe even your life", said Sun City Summerlin resident Dick Bennett, Las Vegas Metropolitan's Citizens Volunteer Program Site Supervisor. Are you diabetic? Do you have allergies? Are you taking medication? "Answers to these questions can accelerate your treatment when time counts," said Dick. Your identification card should be carried in a pocket separate from your wallet or purse.

Cell Phones. When asked if they carry identification at all times, residents often answer, "I have my cell phone." Your cell phone number can be traced back to you in an emergency, but this will take time, explained Sun City resident Barry Jacobson. "It's not the best method of identification if you are hurt or disoriented," he said. A suggestion is to list the number of the person you want contacted in your cell phone directory as Emergency Contact. If you put a space at the beginning it will be the first number that shows up in your cell phone directory.

Emergency Contact. This blue form from Security Patrol is one of the most vital information sources that residents should have on file. It tells Patrol volunteers who to contact if there is an emergency situation at your home. If letters are piling up in your mailbox, or a watchful neighbor worries that they have not seen you and no one is answering your

telephone or door bell, Security Patrol needs to know who you want them to contact. We want to believe that bad things never will happen to us, but in an unexpected incident a simple emergency contact could make the difference between life and death. Vial of Life and Emergency Contact forms are available at Security Patrol headquarters.



Vial of Life. The red emergency sticker on your front door or window alerts emergency responders that your personal medical information is in a packet that is adhered to your refrigerator. This is where to list medical conditions, medicines that you are taking, allergies, doctor names and insurance information. If you are incoherent, hospital personnel will have vital information to efficiently treat you.

Just the Facts.

In one month, patrol cars drove **15,331** miles throughout the community. Patrol drivers had **241** open garage doors secured after dark, and **558** vacationing residents' homes were checked.
