From the Executive Director

Are you being fair to your fellow residents?

I am writing about a very sensitive subject that all of us should think about as we go through our daily routines here in Sun City. We all know that the residents of the 7,781 homes pay equally for the expenses of our community even if they all don't use them equally and we hope that a few aren't causing more expense for

Unfortunately, we do have a few who abuse the community and cause extra expenses that all of us are bearing. Simple examples are

taking more than your share of food at a free SCSCAI event, or taking the sugar, including the bowl, from our restaurants. Recently, golf has experienced counterfeit golf passes and missing range balls. In addition, some residents complain about the food and want a refund after they ate it all! None of us are privileged or deserve more than others, so we must be considerate of the expense that an action or request might incur. If your food is bad, you should expect to be able to return it, but please don't eat it and then make the unreasonable request of a refund. Please don't take items that are owned by the Association because that is stealing from your neighbors.

There is a process when you see a fellow resident stealing or doing something that is against the rules and regulations or other governing documents. Often I hear, "I know who did it, but I don't want to get involved." You need to report it because that person you saw poisoning trees cost you and your fellow neighbors \$80,000 in increased insurance premiums one year later! If you are concerned about something you saw or know is going on, please call my office, 966-1409.

Remember theft is against the law and is punishable. If you don't want to call me, call the police by dialing 311, which is the non-emergency police phone number.




Steven N. Montgomery, M.D., F.A.C.S.





Sun City Summerlin Tradition Salutes the American Flag





Community Standards

It's Springtime! Some tips from Community Standards

General Maintenance

- How do your awnings look? Could they use some cleaning? Maybe a change to a new color. The approved color chart is available at the Community Standards office.
- How about your mailbox post? It should be either black or white (depending on where you reside). If it is faded, rusted or any other color, it needs attention.
- Take a look at your wrought iron fencing. If it is faded or rusted, it should be repainted.

Landscaping Tips

- Treating your lawn with a pre-emergent won't eliminate all weeds from your property, but it will surely reduce them.
 If you live on a corner lot that is separated from the street by a wall, remember, YOU are responsible for the strip of landscaping in between.
- Are your trees encroaching into your neighbor's property or over a sidewalk? If so, be a good neighbor and trim the limbs back. If the limbs are encroaching over a sidewalk, City of Las Vegas Code Enforcement will contact you if

you do not. The City's requirement is that the limbs must be higher than eight (8) feet from the sidewalk.

Community Pets

- Responsible pet ownership includes ensuring that your family pet does not bother your neighbors.
- Incessant barking can be considered a nuisance. If your dog is left unattended outside and begins to bark, please bring it back inside so as not to disturb the neighboring residents.
- Residents who walk their dogs must keep them leashed at all times. Even if you feel you have the best trained dog, you can't be sure how they might react in every situation. That's the law!

Moving or Estate Sales

 If you are moving or have had a death in the household, one two-day sale is permitted. A Sale Permit must be obtained from the Community Standards office and displayed on the residence on the day(s) of the sale.

Landscaping

Work Completed at Sundial West Park

As you may know we are trying to conserve water here in Sun City Summerlin. As part of the turf and water reduction plan that was approved by the Board of Directors, the Landscape Department has just completed work at Sundial West Park.

The park is located on Sundial Drive between Big Timber and Highvale drives. One of the main reasons this area was chosen for modification is because it is watered with potable water, which is very expensive. Another reason was due to the lack of water pressure at that park's location. Some of the work included changing out the sprinkler rotors' (large popup sprinklers) spacing so that the turf will water correctly, which will translate into less watering time, less water use and greener grass. The irrigation for the plants and trees was re-fitted with drip irrigation; the trees are now on separate irrigation valves from the plants. This allows us to meet the needs of the trees, which is different from what plants require.

The trees and plants we chose for the area are conducive to the climate of Sun City and should thrive. We also

transplanted plants from other areas of the community, where there was overcrowding.

I hope everyone enjoys the new look. We are currently working on the design and turf reduction plan for Desert Vista.

The Landscape Department is watering every day at night.

I hope you are enjoying the spring and the activities offered here at Sun City.

Security Patrol · Call 254-2303

Security Patrol's House Check Program

Sun City Summerlin's Security Patrol provides residents who are valid SCSCAI members a service to inspect the exterior security of their properties while they are vacationing or away from home. It is important to understand that the Security Patrol is an all-volunteer community service organization whose members are your neighbors. As such, the extent of available personnel to provide this service is limited and, therefore, house checks of individual residents must be regulated to every other day, over a maximum 30-day time period.

Doors and windows will be individually checked by Patrol drivers. Prior to leaving your house, please make sure that all doors are locked and window latches are closed. Also, check that your filed emergency contact information is correct and current. Residents whose properties are being checked must have a local emergency contact on record.

Security Patrol's house check program is not intended to provide continuing property surveillance for residents who are away from their homes for extended periods of time, nor is it a service for protecting homes that are vacant while they are being marketed for sale or pending rental occupancy. Making provisions for long-term security is the responsibility of the home owner.

Security Patrol's primary function is to provide increased protection for all Sun City residents as a result of Patrol cars' high visibility throughout the community. The sustained presence of Patrol cars moving through neighborhoods is a powerful deterrent to criminal activity. Devoting an excess of time to house checks would decrease the Patrol's availability to complement police protection to keep Sun City safe.

During a recent month, Patrol Drivers notified 263 residents that their garage doors had been left open after dark. They checked 201 homes for vacationing residents, responded to 67 flashing emergency lights and gave directions and other assistance to 258 motorists who





They don't wear pouffy skirts or bolo ties and cowboy boots; and while it's true that some of the music can have a country western flair, the dancers who show up to round-dance classes in Sun City Summerlin are learning to rhumba and waltz to all sorts of music. Round dancing, as Deb explained has its own language made up of cucarachas, walking crabs and lariats; throw in a couple of peek-a-boos, a chase, a fence line and, Voila!, you have a hot new routine.

In one demonstration, Deb joined the circle with a partner, her headset, and cranked up the music.

"Quick, Quick, Slow Progressive Walk 6 Quick, Quick, Slow Same Technique Circle Away and Together Ball Flat, Ball Flat, Ball Flat

Quick, Quick, Slow"

Deb punctuated her final move with a smile and a pose.



"Good, and that makes it rhumba," she said. "When you dance rhumba your toes never leave the floor. 'It's ball flat, ball flat. That helps the hip. It's the way to walk and look sexy.'"

Six couples turned out for Tuesday's afternoon class. The dancers in Sun City are a united bunch who enjoy the chance to move, learn new steps and stay active.

"They are beginners," Deb said of her students that day. "They work their butts off. If I'm not here on a Saturday, they practice, and they're super nice to each other."


