PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

ow, the first of May, and it is starting to feel like late spring and early summer already. Outdoor activities are in full swing, golf, pickleball and tennis, softball, and bocce to name just a few are some of the Sun City activities that more residents than ever before are participating in every day. The outdoor pools have been open for about a month and are as busy as they ever have been before. It is wonderful to see so many residents using the amenities that exist in our community. Residents have been walking around the community from early morning to dusk. The walkers are getting exercise and looking at their neighbor's yards to either admire them and/or get ideas to alter the appearance of their own yard. I call that a twofer, exercise and new ideas.

With this copy of the Link, you as a Sun City Resident received a packet of information regarding the upcoming year's assessment increase and some of the backup information. A complete and total budget is available on the Sun City Summerlin's web site. I cannot and will not speak for any other Board member, however, the Board as a Board presented this year's budget for what it believes is for the good of the community. There was not an increase in assessments in nine of the last sixteen years. There has not been an increase in the last three years. I can speak to the last three years only as I am just beginning my fourth year on the Board. Because of Covid-19 many of the community's facilities were closed or only partially open some of the time. The Board even though it felt that assessment increases were necessary did not want to add them during this period of time. There have been significant changes in the last year that have exacerbated the Board's need to increase the assessment substantially. Some of the reasons include but are not limited to the following: Three years without an increase, inflation, the rising cost of gas, labor, materials, and supplies. There are pieces of equipment, vehicles and supplies that have taken or will take six to eighteen months to obtain. The Board and Administration have tried to anticipate and budget for these additional expenses. The replacement cost of these pieces of equipment and the community's brick and mortar assets has skyrocketed. The "Reserves" (the money set aside to repair or replace the community's major assets) have become underfunded because of the substantial increase in the cost of just about everything.

We have a wonderful community; some like to call it a "world class community". To maintain the landscaping, buildings and amenities we as a community need to work constantly to obtain this goal. Cleaning facilities daily, repairing that which breaks down and replacing that which is broken or "dated" are all a part of what it will take to keep our community great. Our new residents are spending more and more money to buy homes in this community. The new residents are then spending lots and lots of money to update and modernize their new homes. It appears to be contagious as many existing residents are spend-

ing lots of money to refurbish their homes as well. The Board recognizes its responsibility to put that same effort into the upkeep of ALL of the community's assets. The Board must and will act in a fiscally responsible manner to protect and preserve community assets. Contact any Board member or Administration if you have specific questions regarding the proposed budget.

Please do not forget that your neighbors and fellow residents that belong to the Silvertones, a community choral group, will be performing on May 14th and 15th at the Starbright Theatre. Tickets are still available.

Pool Etiquette

It is important to follow a few simple rules for everyone's safety and enjoyment. Each fitness center has facility rules printed at the Fitness Monitor station.

- On-site showering before entering pool is required by the Health
- Food and Drink are allowed only at the outdoor pools and must be kept at least 4 feet away from water.
- Bottled water is allowed in any pool area. Glass containers, alcohol, and gum are prohibited.
- Children must be 42" tall without shoes.

Per Southern Nevada Health District, due to stricter regulations in regards to the sizes of pools and/or gallons of water they hold, the Mountain Shadows Outdoor Pool is required to have dedicated supervision in the pool area during operating hours. We had hoped we could get a waiver on this due to our demographics and the depth of the pool, and while they waived the requirement for us to have lifequards in the area, we recently learned they are going to require us to have a Monitor stationed in the pool area during the hours the pool is open. We currently have coverage at Mountain Shadows from 6 a.m.- 6 p.m. Once fully staffed, operating hours will return to 6 a.m-9 p.m. Mountain Shadows is the only pool impacted by this regulation.



GETTING IT BACK

t was a normal fall day. Sandy Biedryck had just finished playing tennis and her husband Ted had played softball. Together they jumped in their car to head to lunch. Unfortunately this day in October of 2020 would be different and become a 12-month nightmare. As they drove down Lone Mountain Road, a car traveling in excess of 40 mph ran a stop sign hitting their car. Had it not been for Sandy's last minute warning of the approaching car, allowing Ted to accelerate, the impact would have certainly caused multiple fatalities. As it was - the car took a major impact to the rear which spun the car violently out of control and hit the median twice! In that moment, the cliché that "life can turn on a dime" became their stark reality.


Sandy endured significant injuries with head, neck, and hip and hand trauma. As she rode to the hospital in the ambulance, Sandy thought of being on the tennis courts just 45 minutes earlier. The months that followed represented the challenge of a lifetime. Sandy went from someone who was active, playing tennis three times a week, involved in clubs, and sewing designer clothes to someone who was in constant pain, couldn't sleep, and became exhausted at the slightest of activity. Doctor's visits became the center of her life


One doctor told Sandy that with hard work she might get to 60% of where she was pre-accident, as long as she took major pain management drugs. He also told her that she may never play tennis again. This was one of the darkest moments. Switching from that doctor, Sandy began to see Dr. Michael Trainor of Advanced Orthopedics. Through his assessment, he provided hope with a realistic perspective and a clear path to recovery. Working with Performance Physical Therapy's Danny Antonino and his team, Sandy regained her fitness. Over the course of 72 physical therapy sessions and some home therapy, she was able to get closer to her previous reality. After 12 months, Sandy was playing tennis. While her game was not the same, every day got her closer to her previous place.

Fast forward to today - Sandy is back playing competitive tennis 3+ days a week and is designing and creating clothes again. More importantly, she is training for the National Senior Games in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida to be played in May. Sandy and her tennis partners, Sun City residents Walter Pratt and Keiko Gillespie, have qualified to play in multiple events.

The road back for Sandy was a challenge. There were many times when she could have given up. She didn't. With hard work and the support of many people, she is back. Finally, when asked how she thought she would do at the National Senior Games, Sandy said that while she hoped to win, it didn't matter as she has already won by having her life back and by being at the games. Volunteering has also been shown to lesson heart disease and chronic pain.

Volunteering can give you a new skill set to keep you engaged in your daily life. Some of us are naturally shy and may have a hard time meeting new people. By volunteering in something you are interested in, social skills are developed as you meet regularly with people in a group with common interests; it becomes easier to grow your network and make more friends and contacts.

Volunteering brings fun and fulfillment to your life. A healthy boost to your confidence, self-esteem and satisfaction with life is created by doing good for others and the community.

The Happiness Factor

Researchers at the London School of Economics examined the relationship between volunteering and degree of happiness in a large American adult group.

They found "the more people volunteered, the happier they were." Compared with people who never volunteered, the odds of being "very happy" rose 7% among those who volunteer monthly and 12% for people who volunteer every two to four weeks. (Referenced from a special health report published by Harvard Health Publications.)

My "mission" is now to find something I believe in or a club I'd like to join and volunteer for in some small way (to get my feet wet). I'll let you know what I do. If I can do it, YOU can do it! Consider how happy we can all be!

Genesis: In The Beginning Russell Roskens Created The Las Vegas Iowa Club

n 1994, Russ and Donna Roskens moved to Las Vegas from their Iowa home. Both are 1960 University of Iowa graduates. Russ, who grew up in Spencer, Iowa, followed with a two-year stint in the Army, including a year of service in Korea.

As relocated Las Vegans, the Roskens soon craved the social camaraderie of fellow Hawkeve sports' fans. Through word of mouth with other Iowa-to-Nevada transplants including occasional gatherings with Hawkeye fans in sports' bars, Russ began hosting routine Hawkeye game watches with a dozen or so fans initially. The Fun Hog Ranch was owned by former Hawkeye basketball player, Mark Eggleston, and featured "Iowa Tenderloins". They were fantastic. The "Iowa Tenderloins" attracted guite a few Hawkeyes. Within five years, a standing room only crowd of up to 80 fans were cheering at the small sports bar on Saturday's Hawkeye game days.

They moved one game to a larger Recreation Hall at Queens Ridge, where a club member lived, but the enormous crowd provoked gripes from residents because of the huge number of cars parking at the event. Their next move was to a sports bar near UNLV, where the club went on to regularly entertain 40 to 70 weekly fans, all relocated Las Vegans with Iowa connections.

To help with developing the Las Vegas group's club roster, Iowa graduates in Nevada received the Iowa Magazine and noted who to contact for the Nevada Iowa Club.

Active club member Kristy Hingtgen took charge of the group in 2010. In 2018, current club President Barbara Holden became the leader of the Las Vegas Iowa Club.

Affectionately known as "Mister Hawkeye", Russ Roskens boasts a distinctive collection of Iowa-related memorabilia, including Hayden Fry and Chuck Long souvenirs in his home's



favored "Iowa room".

Russ plays year 'round softball, including early morning summer pickup games in an eight-team league. The Roskens both have served as longtime Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol volunteers.

Asked which weather extremity he most dreads, Russ claims he handles the summer heat in Las Vegas better than below freezing temperatures in Iowa. Thank you to Russ Roskens, a greatly admired Hawkeye.

Spring Has Sprung

and it brings with it a few subtle reminders about out-door chores . . . spring-cleaning, so to speak. Here are a few things to keep in mind about the outside of our homes during these beautiful sunny days!

Mother Nature has dropped a few reminders of the winter months in our yards and we need to spruce things up a bit and clear out the palm fronds, pine cones and, most of all, the weeds!

Weeds are the scourge of mankind, even here in the desert landscape. They have lots of nooks and crannies in the stone to hide in and, they are very persistent. They don't go down without a fight but, we have discovered a simple solution that is non-toxic, inexpensive and easy to do.

Place plain white vinegar in a spray bottle with a teaspoon of liquid soap and simply spray the weeds around the yard. The soap will help the vinegar stick to the nasty weeds and they'll disappear in no time. Vinegar contains acetic acid which is the arch-enemy of weeds and usually a quick squirt will knock 'em dead. Nothing is perfect, though, so, if needed, another squirt in a few days will finish them off. Try not to spray the vinegar on decorative plants because vinegar can be toxic to them, too.

Remember, if your property is "walled", or you live on a corner lot, the outside of the walls which border our streets,

belong to you---and they also grow weeds. Those "outside the wall" weeds deserve no mercy, either. Give them a squirt of vinegar, too! One way, or another, the weeds have to go!

Although trees don't grow like proverbial weeds, they do still grow. Tree limbs can encroach on neighboring properties and over sidewalks. Those limbs need to be trimmed back from adjoining properties and Las Vegas Code Enforcement tells us that tree limbs that overhang sidewalks and walkways must be trimmed higher than eight (8) feet from the sidewalk level.

Palm trees can be wonderful and beautiful additions to our landscape but, with so many things, "beauty is in the eyes of the beholder"! There's not much worse that a droopy old palm and those palm trees need to be trimmed regularly so they can be beautiful to all!

And, we can't forget those pesky pine trees that we all have a "love/hate" relationship with. We love their shade but hate their unsightly needles and pinecones. They, too, need to be cleaned-up regularly. And, while we're at it, now is a good time to trim trees and shrubs that block the vision of drivers on streets in the Community.

We hope you enjoy your property in the exciting days of our warm desert Spring. It's a wonderful time of the year, especially in Sun City Summerlin.

A summary budget is distributed to the homeowners via the May issue of the Link Magazine and includes among other things, the estimated annual revenue and expenditure of the association and the contributions to be made to the Reserve Account. NON-RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS "NRDS"

With great foresight, The Del Webb Company included six commercial centers on the perimeter and within the Sun City Summerlin walls. Included in these centers are churches, several major retailers, restaurants, banks and other services that we use every day. These are great enhancements to our community.

The buildings and grounds that house these churches and businesses are governed by a set of guidelines called the Non-Residential Development Standards (NRDS) that are very similar to the Sun City Residential Standards but, they are aimed more specifically at commercial-type buildings, their grounds and adjacent exterior facilities.

The Standards are designed to guide these centers and assist them in maintaining the same important qualities that are expected of residential properties and the Sun City Summerlin facilities, themselves. Essentially, all of these Standards are aimed at helping Sun City Summerlin to enhance its curb appeal and keep property values at the highest levels possible.

Recently, our Board of Directors approved an updated version of the Non-Residential Development Standards (NRDS) for these commercial and church properties, to fit with today's needs and promote compatibility with their surroundings.

More specifically, the Standards are designed to provide guidance to center owners, management companies and tenants as they conduct their businesses. The Non-Residential Development Standards are very much in synch with the Residential Development Standards, in terms of the aesthetics, colors, textures, designs and the overall look of the Community. Importantly, our goal is also to promote a strengthened relationship with our commercial neighbors.

In line with that, the Executive Director plans to expand our website offerings to include commercial and church site tabs, where business owners and tenants, can link their business websites, as well as promote their locations and contact information.

The Non-Residential Development Standards can be accessed online, at the Sun City Summerlin website, www.suncitysummerlin.com, or at the Community Standards or Administration offices. Moving forward immediately e-blasts sent out by the Executive Director and the administration office will be posted at every monitor station (social and fitness) for all residents to view if they do not have a computer or do not use the internet.
