# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Fell, summer is over and fall is here. The temperatures are becoming more comfortable. We can all walk a little later in the morning and a little earlier at night. YEAH the golfers are getting to sleep in a little longer as the sun comes up later in the morning and the temperature is more comfortable so that everyone is not trying to finish before noon.

The Future Planning Committee presented its report to the Board of Directors at their August meeting. The Board will schedule a study session in September to begin discussing the results and deciding on what requests from the residents can be acted upon as well as prioritizing future plans based on need and cost. The process may take more than one study session by the Board. The most common comment by the residents was about property maintenance. This actually had two components. First, day-to-day maintenance was important to the residents. They wanted things to be cleaned and kept clean on a daily basis. Almost every comment was complimentary about the cleaning and most were appreciative of the efforts. The second part of maintenance was the desire of the residents to "refresh" the furniture and furnishings in the community. There were a lot of requests that were presented by those with a special interest in promoting their individual club, sport or interest. The committee tried to keep its report more general in nature.

Space utilization was a topic that was mentioned by many. The committee reviewed the comments made by the Department Directors when interviewed by Board member, Jeff Rorick. The comments most germane to this report were their universal request and need for more storage space. The committee spoke with numerous club presidents in an attempt to determine their perspective on future planning. One of their requests was for more storage as well. Whether or not the club had dedicated space they had a desire for more. The second request was the desire for "more space" to have bigger meeting rooms or be able to meet more often. The clubs in Sun City are growing in size and are becoming even more active. This is good but will require us to meet the challenges that come from needing more space and more times for the clubs to participate in their activities.

I encourage everyone to read the entire report which can be found on the Sun City web site. This article only touches the surface of the report. Two of the suggestions in the report follow. It should be noted that the committee tried to emphasize the information gathered and NOT make any decisions. The committee fully acknowledges that the Board, its committees, and Administration will all participate in final decisions. The first suggestion was to cover the track that circles the track at Mountain Shadows. The request for an indoor track was one of the most frequent. The committee decided that such a track was cost prohibitive as no existing building could be retrofitted economically and a new building was out of the ques-

tion. Materials used to create a shaded area for the Security Patrol cars or something similar could be used. The second suggestion was to construct one or more "Bubble Fabric Structures". These could be placed in open areas in the community at a relatively reasonable cost and would afford activities to take place within the structure. Said structure is not brick and mortar in style. There is an exten-

sive section in the report about security. Again, I encourage everyone to read the entire report. My thanks again to the committee for their extraordinary efforts and year-long commitment to complete the report.

# Keep Moving through the Fall Season: It Does Not Have To Be Scary!

all is here! With the weather cooling off, the fitness centers might get frequented a little less and there might be a couple of reasons for it. According to an analysis by Gold's Gym, October marks the month with the fewest gym check-ins. One reason could be the switch in seasons: This time of year, some people take their workouts outdoors, but others could simply be hitting pause on exercise all together. Remember that moving your body does not have to just be in the gym, find activities that you enjoy and find movement in every day.

The CDC recommends adults aged 65 and older need:

- At least 150 minutes a week (for example, 30 minutes a day, 5 days a week) of moderate intensity activity such as brisk walking. Or they need 75 minutes a week of vigorous-intensity activity such as hiking, jogging, or running.
- At least **2 days a week** of activities that **strengthen muscles**.
- Activities to **improve balance** such as standing on one foot about 3 days a week.

If chronic conditions affect your ability to meet these recommendations, be as physically active as your abilities and conditions allow.

Research has shown that physical activity is not only good for your body, but it also helps support your emotional and mental health. October is Emotional Wellness Month, and the National Institute of Health offers an Emotional Wellness Toolkit that includes 6 strategies for improving your emotional health. Here in Sun City Summerlin, we are offering a seminar Wednesday, October 26, at 1 p.m., on "The Best Ways to Improve Anxiety and Depression".



### "Be Your Own Best Friend"

How to be happy alone: 10 ways to become your own best friend. Feeling lonely? Follow these expert-approved tips for flying – and thriving – solo.

True happiness comes from within. And while you can always turn to others for a mood boost, there's nothing quite like being content with your own company. That said, can you really be happy alone? Yes, but it's all about perspective. The word "alone" sometimes carries a negative connotation since many equate it to being lonely and, well, sad. However, that is simply not the case as the two words have completely different meanings. "Feeling lonely is actually completely different from being alone. Loneliness is a feeling while being alone is a situation," said Dr. Nina Vasan, M.D. With the right techniques, you may be able to get past this feeling of loneliness, whether you're single or simply miles away from the people you love. "For example, if you're by yourself but connecting with others through good communication or activities like volunteering, you don't feel lonely," she said. Not to mention being alone - whether by choice or circumstance - gives you time to be "introspective, creative, or engaged through activities like journaling, painting, reading a book, or building something for your house." Here are some expert-backed tips and tricks on how to be happy alone.

**Develop a workout routine** - Have you ever noticed how your mood improves after a brisk walk around the block? It's no secret that a simple walking routine is beneficial for your health. In addition to lowering cholesterol levels and blood pressure, walking — either fast or slow — helps relieve stress and increase mindfulness, according to research. "On the biological level, the endorphins that get released from exercising improve mood. Psychologically, the more you engage and the better you get, that sense of mastery increases confidence and selfesteem, which leads to feeling happier," Dr. Vasan said.

**Stop comparing yourself to others** - When scrolling through social media, it's easy to lose sight of who you really are — and what sets you apart. Kathryn Lee, MHC, ED.M, M.A warns, "Comparing yourself to others can make you feel inadequate, less than, and left out potentially leading you to experience higher levels of stress, anxiety, or low self-esteem," she said.

**Curate hobbies** - Your everyday commitments keep you busy enough as it is, but what do you do for "you"? Try revisiting an old hobby or finding a new one that sparks joy. **Volunteer in your community** - Helping others does your heart — and head — some good. A 2020 study published in the Journal of Happiness found that people who volunteer are happier than those who don't. "Volunteering and giving back helps you find a sense of purpose. By identifying a cause you care about and giving your time to that, you get connected to something beyond yourself, and that can increase your sense of happiness," Dr. Vasan said.

**Practice self-reflection** – Much like looking into a physical mirror, self-reflection is a simple way to gain insight into what you look like — from the inside out. Dr. Vasan suggests activities like journaling, practicing mindfulness, and expressing gratitude to help you better understand who you are and what you need.

**Be bold and try new things** - Remember when you tried kale for the first time and actually liked it? Of course, it can be daunting, but trying new things opens up a whole new world for you. Come up with a list of things you've always wanted to try and discover a few new favorites along the way.

**Lean on animals for emotional support** - All pet parents know that they're never truly alone — as long as they have their fur baby by their side. Dr. Vasan couldn't agree more: "Emotional support animals can bring immense joy and companion-ship to people."

**Put yourself first** - Although it's often easier said than done, Lee suggests carving out time to really get to know yourself. After all, "the most important relationship we have is the relationship with our own selves." Treat the relationship with yourself like any other relationship in your life by prioritizing your wants and needs. Maybe that means scheduling daily workouts, reading daily affirmations or setting aside five minutes a day to jot down your thoughts.

**Get out in nature** - Research shows that time spent outside leads to a more happy, relaxed state. For example, a 2019 study published in Scientific Reports found that spending at least 120 minutes in nature each week improved people's health and overall well-being. Lee adds that fresh air and sunshine can lower cortisol levels, blood pressure, heart rate, and overall stress. Stepping out in nature also clears the mind, ultimately leading to improved working memory, cognitive flexibility, and attentional control.

**Live in the moment** - So many times we save life's little luxuries – pricey candles, layered cakes, you name it – for special occasions. The true secret to being happier alone is living your best life 24/7, 365. "Don't wait for someone, something, or a milestone to dictate your happiness," Lee said. Take this as your permission to light all the candles, bake all the cakes, and do whatever makes your heart happy.

Implement one (or all) of these techniques into your everyday life to remind yourself that happiness should always start and end with you. Who knows, you may even find that you're a better friend, partner, and colleague because of it.



## **SECURITY PATROL** It's the Little Things!

ost of the time, life seems full of really big, important events. Please don't forget the little things as you rush through your day. Most of them cost no money and take but a small fraction of your time.

Lifting your hand to wave at a neighbor is a small amount of muscle use and a huge "feel-good" effect to both you and the recipient. They may even wave back!



on duty even if the clock reads 2 a.m. Just give a call to our phone line at: 702-254-2303. We can drive by and put your mind at ease. (Please remember that 911 is the emergency phone for Metro and Rescue. Important that this is the number to be called when you need our first responders. Have that posted. In an emergency, **first** call 911, then call Security Patrol.)

Now to some smaller items . . . many of us have furry family friends that we spend hours walking through the community. There are lots of sizes, but today we single out the little ones. Even though they may be small, they still have to relieve themselves along the way. Those deposits need to be picked up

before you leave the area. If you cannot bend over anymore, check out "poop picker uppers" that will help with the job.

Same goes for those who are still smoking as they walk. That butt may seem normal to you, but not to everyone. These should be disposed of properly, that means take it with you please don't leave them on the sidewalks. This small output of energy keeps our community much more sanitary and visually appealing.

If you haven't already done so, check the information you have given the Administration and the Security Patrol on those important blue sheets. Are your emergency contacts all correct and is at least one of them in the local area? Do they have permission to enter your home? Are all phone numbers updated?

In closing, confirm there are the **big** stop signs all through our community. It only takes two seconds at each and it may save a life. *Please stop*!

The small stop signs at the golf cart crossings could also be seen as a "save-a-life" sign. Most golfers follow the rules of the paths, but there may be one that doesn't get it. Be observant when approaching those areas in your great big vehicle. Don't just assume the golf cart will obey the Stop sign!

On the front of your home is a placard that tells the world your physical address. Make sure that it isn't only visible dur-

ing the day, but has those smallish bulbs that light it up at night. When you need emergency services after dark, the few minutes extra to search for your abode may be life threatening for you and exasperating for responders.

> Another issue that may happen in the wee hours of the morning could be strange sounds outside your home or, heaven forbid, inside. There are volunteer members of your security patrol

## Helping to Change the World by Changing <u>Your</u> World!

William H. McRaven. His common-sense approach has to appeal to most of you as it did to me.

I've been inspired to write about a

speech I read given by a Navy Seal

Retired Admiral. I was so impressed

that I bought the small book he had

written where he expanded on the

speech. It's called, Make Your Bed:


Little Things That Can Change Your Life

... And Maybe the World by Admiral

This speech was originally given by Admiral McRaven on May 17, 2014, at the University of Texas in Austin for its graduation ceremony. If you are interested in reading the actual transcript, you can Google the transcript and read his exact words. I am paraphrasing and giving you my own interpreta-

tion of what impressed me most, mixed with his words.

Admiral William H. McRaven was a Navy Seal for 36 years, and his life's philosophy came from his basic Seal training which he said was designed to make you miserable enough to



thing, then other completed tasks will follow by the end of the day. And if by chance you've had a bad day, going home to that well-made bed is not only comforting but speaks of perhaps a better day tomorrow.

Seals had to learn to paddle a boat in sync with others or the boat would not move in the proper direction. Some of the smallest guys were all on one team and yet, due to their will and teamwork, almost always finished having the last laugh as they came in first. In life, everyone needs help be it from friends, colleagues, or even the kindness of strangers to help us along our path and paddle through life. And by "paying back" the help of those who care about us to others, we can perhaps change the course of their lives, too. He learned to judge others not by their appearance or what they have but rather the good intentions in their hearts.

> The training started with 150 men and over time dwindled down to 35. What kept the remaining Seals from not giving up was a combination, Admiral McRaven feels, of hope and their strong will to succeed.

> > When inspecting uni-

quit the Seals. The instructors' "mission" was to weed out the "weak minded" with a six-month course designed to be a "lifetime of challenges crammed into six months."

Here's what he learned in basic training that followed him into his life:

Despite our incomes, social standing, gender, ethnic, or social backgrounds, life's challenges test everyone's mettle in its own way. No one goes through life untouched. All soldiers were treated equally and had to prove themselves.

The first instruction in basic training began with making the perfect bed each day. It would be inspected and critiqued and expected to follow protocol to perfection.

What he learned was that if you begin each day completing one task that makes you feel like you've accomplished someforms, the instructors always found something wrong, and to "punish" the offending soldier, the soldier would have to run out into the water with his uniform on, get totally soaked and then roll over and over in the sand until he was covered in it. The soldier became a "sugar cookie" and had to stay in that uniform cold, wet, and sandy all day. Many became discouraged because no matter how hard a soldier tried, he was inevitably doomed to become a sugar cookie. In life, the Admiral said, sometimes no matter how hard we try we will end up time and again as the sugar cookie - buck up and move on.

Challenges can make or break you, and if a soldier messed up during calisthenics he was invited to "the circus." That meant another two hours of calisthenics, the longer workout creating even more fatigue. A funny thing happened to many who got invited to the circus; they became stronger and more resilient. It reminded this writer of that old saying, "what doesn't kill you makes you stronger."

In another test, the Seals had to figure out a way down an obstacle course, and the record for the fastest time hadn't been broken in a very long time. One soldier decided to go down the obstacle course head first, which was considered risky and maybe even foolish. But in taking that risk he cut the record almost in half. Obstacles, the Admiral said, are always present in life, and sometimes you need to be fearless and creative and to think outside the box.

The Seals were required to do a night swim in sharkinfested waters. If a shark did attack, the Seal was told to punch it in the snout and it would retreat. The mission was to go under a ship and find the keel which is in the deepest part of the water. In pitch black, noises of the engine and other machinery echoing to the point of disorientation, it is then that the Seal must keep himself calm, alert, and give all efficiency and attention to his mission.

The Admiral said life is like that, full of challenges where you must keep calm, focused, composed physically, mentally, and emotionally and "swim with the sharks" not letting them take you down.

During "Hell Week" the Seals were to go into a cold pond of pure mud until they were up to their necks. The instructors cajoled that if just five men gave up all would be allowed out of the mud. In this situation, where they had little hope, one soldier started singing and they all joined in. The group knew that if one of them could overcome the pain of the freezing mud and numbness, then they all could. The Admiral said the power of hope is very strong; sing when you are up to your neck in mud.

Lastly, there was a brass bell in the center of the compound that a soldier was to ring indicating he was quitting, never to endure the hardships of boot camp again. The Admiral finished his speech with "Don't ever give up and ring that bell."

Personally I wish I had been given this advice when I was younger; to me, it is gold!







## **COMMUNITY STANDARDS** Let's Talk Trash Trash Container Storage, That Is!

Keeping our Sun City Summerlin neighborhoods looking their best is a goal we all share. Storing unsightly trash containers out of the view of our neighbors and visitors is one easy way we can help live up to that goal!

e are now into the fourth year of the Las Vegas city-mandated trash collection program, which uses trash containers provided by Republic Services. When the new system was first announced, a policy was adopted by the Architectural Review Committee that was designed to



keep stored trash containers hidden from the

view

of neighboring properties, streets, and common areas. While many of us have risen to the occasion, there are others who have not yet made the adjustment to meet the directive to keep stored containers out of view. The following briefly states the approved trash can storage standard.

With four years of the storage policy under our belts -- and with continuing complaints from neighbors -- the Community Standards office will revisit its trash can storage compliance requirements, based on the Sun City Summerlin adopted compliance procedures, as follows:

- Errant trash can storage locations will be documented via date and time-stamped photographs.
- Residences not in compliance will be issued written viola-• tion notices.
- Violations not cured in the specified time frame may be issued Hearing notices.
- If non-compliance continues, fines may be assessed until the violation is remedied.

Violation notices can be avoided by proactively installing approved trash can enclosures or by storing containers out of sight in garages.

If you plan to construct a new trash can enclosure, we remind you that all enclosures must be applied for, and approved in advance of their construction. Applications may be obtained at the Community Standards office during business hours, by downloading from the SCSCAI website, and/or by email request at: communitystandards@suncitylv.com.

We would like to remind disabled residents who have difficulty moving their trash containers, that Republic Services offers a "Disability Exemption" service, whereby they will move trash containers to the curb each week. Qualified resi-56 | LINK MAGAZINE | OCTOBER 2022

dents may request an application for service by calling the Republic Services office at 702-735-5151.

Also, please remember that trash containers must not be placed in any part of the front yard or street for trash/garbage collection prior to 2 p.m. on the day preceding the scheduled collection day and must be removed by midnight on the day of collection (City of Las Vegas ordinance Chapter 9.08).

If you have questions, or need assistance, please call or visit the Community Standards office at our Mountain Shadows location or call us at 702-966-1411. We are happy to assist in any way possible.

#### We offer the following examples of approved and non-approved types of trash container enclosures.



Slump-stone or stucco solid block walls and gates are acceptable. Trash cans must be completely obscured behind walls/gates.



A combination of vertical ornamental iron bars (wrought iron) and mesh screening is allowed. Trash cans must be completely obscured behind the enclosure.



A 3-sided block wall or stuccoed enclosure is allowed. One side of the structure may utilize the side wall of the home. Trash cans must be completely obscured behind the wall.



Mature shrubbery that obscures all visible sides of trash containers, and is of adequate height, is allowable, at ARC's discretion.





Due to harsh desert climate limitations, composite and wooden storage structures, or *lattice of any type, are not* allowed.

Shrubbery is not acceptable for screening trash containers if any part of the container is visible from neighboring property.







After the Completed Live Tree Removal Request and Agreement Form is received by the Executive Director, the form and any required back up information will be referred to the Live Tree Removal Committee. The office of the Executive Director will advise the neighboring property owners of the tree removal request, and that the request has been forwarded to the Live Tree Removal Committee for action. The neighboring homeowners will be offered an opportunity to comment on the request, in writing, or in person at a Live Tree Removal Committee meeting.

Every year the chairperson of the CAP, ARC, and the Golf Oversight standing committees will appoint one of their committee members to the Live Tree Removal Committee. The other members of the committee will be the Directors of: Golf, Golf Course Grounds Maintenance, and Landscape. The Live Tree Removal Committee will review the Live Tree Removal Request and Agreement Form, visit the location of the tree, and schedule a meeting to discuss and make a determination on the request. Within two business days after the meeting, the Chairperson of the committee will deliver the completed outcome form to the office of the Executive Director for notification of all parties and forwarding to the Board.

The following paragraphs being added:

After the completed Live Tree Removal Request and Agreement Form is received by the Executive Director, the form and any required back up information will be referred to the appropriate Department Director. If the request is for a live tree removal in the common areas it will be referred to the Director of Landscape Maintenance, if the request is for a live tree removal on the golf course it will be referred to the Director of Golf Course Maintenance. The office of the Executive Director will advise the neighboring property owners of the tree removal request. The neighboring property Owners will be offered an opportunity to comment on the request in writing.

The Executive Director and the appropriate Department Director will review the Live Tree Removal Request and Agreement Form, visit the

location of the tree(s) and review the comments from the neighboring property Owners. If after this review, the Executive Director and Department Director agree that the tree or trees can be removed, a landscape improvement replacement plan will be developed for this area by the Department Director and submitted to the Architectural Review Committee. If the landscape improvement replacement plan is approved by the Architectural Review Committee, then the Owner requesting the tree(s) be removed will be notified of the total cost of the removal and the landscape improvement plan. The Owner will have sixty (60) days to submit payment in full for the removal of thetree(s) and the landscape improvement plan. If the payment is received the work will commence withing thirty (30) days. If payment is not received the approval for the request is voided.

In addition, the following words will be removed from the final paragraph *Live Tree Removal Committee* and revised to read:

The homeowner will be advised of the decision by the office of the Executive Director.

### What Does it Take to Be a Board Member?

On page 10 of this issue of The Link Magazine notification has been issued by the Sun City Summerlin Election Committee that if you are an Owner of a home in Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc. and are in good standing you

are eligible to submit your name to run for the Board of Directors.

While there are only two qualifications to be a Board member (1) an owner of the home and (2) a member in good standing, as a Professional Community Association Manager (PCAM) I like to share with homeowners what they need to know not to just be a Board Member, but to be good Board Member and I also like to share what, if elected, they might expect as far a time commitment and meetings.

### How many hats can you wear? A Board member at SCSCAI wears more than one hat!

**Owner:** As a Board member you are still a homeowner and have all of the same obligations, responsibilities and opportunities of every other homeowner. Board members pay the same assessment and fees that homeowners pay and do not receive any compensation or perks. As an individual owner you cannot speak for the Board. While you can share information that is available in open session minutes, publications or on the web, you cannot commit the Association, Board or staff to provide services, purchases or maintenance of any kind. You can bring items forward through the committee process and the Board meetings, but until voted on and approved by the Board it is an idea and not a commitment.

**Director:** As a member of the Board of Directors you are one of nine directors. All decision making is done at a duly called meeting with a properly stated motion that receives a second and is voted on. Majority prevails. There will be times you are happy about the outcome of a motion and there will be times you are not, but in the end as a Board member you should support the decision and not speak out negatively about other board members who may not have voted the way you would have liked them too.

The Board as a whole, as well as each individual Board member is assigned mandatory duties by the SCSCAI governing documents as well as the state of Nevada.

As a Director you are charged with protecting, maintaining and enhancing all of the common elements. This is important to note because it does not say just those you personally think are important or those with the largest use or those that you participate in. As a Director on the Board you have to 9 0 | LINK MAGAZINE | 0 CTOBER 2022 be able to separate your personal interests and the interests of your friends or club members and look at the needs of the entire Association. It is interesting to note the duties do not just say protect and maintain, it says enhance. Enhancing a property is a duty well above just keeping it clean and fixing things when they break. It means evaluating and replacing things that are obsolete and adding new things to keep the property from aging in place. There is also an obligation as a Director to make sure the business affairs of the Association are being managed properly and to ensure the Association is in compliance with the governing documents. One thing all Directors are made aware of is they can delegate action and jobs but they cannot delegate responsibility and both the governing documents and Nevada State Law hold the Board responsible for Association business and Association care and Association financial stability now and for the future, whether or not the task itself was delegated to a staff member or contractor.

As a Director you have a fiduciary responsibility to the Association and will exercise the business judgement rule. As surprising as it may be this may be your biggest challenge on the Board, not because you are not honest or not a good business person, but because almost every decision you make will impact someone you or your spouse or significant other personally know in the community, one of your neighbors, someone you are in a Club with or someone who voted for you. Whether it is a decision on the operations of an amenity or on the budget. you cannot let your own personal needs or the needs of someone you know play into your decisions on what is right not only for the community as a whole, but the future of the community 30 years from now. This is especially difficult at budget time as each Board member has a fiduciary duty to evaluate the information presented and make the best financial decision for the Association not for themselves or their neighbors. Every 5 years this decision is escalated because of the requirement for a full Reserve Study. The Reserves are a driving force in preserving, maintaining and enhancing the community and the adjustments every five years can lead to increases in larger increases in dues than in the previous years.

**Officer:** Once the election is over and the incoming Board members have been seated, the entire Board will elect officers. If you are elected as an officer you will be obligated to the officer duties set forth in the SCSCAI governing documents as well as Nevada State Law. Again, there are some of those duties that you can delegate but the responsibility remains with you. Officers can make certain decisions, but those decision making powers have to have been delegated to them by the governing documents or by a vote of the Board approved by a majority of Board members in a duly called Board meeting. **Committee Chair:** Each Board member serves as a Committee Chair. The only member who sometimes does not Chair a committee is the Board President, primarily because of the other duties they perform. As a Committee Chair in most cases you will have a Committee of 8 to 10 people and your committee will meet monthly. Each committee has a designated duty and your job is to direct the agenda and help staff prepare for the meeting, make sure items that need to go to the Board are presented to your committee and your committee votes on a recommendation you will carry forward to the Board.

### How Much Time Should I Expect to Spend on Board Duties:

Since each Board member is different this list provides the things that all Board members do to prepare for and attend meetings.

#### Monthly minimum hours spent on Association business for the Average Board Member= 68 hours a month

- In preparation for their monthly Board Meeting Board members attend an average of six of the nine monthly Committee meetings. Each meeting is at least 2.5 hours long. This includes the monthly Committee meeting that they chair. **15 hours**
- Review of Financial Statements in preparation for the Finance Committee Meeting and Board of Directors Meeting. 2 hours
- Review of the agenda and back up material prior to the committee meeting they chair. **1 hour**
- Property Inspections for committees they serve on or Chair where applicable or meeting with staff to review documents for meetings such as finance and legal services. 2 hours
- Review of the Board Agenda and Back Up material for the Board Meeting. **3 hours**
- Attendance of Open Board of Directors Meeting. 3 to 4 hours
- Attendance of Executive Session Meeting. 1 hour
- The Board members receive an average of 10 emails a day regarding Association business. While they are only copied on these and do not need to respond, they do need to read and be aware of them. 5 hours
- Budget Hearings. 4 consecutive days minimumlate March or early April (4 hours each). 16 hours
- Budget Ratification Meeting. 1 hour
- Coffee with the Board. Monthly 2 hours
- Each Board member is different on how many times they contact staff or the committee they are responsible for, or how many homeowners call them or email them direct. In talking with Board members over the years most agree that on average they spend at least 4 hours a week on Association

business that includes talking to, emailing or being stopped by homeowners. **17 hours** 

In fairness, I have used the minimum of what time commitment is needed. Many of our Board members dedicate many more hours to the Association, but most people that are considering running for the Board want to know what I think the minimum hours for meetings they should attend, meetings they are expected to attend, preparation for meetings and interacting with staff and homeowners.

If serving your community as a Board member sounds like something you would like to do, remember the only qualifications you need to have are as follows;

- Be a unit owner in Good Standing
- No unpaid assessments
- Disclose any potential or actual conflicts of interest
- Cannot stand to gain from a matter before the Board
- Cannot reside with or be related to a Board member or candidate
- Cannot be related to the Executive Director

Being a Board member can be a rewarding experience. I have found that the Board members who enjoy their time on the Board are thosewho went into the election knowing that (1) every decision is a decision made by the Board in a Board Meeting, (2) the governing documents and State Law have to be adhered to, and while changes can be made to the governing documents it is not only tedious and costly but many times takes an overwhelming vote of the homeowners in order to pass (3) that while caring for the homeowners and their wants and needs is important, the fiduciary responsibility assigned to each Board member in the governing document is the Association as a whole and (4) there is a time commitment to being a Board member, and it is more than a 3 to 4 hour meeting each month.

In the next election there will be 3 seats up for election. While I have been here I can honestly say we have fantastic Board of Directors. This year and last they are all in a small group of the best and most professional I have worked with. If you are interested in joining some wonderful men and women who take all of their duties seriously think about throwing your "Homeowner Hat" into the ring when the Election Committee puts out their announcement.

I want all of you who think you would like to be a Board Member to be empowered by the knowledge of not only what makes you eligible but what some of the duties and commitments are once you are elected. If you think you might like to run or you plan to run, start attending the Board Meetings, Coffee with the Board and Committee Meetings now so you are well versed on the issues when you participate in Candidates Night!
