

SECURITY PATROL

Let's Talk Training

ost of us have done some graduating in our lives; high school, college, trade school, classes for our careers, even striving to learn a hobby. Sun City Security Patrol gives you one more opportunity to show off your learning ability. Every job in the Patrol requires a number of hours of instruction and on the job training. There are also the refresher courses throughout your entire time in the Patrol. Now, we are not expecting anyone to memorize the Policies and Procedures Manual. These are professionally written and updated as needed, now over 200+ pages. But, members try to find resolutions to the many varied situations they encounter when on the job.



While experiencing the training regimen, Patrol members meet and interact with numerous trainers and residents on many shifts as they sort through all the possibilities of the job opportunities. Now we say "job" with tongue in cheek as all Patrol members, from the chief to the newest member are totally volunteers. There are three main areas of work to be done; greeters in the Information Centers, drivers who Patrol

the streets of Sun City all day and night, every day. Then there are the dispatchers who monitor the phones and radios at Patrol base, keeping communication

open for everyone. Of course, we also have the many administra-

tive, clerical and maintenance slots, the backbone of the Patrol holding everything together day by day.

In speaking with a number of the new "recruits", there is one underlying message that almost every one of them voiced. They want to be of assistance to the community and their neighbors. They are surprised at all of the responsibilities that Security Patrol covers, but are reassured when they learn that we are not police and do not do any law or regulation enforcement, we are, however, the important eyes and ears of Sun City, giving support to our fellow residents when needed. Throughout all the facets of training, Patrol recruits not only learn new skills, but also make new friends with other Patrol members.

Oh yes...did we mention that training never ends. All members have opportunities throughout the year to do "refresh" training of their chosen area and chances to cross train into a new position. Even the "trainers" have training sessions. There is also, our all-time-favorite; PAPERWORK, that stays with each member from the first day they are given orientation to infinity.

During the last Trainers training, Harry K. explained that after years "on the job", he still enjoys using his former life teaching skills to pass on important knowledge to new recruits. Security Patrol gives him a chance to give back to his community. It is very clear that all trainers had concern for residents at the top of their lists. There was an emphasis on the fact that no one is out there alone. Security Patrol has a great support staff available at all hours! And it works!

The Patrol just completed a well-attended refresher for drivers and dispatchers. A number of our rescue/fire department attended and led a discussion about residents having to call for assistance. This was mentioned in a former article but needs to be emphasized again: NEVER HESITATE to call for help! These great people are always on duty (48 hour shift) and would rather come before the event turns life threatening. If the person does not need to be transported, there is no charge. The rescue unit can evaluate the condition and help folks feel comfortable with the resolution of the incident.

The Patrol listens to our residents and neighbors and tries to meet their needs. There are, however, situations where the members cannot fill every requirement. Patrol will then try to find the proper support for the circumstances. As mentioned before, the main reason residents decide to volunteer for the Security Patrol is to help our neighbors. Continue to raise your hand and give a quick wave to the men and women who on duty 24/7 on the streets of Sun City.

SECURITY PATROL

Who Do You Call?

When to call 9-1-1, 3-1-1 or Security Patrol (702-254-2303).



ONLY CALL 9-1-1 IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.

An emergency is any situation that requires immediate assistance from the police, the fire department or an ambulance. If in doubt as to whether a situation is an emergency, call 9-1-1. It is better to be safe and let the 9-1-1 call taker determine if emergency assistance is needed.

CALL 3-1-1 FOR POLICE NON-EMERGENCY RESPONSE.

such as disturbance calls involving loud parties, loud music complaints, minor disturbances, a break-in or vandalism that occurred "sometime prior" or discovered upon returning home, and the suspects have left the scene. Call 3-1-1 to report any type of crime where there is no immediate threat to life or property.



CALL SUN CITY SUMMERLIN SECURITY PATROL (702-254-2303) if you observe or encounter any of the following within Sun City Summerlin:

- Suspicious vehicles, persons or activities that are not obvious crimes. Be prepared to explain why you think they are suspicious.
- Flashing porch or garage 9-1-1 lights on homes.
- Open garage doors at night-time.
- Lost or found residents, friends, relatives, or pets.
- Issues leading to concern for a neighbor or friend. These can include a person who has not been seen or heard of for a while, who is not answering phone calls, whose mailbox is piling up or who has several days of newspapers or packages in the driveway, or at the front door.
- Malfunctioning streetlights, water leaks, road hazards, and dead animals in the streets.
- Vehicles that are parked on a sidewalk sufficient to impede pedestrians.



If in doubt about anything, call Security Patrol and the dispatcher should be able to direct you to the appropriate person or agency. However, it is important to note that Security Patrol has no authority or responsibility to perform any legal or Association enforcement functions. In particular, Security Patrol cannot:

- Cite any vehicle for moving or parking violations;
- Investigate events such as vehicle accidents, burglaries or vandalism;
- Cite violations of SCSCAI Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (Call Community Standards for these (702) 966-1411);
- Get involved in any disputes;
- Enter private property, such as homes or vehicles, without the owner or neighbor with a key;
- Open locked doors on any private vehicle or jump-start any private vehicle;
- Transport civilians or animals in Patrol cars, unless that person is in distress.



WHEN 'LABOR' WAS 'LABOR'

n Labor Day this year, many of us are retired and have been. Folks of a certain generation (ours) remember things quite differently than the work force of younger people today. Minimum wage ('back in the day') was \$1.00, and no, that's not a typo. Many of our fathers may have worn a uniform of some kind, went to work on a streetcar or company bus, came home dirty to shower, and spent their entire life working in the coal mines, steel mills, on construction sites, on the railroad, or in factories. They only wore a suit for weddings or funerals; they carried lunch pails and a thermos, had steel toed boots and not \$200 sneakers. They were part of a much different generation.

"Careers" for women were often limited to secretaries, nurses, teachers, and if you were Catholic, Nuns. No electric typewriters, no Xerox machines but carbon paper, not even White-out. Shows like 'Father Knows Best' and 'Leave It to Beaver' depicted what housewives were supposed to be, almost making being a 'housewife' seem glamorous. Nurses were made to wear 'caps' as if that made them a better nurse. Teachers kept grades in a notebook, made copies on a horribly smelling mimeograph machine. As for the Nuns - the woolen habits looked like something from The Inquisition. So, at home, in an office, hospital, school, or in a convent, women in the work force were a different breed, but part of the work force, just the same.

"Back in the day" there were no techie jobs; and cell phones? Some of us had a party line! While we all now enjoy the advances of the 21st century, sometimes we need to remember the price paid by those who came before. The labor force, even 50-60 years ago, was drastically different; there was not the option to work from home for ANY reason. The women who held factory jobs during the war were replaced by the men when they came home, and life at home was still 'work'. Wringer washers, hanging clothes on a line, defrosting the fridge, no disposable diapers or micro-waves - yet they (we) survived. The money it took to buy a house then will not even buy a used car today. Three TV stations (four, if you count PBS) and you had to actually get up from the sofa to change the channel – again, we survived, and, hopefully, more appreciative for it.

Labor Day was created to celebrate the worker – recognize them for their efforts under very different circumstances. LABOR is defined as work, especially hard physical work, and that is what so many of our parents did. Technology and modern medicine has made our lives so much easier and better than it was for our parents, and the difference between our parents and their parents is even more staggering. All the generations before us labored in often unimaginable conditions, and perhaps on this Labor Day, we could take a moment to not only remember but give a little prayer of thanks to those who paved the way and laid

the groundwork for the lives we live today.

Many of us had parents who did not even have a car, let alone one that can give you directions and park themselves. But it was a kinder, simpler time, when neighbors helped neighbors; today, you may not even know who your neighbor is. What we had, we shared - without question. I'm not saying my generation did not work hard, we did, and some still do. But there are still opportunities not available and a lingering pay disparity between the genders, the races, the married/single, but as that changes, slowly though it may be, from police to professional

able to work anymore; a 'comfortable retirement was not always that 'comfortable'. We are the lucky ones, and not that we haven't earned it – we've paid our dues, and then some!

When growing up in Pittsburgh, my relatives recounted stories about living through the depression and then the war, stories I did not appreciate until I got much older. Not sure if, or when, the generations that followed ours will ever fully recognize just how much better their lives are. There is still the labor force today that clean hotel rooms, work outside in the Vegas heat, stocking shelves, and are part of the labor force that makes our lives easier and seldom get a











referees, from politics to CEO's, the work force is evolving from where it was when Labor Day first came to be.

While we can't change when we were born, we can remember the way it used to be and be grateful for accomplishments made between then and now. While life was simpler then, it most certainly was harder. If nothing else, the advantages we have today have made retirement easier. Our parents were not talking about stock options, did not have a 401K, and Medicare did not start until the mid-60's. Many retired only when they were not physically

While we enjoy the last big outing of the summer, maybe we could all take a moment to recall 'back in the day' when the labor force was born of the blood, sweat and tears of previous generations. Let us also know the best of our future lies ahead in the science, technology, and creative thinking yet to be. And even though our lives are so much better than how our parents and their parents lived, "we've come a long way, Baby, but we still have a long way to go . . .!"

id you know that there's a day that is considered a national holiday or observance known as Grandparents Day? It's officially celebrated on the first Sunday after Labor Day; this year falling on September 12th. I've been a grandparent for years and who knew? By the way, although it might seem that the correct punctuation should be an apostrophe in Grandparents Day, unlike Mother's Day and Father's Day, there is not.

The origin of this holiday can be traced back to 1956, and a West Virginia mother named Marian McQuade, who while in the process of organizing a community celebration in honor of those over 80, became aware of all the nursing home residents who appeared to be completely forgotten by their families. She decided to try and bring about a holiday that would highlight these individuals and honor all grandparents. In 1973, West Virginia became the first state to have such a day.

McQuade and other supporters raised awareness of the Day to a national level, and by 1978, they succeeded when President Jimmy Carter and the U.S. Senate recognized both the holiday and McQuade as the founder of National Grandparents Day.

McQuade rebuffed the idea making the holiday into an occasion for flowers and cards and not only refused any royalties but also refused all overtures from Hallmark. Thus, this Grandparents Day isn't even listed on the most popular occasions for greeting card sales.

While we Baby Boomers feel we are hipper and a lot cooler than our grandparents were, Gen X, ages 41 and 56, and Gen Y or Millennial, ages between 25 and 40, don't quite see it that way. In fact, many wish that today's grandparents would keep their outdated advice to themselves. What? Why the conflicts? First of all, medical information has changed; where Baby Boomers relied on a couple of books for advice raising their children, Gen X, and Gen Y rely on the internet for the latest information. Technology and the use of it also raises issues and changing demographics come into play as well.

Although Baby Boomers may feel they are younger grandparents, they are not. Due to women electing to start families later in life, the average age of becoming a first-time grandparent has been climbing; by age 65, 96% of the people in the U.S. will be grandparents, according to AARP. With longevity increasing, an estimated 70% of 8-year-old children will have a living great grandparent by 2030.

According to the Good Housekeeping Institute, grandparenting is good for your physical, cognitive, and emotional health, with AARP calling grandkids "the elixir of life." Although

the role of grandparent has changed through generations, nonetheless the bond between grandparent and grandchild remains very special. As one AARP researcher said, "in the end, love triumphs all."



Once I heard about a guy who was driving in the center lane of

a fast-moving expressway. He was keeping pace with the driver in the right lane, but the driver to the left of him was driving at an excessive speed. What Should I Do If I Need A Replacement COVID-19 Proof Of Vaccine Card?

I was recently asked how a person goes about getting a replacement COVID-19 proof of vaccine card.

All vaccination providers must report COVID-19 vaccinations to their state health department's immunization information system.

The CDC does not have individual information about COVID-19 vaccinations.

If you received your vaccine in Nevada, you can obtain a copy of your immunization records from the Nevada WebIZ Public Access Portal.

Visit https://izrecord.nv.gov.

You will be asked the following questions.

First Name
Last Name
Date of Birth
Gender

How you want to receive the code to access your immunization record – the choices are text or email

Your mobile phone number (for a text code) or your email address (for an email code)

You then put in the code, and it takes you directly to the portal where you can print your card and/or download it.

I went through the process to see how it works, and it was quick and easy, and provided me the information needed if I am asked anywhere to provide my card.

Dear Sun City Summerlin Owner and Residents,

At the Tuesday @4pm meeting, an Owner shared with us that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has added to its assistance plan COVID-19 Funeral Assistance. Since many of us were unaware of this, I did some research and thought I would share with you why and what is available.

FEMA acknowledges that the COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief and expense to many families and are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA is providing assistance for COVID-19 related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

If you incurred funeral expenses for an individual whose death was in the United States, including the U.S. territories or the District of Columbia, which may have been caused by, or was likely the result of COVID-19 you may qualify for reimbursement of or assistance with funeral expenses.

At this time, there is no deadline to apply for COVID-19 Funeral Assistance. Your income does not affect your eligibility for this assistance. This is a one-time payment for funeral expenses, and you should apply after you have incurred all eligible expenses.






